**PROCEDURE**

**I. SUSPECTED OPIOD OVERDOSE AND NALOXONE**

A. SBDF has eleven (20) naloxone nasal sprays. The kits will be located at the following locations:

1. "SB #1" (2) – Station 1
2. "SB #2" (2) – Station 2
3. "SB #3" (2) – Station 3
4. "SB #4" (2) – Station 4
5. "SB #5" (3) watch commander office
6. (3) Emergency kit between stations 1/3
7. (3) Emergency kit between stations 2/4
8. (3) Emergency kit in watch commander office

B. The respective control deputy shall account for the naloxone kit at the beginning of each shift and make an entry in the Jail Information Management System (JIMS) utilizing the drop down box in the Area Activity Log.

C. The naloxone coordinator for SBDF will be the operations deputy. The naloxone coordinator will conduct an inspection of the naloxone kits during fire inspections each month.

D. Missing or damaged naloxone kits will be reported to the naloxone coordinator. The deputy reporting the missing or damaged naloxone kit must complete a SO-5 form and complete a Lost/Stolen report.

E. All deputies assigned to SBDF have been issued two naloxone kits to be carried on their person while on duty.

**II. AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) MACHINE**

A. There is two (2) AED's available at SBDF; one AED is located by the outer sally port door (employee entrance). The second AED is located inside the medical dispensary.

B. All AEDs will be stored in unlocked cabinets in locations easily accessible during all hours that the building is open. These cabinets will have clear Plexiglas doors with the AED symbol prominent on them. Each cabinet will have an audible alarm that sounds when the door is opened. Also, a sign will be placed above each cabinet identifying the AED location.
