Penal Code 636(a)

• States:

• Every person who, without permission from all parties to the conversation, eavesdrops on or records, by means of electronic device, a conversation, or any portion thereof, between a person who is in the physical custody of a law enforcement officer or other public officer, or who is on the property of a law enforcement agency or other public agency, and that person's attorney, religious adviser, or licensed physician, is guilty of a ______

- Penal Code 636(b)
 - Every person who, intentionally and without permission from all parties to the conversation, non-electronically eavesdrops upon a conversation, or any portion thereof, that occurs between a person who is in the physical custody of a law enforcement officer or other public officer and that person's attorney, religious adviser, or licensed physician, is guilty of a public offense.

- Penal Code 636(b)
 - This subdivision applies to conversations that occur in a place, and under circumstances, where there exists a reasonable expectation of privacy, including a custody holding area, holding area, or anteroom. This subdivision does not apply to conversations that are inadvertently overheard or that take place in a courtroom or other room used for adjudicatory proceedings.

- Penal Code 636(b)
 - Persons convicted of violating this subsection shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison, or in the county jail for a term not to exceed 1 year, or by a fine not to exceed \$2500 OR by both that fine and imprisonment.

- Attorney
- Clergy
- Physician
- Spouses
 - Right that only legally married people have in court

Professional Visits

- Attorney's visiting their client
 - Are subject to search upon entering the facility
 - No cell phones
 - Must have confidential communication with their client

Professional Visits

 Contact visits with inmates are permitted when such visits are necessary to the administration of justice

Professional Visits

- Clearance of the Visitor:
 - Check the reason and authority for entry
 - Verify their identity
 - Photo I.D.
 - Professional identification card

Professional Visits

 Limited to a reasonable length of time based on facility operations and security needs

 Visitation may be temporarily suspended as necessary for the reasonable security of the facility

 Potential consequences of violating statutes concerning privileged communication:

 Privileged communication (i.e. State & Federal Courts, a member of the State Bar Association, holder of public office, CSA or the Facility Commander or Administrator) examined for contraband only in the presence of the inmate

Social Visits Title 15 – Section 1062

- Inmates shall be allowed no fewer than two visits totaling at least one hour per inmate each week
- Inmate Workers will have visits in excess of two, one hour visits weekly
- Social Visits may be suspended or revoked as part of a disciplinary action
 - Rule Violation Report

- Appropriate steps to be taken in admitting visitors:
 - Screen and check visitation slips
 - Check I.D. (NO I.D. @ check in NO VISIT)
 - Search if necessary
 - Determine if person is eligible to visit
 - Issue passes or badges if appropriate
 - Admit them in and release them
 - Maintain a visitor log
 - Familiarize them with rules

- Visitors 16-18 years of age must be accompanied by a qualified adult who possesses a valid photo ID and is cleared for visits
- A qualified adult is defined as a parent, a court appointed guardian or another adult having legal custody

- A warrant / criminal history check may be made on adult visitors
- Visitors that have been incarcerated within the past 90 days shall not be permitted to visit without prior Watch Commander approval
- Visitors who have been previously confined in a state prison are excluded from visiting per 4571 PC
- Visitors on probation are not permitted to visit without prior Watch Commander approval

- Visitors with non-bookable misdemeanor warrants will be denied a visit and told to take care of the warrant
- Visitors with FELONY warrants will be arrested and booked accordingly

Monitoring Phone Calls & Visits

- Social visits / call shall be monitored upon written request from a Peace Officer or a Deputy District Attorney when conversation is not a privilege
- Such requests will be initiated by the investigating agency and must go through the Detentions Investigation Unit for approval

Special Handling

 Inmates facing the death penalty or, for other reason / classification level are housed in a high security cell will be leg and waist chained. Deputies will be required to remain with them during visits

 Depending on the facility, inmates may be handcuffed to opposite sides of the visit area during their visit

Hospital Visits

- Only allowed for inmates who are considered in grave condition and are under guard at the hospital
- Inmate may not receive items of any kind
- 2 visitors allowed
- Legal documents delivered by an approved professional visitor may be handed to the inmate after inspection for weapons or contraband
- All visitor's person or property may be searched or inspected for weapons or contraband
