POLICY 30. COMMUNITY ORIENTED POLICING & PROBLEM SOLVING (COPPS)

- A. Program overview
 - 1. COPPS is not a short-term program, but a community-based law enforcement approach that recognizes that community involvement is critical to the Department's mission of successfully addressing crime, social disorder, and other quality of life issues.
 - 2. COPPS involves the identification of various resources and the development of partnerships within the community, and/or with other agencies, groups and individuals. It uses a systematic approach to solving problems (the SARA model: Scanning, Analysis, Response, and Assessment), which can be used to deal with issues that affects the Department.
- B. Strategies
 - The following COPPS strategies are being utilized by the Department with tangible, successful results. These strategies are to be utilized in a varying mix that is suitable to the demographics and trends of the community being served. Station/Division commanders are encouraged to be innovative in their efforts to develop effective and productive partnerships with their communities, or the agencies/groups with which they collaborate to improve the quality of life for residents.

 - d. Volunteer Patrol Program
