

Evidence Based Practices

Evidence-based practice (EBP) is the objective, balanced, and responsible use of current research and the best available data to guide policy and practice decisions

- 8 Evidence-Based Principles for Effective Interventions
 - Assess Risk and Needs
 - Enhance Intrinsic Motivation
 - Target Interventions
 - Skill Training with Directed Practice
 - Increase Positive Reinforcement
 - Engage Ongoing Support
 - Measure Relevant Processes/Practices
 - Provide Measurement Feedback

What is evidence based practices in corrections mean?

Predictors of General Recidivism

- Criminal History
- Antisocial Attitudes/Cognitive-Emotional States
- Antisocial Peers
- Personality Factors
- Family and Martial Factors
- Education and Employment
- Substance Use
- Leisure and Recreation

R-N-R model of Assessment and Treatment

- The most effective programs are based on principles of effective interventions.
 - Risk (Who)
 - Need (What)
 - Responsivity (How)
- Fidelity is <u>how well</u> the program adheres to RNR and relates to reducing recidivism (return to custody).





- Collaborative partnership with Veteran Affairs, Justice Outreach, HHSA, San Diego Superior Court, District Attorney and Public Defenders Office.








Thinking For a Change




