Segregation and Disciplinary Separation

Topic # 16

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this training is to familiarize staff with the proper procedures on segregation and inmate disciplinary separation.

II. POLICY

This training is conducted in adherence to <u>DSB P&P Section J.3 – Segregation; Definition and</u> <u>Use.</u>

III. DISCUSSION

Staff shall review and discuss the following topics and procedures as described in <u>DSB P&P</u> <u>Section J.3 – Segregation; Definition and Use</u> and related facility specific green sheets.

- A. Definitions and the types of separate housing for inmates, to include administrative segregation, protective custody, acute mental health (Psychiatric Stabilization Unit/Jail Based Competency Treatment), and disciplinary separation.
- B. The types of inmates who may be placed into administrative segregation.
- C. The documentation required for all inmates placed in administrative segregation (Incident Reports and/or Rule Violation Reports, and <u>Segregated Housing Orders (J-72)</u> and the distribution.
- D. Dayroom access for administratively segregated inmates.
- E. The parameters for voluntary and involuntary placement in protective custody housing.



- F. Acute Mental Health housing.
- G. Appropriate use and approval of disciplinary separation, including parameters for inmate access/loss of privileges.
- H. Review bedding and linen assignment (two security blankets) for inmates in an administrative segregation housing unit to include those pending a disciplinary hearing or serving disciplinary separation (cotton/wool blankets and sheets are prohibited).
- I. Monitoring of segregated inmates by sworn staff.
- J. Monitoring of segregated inmates by medical staff.
