SUBJECT: EMERGENCY BACK-UP SYSTEMS

PROCEDURE

In the event of a power failure and/or the loss of water supply, the following plan and equipment will serve as the emergency back-up system.

I. EMERGENCY GENERATORS: POWER PLANT

A. The East Mesa Complex has a central power plant that automatically provides emergency power in the event of a power failure. [REDACTED]

B. The San Diego Gas and Electric Company (SDG&E) is the energy provider for the George Bailey Detention Facility. [REDACTED]

II. EMERGENCY LIGHTING

A. The facility lights will be at half lighting during a power failure. The modules and other areas are equipped with battery powered back-up lighting. Once power is disrupted these lights will turn on. They are powered from a battery and have a 4-8 hour charge. They will supply minimal lighting during a full power failure.

III. EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS

A. During a power failure, the control station base radio will be operational. [REDACTED] Individual handheld radios should be utilized until power is restored.

IV. EMERGENCY WATER SUPPLY

A. The emergency water supply is to be used in cases of extreme emergency in which the water supply to the facility has been eliminated due to natural disaster or other uncontrollable situations. The water supply is located in various locations throughout the facility.

B. Location and distribution of water supply

1. Emergency drinking water for staff and inmates is located [REDACTED]
2. The GBDF Kitchen has a designated location for its emergency water supply located [REDACTED]. There are [REDACTED] Sparkletts [REDACTED] gallon water bottles that can be used by the kitchen for general cleaning.
3. In the event the water supply is interrupted, and plumbing is unavailable, there are supplies for human waste disposal located in [REDACTED]. These supplies include:

4. In the event the emergency water supply is needed, the facility commander will give the authorization to distribute. Unauthorized use and/or tampering with the emergency water supply is strictly prohibited.

C. Usage, quantity, and rotation of emergency drinking water

1. In the event of an emergency, GBDF has a supply of drinking water for inmates and staff. The supply will last for [REDACTED]. At each meal, inmates will be given one bottle (three bottles per day).

3. The GBDF Operations Deputy and Facility Storekeeper will be responsible for the rotation and upkeep of the emergency water supply.
4. The storekeeper is responsible for rotating out 20% (approximately 100 cases) of the emergency water on a yearly basis. The storekeeper will work with the Operations Deputy to determine where the rotated water will be distributed. The Operations Deputy will ensure that replacement water has been ordered and received prior to distributing the old water cases. In October of every year, 100 cases of water will be removed in preparation for the new water. The rotated water will be distributed to staff at the discretion of the Facility Commander. All replacement water will be clearly marked with the date it was placed into the shed.
5. Also, in October, the [REDACTED] water bottles designated for staff will be distributed throughout the facility and replaced with new bottles.
