TRAINING DRILL INSTRUCTIONS

First Responder/Shots Fired

Course Summary:

This course will provide students information to use when responding to an emergency situation in accordance with Department Policy and Procedures and Addendum F. Students will participate in a discussion related to threat recognition, threat assessment, stopping the threat and officer safety. This training will come together in an active training drill on First Responder, Shots Fired scenario.

Course Objectives:

At the conclusion of this training, the trainee will be able to:

- Identify and engage a potential shooting
- Respond to resistance, force options, decision making/moral obligation
- Describe the definition of an active shooter
- Identify the first responder goals and objectives during a rapid deployment while applying critical thinking/communication skills
- Respond utilizing IARD concepts

Training Tips:

- Power Point on Policy and Procedures, Addendum F and threat recognition.
 - Lecture
 - Group Discussion
 - Audio/Video Clip
- First Responder, Shots Fired scenarios/drill and debrief.
 - Group Exercise Trainee Practice Role Play

Instruction should be given on tactics related to use of defensive devices, formations, and staging prior to the drill. The entire team should participate when and where practical.
