Course Summary:

This training exercise will assist nursing and sworn staff in the proper procedures and techniques to safely respond to an emergency situation and effectively administer Naloxone on an overdosed/unresponsive subject.

Course Objectives:

At the conclusion of this course, trainees will be able to:

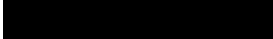
- Identify applicable policy and procedure sections related to the use of Naloxone
- Explain the signs and symptoms of an overdosed individual
- Understand how opioids work
- Recognize an opioid overdose
- Demonstrate department approved procedures for administering Naloxone to an overdosed/unresponsive subject
- Respond to an opioid overdose (getting help, rescue breathing, assembling the Naloxone kit, administering naloxone)
- Explain proper aftercare of a subject (i.e. transporting to a hospital)
- Explain documentation procedures (SO-195 and NetRMS)

Instruction should be given on the related policy and procedure sections, staff safety and security issues, and critical incident management methods. Policy and Procedure shall be discussed regarding the use of Naloxone and documentation procedures. Instruction and demonstration should be given on proper administration of the antidote on an overdosed/unresponsive individual. Coordinating this training with facility medical staff is required for the Naloxone Training Drill. The entire team should participate in this training.
