Racial Profiling and Identification Act Guidance on 5150
and other Community Caretaking Scenarios

It's been confirmed by DOJ that there is currently no way to appropriately record "Community Caretaking" stops with the existing regulation. Until the regulation can be updated, we have received the following guidance from DOJ.

- Only Community Caretaking stops resulting in a search or detention are reportable
- Reason for Stop:
 - Reasonable Suspicion That Person Was Engaged in Criminal Activity
 - Offense Code: Community caretaking (assigned to CJIS Code 99990)Basis: Other reasonable suspicion of a crime
 - Add "Community Caretaking Activity" to the Brief Explanation field
