Course Summary:

The purpose of this course is to familiarize deputies on the procedures and security risks involved in transporting high-risk incarcerated persons.

Course Objectives:

At the conclusion of this course, trainees will be able to:

- Identify the security risks involved in high-risk incarcerated person transports.
- Identify informational resources available to transporting deputies prior to transport (e.g., incarcerated persons background, charges, and behavioral history).
- Identify elements of operational planning for high-risk transports.
- Explain the proper policy and procedures involved when transporting incarcerated persons.
- Demonstrate proficiency in utilizing proper and effective radio communications.
- Identify required equipment, weapons and restraint/control devices needed in high-risk transports.

Instruction should be given on proper procedures and methods related to high-risk incarcerated person transport. Instruction should be given on utilizing informational resources, radio communication procedures, operational and tactical planning, escape procedures, vehicle preparation and inspection procedures, threat recognition and a review of restraint/control devices needed during transport. The entire team should participate when and where practical. The team sergeant must ensure that all participants have signed the STC training roster.
