SUSPECTED OPIOID OVERDOSE AND NALOXONE PROCEDURES

- I. In the event an inmate is suffering from a suspected opioid overdose, immediate medical attention is required. At no time shall the inmate be left unattended. Naloxone (Narcan) should be administered to any inmate who presents the signs of opioid overdose or when opioid overdose is suspected.
 - A. Naloxone kits will be kept [REDACTED] and will be accounted for by sworn staff each shift in the Area Activity and Area Check list.

 - B. Naloxone kits will be kept in and monitored by [REDACTED] in the following areas: [REDACTED]

 - C. Deputies shall carry their issued naloxone kits on their person in a department approved holster. The facility watch commander will maintain a reserve supply [REDACTED] [REDACTED] for issuance to individual deputies as needed. The deputy issued the naloxone from the reserve supply will notify the naloxone administrator. The naloxone administrator will be responsible for replenishing and maintaining this supply.
- II. The naloxone (NARCAN) administrator for VDF will be the Administrative Deputy. The naloxone administrator will conduct an inspection of the housing station and reserve supply naloxone kits the first week of each month.
 - A. [REDACTED] missing or damaged naloxone kits will be reported to the naloxone administrator. The deputy that reports the missing or damaged naloxone kits must complete an SO-5 form and complete a lost/stolen report.
 - B. The naloxone administrator is responsible for ordering and replacing the naloxone products from Sheriff's Medical Services.
 - 1. Email the Medical Services Division at [REDACTED] Include the amount of naloxone atomizers that are needed as well as the funding mechanism for VDF [REDACTED].

2. The naloxone administrator must pick up the medication/supplies from [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] The medication/supplies cannot be delivered to the facility.

III. In the event an opioid overdose consists of known Fentanyl or the threat of Fentanyl may exist with an unknown narcotic, additional Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) must be used. Refer to GS M.34.V for available PPE at VDF rated to protect from Fentanyl exposure.
