Synopsis:

On 101910 (b)(5)(B) reported that her husband, Michael Foster, had pointed a gun at her head and discharged the gun, narrowly missing her head. Michael fired the gun several times during a five hour ordeal at their residence. During this time, Michael put the gun to the back of (b)(5)(B) head and ordered her to her knees. He then used the barrel of the gun against the back of her head to push her all the way on to the floor, to a prone position.

Origin:

On 101910, at 0823 hours, I received a radio call, (CAD#8708726), to investigate a 245PC at (D)(5)(B) Japatul Rd, in Alpine. The victim, (b)(5)(B) stated her husband, Michael Foster, had been pointing a gun at her head for hours and had fired the gun, missing her head. (b)(5)(B) said she had fled the house and would meet us up at the road. (b)(5)(B) said Michael suffered from post traumatic stress disorder from combat while serving in the Army.

Investigation:

Deputy Fuhr and I arrived at 0836 hours. Deputy McFarland was already on scene. I spoke with the and she told me the following: victim, (b)(5)(B)

(b)(5)(B)

(b)(5)(B) said she was sleeping in bed when Michael came in the room and woke her up around 0300 hours. (b)(5)(B) said Michael was "Ranting and raving" about making a bomb. (b)(5)(B) said this was not the first time Michael had acted this way. (b)(5)(B) said she was upset with Michael for waking her up so she left the room and lay down on the couch in the living room. (b)(5)(B) said within a minute Michael exited the bedroom and had a handgun in his hand. (b)(5)(B) described the gun as large, black, with wood grips. (b)(5)(B) said she thought it might be a revolver. (b)(5)(B) said again this was not the first time Michael had done this so she attempted to ignore him and walked into the bathroom.

(b)(5)(B) said Michael began pounding on the door and demanding she come out. (b)(5)(B) said when she opened the door, Michael was standing there with the gun pointed at her head. I asked (b)(5)(B) how far away was Michael from her. (b)(5)(B) stepped back from me and raised her hand to simulate Michael pointing the gun. (b)(5)(B) was approximately three to four feet away from me. (b)(5)(B) said Michael said, "Who's side are you on" as he continued to point the gun at her head. Michael then moved the gun slightly to one side and fired one round, narrowly missing her head.

(b)(5)(B) said Michael then walked outside and fired several more rounds. (b)(5)(B) said one round went through the sliding glass door of the main house next door and another through their glass patio table. (b)(5)(B) said Michael fired two or three more rounds into the canyon. (b)(5)(B) said Michael was "Rambling" about the CIA and extraction teams.

(b)(5)(B) said Michael came back inside the house and asked her to help him find more bullets. (b)(5)(B) said she told Michael there was no way she was going to help him find more bullets. (b)(5)(B) said Michael put the gun to the back of her head and said, "Get on your knees". (b)(5)(B) said she complied and got on her knees. (b)(5)(B) said Michael held the gun to the back of her head and used it to push her all the way to the floor. (b)(5)(B) said she was lying on the floor, on her stomach. (b)(5)(B) said Michael was on top of her, holding her down, as he pulled things out of the closet, looking for more bullets. (b)(5)(B) said Michael would move the gun away and then put it back against the back of her head as he continued to search the closet. While (b)(5)(B) was telling me this she kept saying, "I shouldn't be telling you this. I don't want him to get in trouble".

(b)(5)(B) said Michael finally let her up. (b)(5)(B) said Michael had found an ammunition belt in the closet. (b)(5)(B) said she did not know how many rounds were in the belt. (b)(5)(B) said Michael lay on the floor of the bedroom, on his back, in the middle of all of the items he had pulled out of the closet. (b)(5)(B) said Michael put a towel over his head and was holding the gun under his chin. (b)(5)(B) said Michael said, "Go, get out, save yourself". (b)(5)(B) said she exited the residence and went to the neighbors house to call 911.

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(b)(5)(B) said she had removed the guns from the house several months ago. (b)(5)(B) said she was afraid what Michael might do because he was suffering from post traumatic stress disorder. (b)(5)(B) said an old friend had "bequeathed" a pistol and rifle to Michael. (b)(5)(B) said she gave the guns to a friend to hold. I asked (b)(5)(B) if she had seen the rifle today or if she knew if Michael had it or not. (b)(5)(B) said she hadn't seen the rifle, but she hadn't seen the pistol until this morning. I asked (b)(5)(B) to call the friend and ask about the guns. (b)(5)(B) made a call and advised me the friend had given Michael the pistol a couple months ago but not the rifle.

I asked (b)(5)(B) if Michael had been getting treatment for his PTSD. (b)(5)(B) said not recently but he had been seen in the past by a doctor in San Bernadino named (b)(5)(B) said Michael was currently taking Adavan, Trazadon and Paxal. (b)(5)(B) said she thought Michael had been taking his medications.

(b)(5)(B) said Michael had talked about suicide in the past and had talked about suicide by cop. (b)(5)(B) said she was afraid Michael was going to come out of the house with the gun and make us shoot him.

