



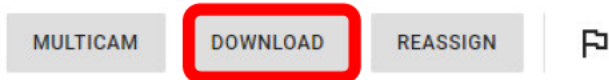

BWC MULTICAM VIEW IN EVIDENCE.COM

The Multicam playback option allows videos recorded by different cameras but in the same location and time to be found and viewed together. When supervisors review BWC footage, the Multicam button may appear above the video being reviewed (see example below). This allows users to find potential additional videos related to an incident that may need to be included in a case, as well as view an incident from different vantage points at the same time.



All BWC footage related to an incident must be downloaded first for the system to recognize it under the Multicam feature. Once Multicam is selected, a selection page will appear. Up to four videos can be viewed at the same time. The supervisor may require additional verification of videos to identify relevant videos.
