Body Found – Otay Mountain

A body has been located in an area where Sheriff's Deputies, the Sheriff's Search and Rescue (SAR) Unit and other partner agencies have been looking for a missing man.

The discovery was made just before noon on Wednesday, April 29th on a rugged trail south of Otay Mountain.

This is the same area where 48-year-old Roberto Jose Manuel Camou went off-roading on a motorcycle on Saturday, April 25th. The last time Camou's family heard from him was around noon when he sent them a photo of him standing next to his motorcycle.

Since then, the Sheriff's Department along with the San Diego Fire Department, U.S. Border Patrol Search, Trauma and Rescue (BORSTAR), California State Parks, California Office of Emergency Services (CAL OES) and other partner agencies have been working day and night trying to find Camou.

The San Diego County Medical Examiner's Office will provide positive identification of the body, as well as determine the cause and manner of death.

We want to thank our partner agencies for their assistance, as well as the public and media for their cooperation.

We are grateful to the 87 volunteers from the Sheriff's Search and Rescue (SAR) Unit and San Diego Mountain Rescue (SDMRT) for their efforts during this operation. SAR performs wilderness and urban rescues, as well as search for missing and at-risk persons. Teams are available 24 hours per day to respond to local, state and federal agency requests.
