EMERGENCY SERVICES DIVISION

- SED - 10 full-time deputies/2 sergeants/1 lieutenant
- SRT - 22 part-time deputies



SED MISSION:

- To provide a team of highly trained, disciplined, and motivated deputies who are equipped and available to respond 7 days a week, 24 hours a day, to critical incidents in the region.

- Barricaded Situations –*C11*
- Suspect Sniper –*C11*
- Hijack Situations –*C11*
- Active Shooters
- High-Risk Apprehension

SED Secondary Missions:

WHAT MAKES IT A CODE-11?

- Suspect Sniper
 - Suspect(s) firing on human targets
- Active Shooter Situation
 - Victims of opportunity in target-rich environment (school, church, etc.)

CODE 11:

- It Will Not Always Be a Clearly Defined Problem
 - Domestic Violence
 - Suicidal Subjects
- Notify Communications Center
- Brief SED Commander via Telephone
- Notify Your Chain of Command (can be via CC)



WHAT WE NEED FROM YOU:

- Identify Incident Commander (IC)
- Command Post (CP)
 - Should be able to accommodate 40+ vehicles & media
- Target Address
- Suspect ID (If Possible)
- Victim/Witness/Family ID & Locations (If Known)
- Containment (If Possible, Otherwise Do Your Best)

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS:

- Crisis Negotiations Team (CNT) Activation
- Safe Route of Approach
- Tactical Staging Area (TSA)
 - Last point of cover/concealment that can accommodate 40 vehicles
- Target Phone Numbers
- ASTREA (evaluate patrol perimeter & coordinate)
- Area Detectives – (warrant)

INCIDENT COMMANDER (IC):

- Individual Who Assumes Overall Responsibility for Incident
 - Can be a Deputy Sheriff, but ideally highest rank on scene (Lieutenant)
- IC Needs to Step Back from the Incident
- IC Provides and Approves the Mission
 - Does not have tactical control of SED
- SED Commander & CNT will Liaison with IC During Entire Incident

WHAT TO EXPECT:

- 1st SED Deputies will Liaison with IC and Establish TSA
- Initial Rapid Deployment Essentials (with approval):
 - Scouts
 - Start Perimeter Containment
 - Sniper Overwatch & Support
 - Take-Down Team Deployment
- SED Assumes Tactical Control of Incident
 - SED Commander Remains with IC & Receives Missions
- Upon Resolution, Assume the Scene from SED

WHAT TO DO WHILE YOU WAIT:

- Set Containment
 - Know where your deputies are!
- Arrest Team
- Develop Intelligence
 - Debrief Everyone
 - Phone Numbers
- Create Timeline
 - CAD
- Traffic Control



APPLY THE PRIORITIES OF LIFE:

1. Hostage(s)
2. Innocent Civilian(s)
3. Law Enforcement
4. Suspect



OTHER TACTICAL SUPPORT:

- Consulting on Critical Incident Management
- Specialized Electronics (RANG-R, Cameras, Etc.)
- Armored Vehicle Support



- Breach Team

- Robots



- SRT



CRISIS NEGOTIATIONS TEAM (CNT):

- Can Be Requested Before SED
- Can Be Requested for Non-Critical Incidents
 - Lone-Barricaded Suicidal Subjects
 - Mobile Suicidal Subjects
 - Non-Compliant Subjects Not Meeting SED Threshold
- Call Early Into an Evolving Incident
- Will Work to Resolve the Incident Before/During SED

INCIDENT COMMANDER TACTICAL CHECKLIST

The Incident Commander of a critical incident is primarily responsible for minimizing injuries, strategically deploying personnel and gathering intelligence. The following guidelines are intended to assist field supervisory personnel in containing the suspect and situation until an arrest can be safely effected.

IMMEDIATE CONSIDERATIONS:

- Assume role of Incident Commander & appoint necessary staff.
- Determine type of crime involved. Identify any injuries to suspects/hostages.
- Confine suspect(s) to present location. Establish inner perimeter positions. Record exact positions.
- Establish outer perimeter. Isolate from vehicular/pedestrian traffic, re-route traffic.
- Establish Incident Command Post. Identify Staging Area, Hostage Negotiators Command Post and site for ASTREA.
- Evacuate, if necessary. Establish evacuation site for affected citizens.
- Request additional personnel for control. (Patrol, Traffic, Detectives, Reserves, DSO's, Explorers, etc.)
- Determine number, type, range of suspect's weapons and areas vulnerable to suspect's field of fire.
- Provide perimeter personnel with continuously updated information and description on suspects/hostages.
- Select operational frequency, advise Communications Center and responding personnel.
- Appoint scribe. Maintain operational log for future reference.
- Do not exceed 5:1 span of control. Appoint acting sergeants as necessary.

NOTIFICATIONS:	TIME	BY WHOM
1. Alert or request S.E.D. and/or Hostage Negotiators.		
2. Notify Station Commander.		
3. Request Public Affairs.		
4. Request Mobile Command One.		
5. Request paramedics & fire department to stand by.		
6. Request ASTREA. Make note of available flight time.		
7. Notify air ambulance, standby purposes.		
8. Notify Emergency Response Assistance Team, if necessary.

INCIDENT COMMANDER TACTICAL CHECKLIST

INCIDENT COMMAND POST/SECONDARY CONSIDERATIONS:

- Insure all support personnel report to Incident Command Post before deploying.
- Adequately brief all personnel with situation and their specific responsibilities.
- Insure assigned personnel have communications capability with Incident Command Post.
- Maintain roster of all personnel assigned to operation.
- Establish plan for relieving personnel during lengthy operation.

TACTICAL CONSIDERATIONS:

- Determine location of suspect within structure.
- Determine access routes & inform affected units.
- Determine identity of suspect and any hostages.
- Compile data on suspects/hostages. to include photos, prior criminal history, etc.
- After adequate containment is established, and if practical, establish communications with suspect.
- Obtain floor plans, photographs, phone number of suspect's location, etc.
- Detain individuals with pertinent information for debriefing by patrol, SED and H.N.T

POST OPERATION CONSIDERATIONS:

- Obtain Mission Reports from S.E.D. and other support units utilized.
- Account for all equipment, ensure equipment is serviced and returned.
- Preserve scene.
- Account for all personnel.
- Supervise clean up of areas used by personnel during the operation.
- Provide follow up service to area residents relating to damaged property.
- Identify personnel who assisted, ensure appropriate letters of appreciation are prepared.
- Release premises to owner or responsible party.
- Critique as soon as possible.

NOTES:
