



## Parole Re-Entry Court

---

The Parolee Re-entry Court Program (RCP) is a collaborative effort by the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR), County of San Diego Health and Human Services Agency (HHS), Alcohol and Drug Services Office of the District Attorney, Office of the Primary Public Defender, Probation Department, Sheriff's Department, San Diego Police Department, the Superior Court of California, and County of San Diego.

The mission of this program is to reduce parolee recidivism and protect public safety by leveraging integrated community resources and services to a target offender population through the implementation of the key components of collaborative justice. The San Diego County Sheriff is part of the law enforcement and courtroom team that is responsible for providing courtroom security (by Court Services Bureau), housing in detention facilities, transportation to and from court, and facilitate assessments when a participant or prospective participant is in custody. The court has identified the bail amount for violators of this program to be \$66,777 which is indicated on court documents and/or warrant abstracts.

### **WARRANTS**

Parole re-entry warrants are booked as a Superior Court warrants which will cause incarcerated individual names to appear on the Notify List report. The Central Felony Support Division will complete an Order to Produce and schedule the defendant for the appropriate department, date, and time. These matters are generally heard on Mondays at 8:30 a.m. in Department 34 (*if Monday is a holiday then they are scheduled for a Tuesday*). Other parameters and cut-offs may also be considered when scheduling a defendant for court. (*See Pre-book Manual – BSCW*).

### **ASSESSMENT SCHEDULING**

Assessments are conducted on Thursdays at the George Bailey Detention Facility as professional visits and may last between 45 minutes to an hour for each incarcerated individual. The District Attorney faxes the Assessment Scheduling list to the San Diego Central Jail for scheduling. Incarcerated individual processing staff schedules these assessments via the JIMS Schedule Events navigator:

- Event Type: RCPA – Reentry Court Program Assessment
- Destination: GBDF (In the event an incarcerated individual is housed at another facility, the RCPA is conducted at the housing facility)

Additionally, the Jail Population Management Unit (JPMU) is notified of all participants, so the "RCP" Hazard is added to the incarcerated individual's classification code.