Investigation Cont'd:

Deputy Fuhr and Deputy McFarland approached the residence and set up a perimeter. I requested a PERT unit telephone me to get some more information on Michael's condition and treatment. I was told a SDPD PERT unit was going to call but I never received the call.

At 0903 hours Sgt. Browning responded to the scene. I briefed him on the situation. At 0919 hours Sgt. Browning and I approached the front of the residence and made several announcements for Michael to exit the residence. We did not get any response. I held the perimeter position at the front of the residence and Sgt. Browning returned to the road. At 0958 hours I heard the radio transmission advising the incident had turned into a code 11 - SED Swat call out.

At approximately 1245 hours I was relieved from my perimeter position by SED personnel. I returned to the command post.

At approximately 1400 hours Det Bolter and I were instructed to return to the scene and secure it. Det Bolter and I took up a position in the driveway, approximately 100 feet east of the residence. At 1700 hours homicide Sgt. D. Martinez released me from the scene.

On October 19, 2010, at about 0823 hours, the San Diego Sheriff's Communication Center received a 9-1-1 call from a woman identified as (b)(5)(B) regarding her husband holding a gun to her head. Deputy McFarland (2066), responded and arrived on scene at about 0836 hours. Upon his arrival, he at the top of her driveway. (b)(5)(B) told Deputy McFarland that her husband, contacted (b)(5)(B) Michael Foster, had pointed a revolver against her head, and than fired several shots randomly throughout the guest house that they reside in at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road (b)(5)(B) in Alpine. One of the rounds Michael fired went right by (b)(5)(B) head, and another went through the sliding glass door of the main residence and into the main residence. This was confirmed by the shattered sliding glass door seen by deputies who arrived on scene. Detective Fran Passalacqua (2204) arrived on scene and continued to interview (b)(5)(B) told Detective Passalacqua that Michael woke her up at about 0300 hours this morning, grabbed her by the hair, asked her for ID, and asked what her mission was. After Michael fired all of the rounds in the revolver, he asked (b)(5)(B) to help him find more ammunition, which she refused to do. Michael held (b)(5)(B) captive and would not let her leave their home. At about 0810 hours, Michael was on his bed when he placed the barrel of the gun to his chin and put a towel over his head. Michael told (b)(5)(B) to get out of the house. Before (b)(5)(B) left the house to seek

help, Michael made a comment to her about getting into a shoot out with the police. (b)(5)(B) told Detective Passalacqua that Michael had been drinking beer this morning and was suffering from post traumatic stress disorder. (b)(5)(B) also said Michael was taking three different types of psychiatric medications.

Sheriff's personnel on scene unsuccessfully attempted to communicate with Michael by yelling and utilizing a PA system. At about 1008 hours, this incident was deemed a Special Enforcement Detail (S.E.D.) call out. At about 1231 hours, Sheriff's Deputies from the S.E.D. unit surrounded the house. At about 1240 hours, an armored vehicle containing Sheriff's Department S.E.D. and Hostage Negotiation Team personnel approached the residence and unsuccessfully attempted to communicate with Michael.

At about 1321 hours, Michael exited the front of the guest house, threw shell casings onto the ground, and went back into the house. At about 1323 hours, Michael exited the rear of the guest house with a revolver in his hand. When Michael pointed the revolver at deputies, three S.E.D. deputies shot at him. Michael was taken into custody at about 1331 hours, and then transported by paramedics to Sharp Memorial hospital where he remains hospitalized.



- 14 | A Thirty-five for another week-and-a-half.
- 15 | Q And how tall are you?
- 16 | A Five-ten.
- 17 | Q How much do you weigh?
- 18 | A One-seventy-five.
- 19 || Q* Uh-huh.
- 20 | A* Yeah.
- 21 || Q I can; could never get down again in my life (LAUGHING)
- Q^* (LAUGHING).
- 23 | Q Do you wear eye glasses or contacts?
- 24 | A No.
- 25 | Q Do you have any hearing loss?
- 26 || A Uh, no
- 27 | Q Right-handed or left-handed?
- 28 A Right-handed. But I shoot a long gun left-handed.

1	Q*	I was gonna ask that.
2	A	(UNIN).
3	Q	I do the same thing. I bet you you shoot better than me though. (GIGGLING). What was
4		your unit designator today?
5	A	Ten-Edward-eleven.
6	Q	What area does that cover? That's an S-E-D
7	A	Yeah, that's an
8	Q	nomenclature?
9	A	S-E-D number.
10	Q	Covers the entire county when you're in an S-E-D status?
11	A	Yes.
12	Q	Okay. Um, when you came to work today, did you respond to Boulevard at six-thirty?
13	A	Yes. I was Eighty-four-R-nine.
14	Q	Okay, so you went from Eighty-four-R-nine early and then about what time did you change
15		over to Ten-Edward-eleven because of the call-out?
16	A	When we got the page, it was somewhere around ten, ten-fifteen somewhere around there I
17		believe.
18	Q	And when you responded to the call-out, where; do you remember where you responded to
19		and what you were driving?
20	A	What? Where I responded? I responded to the T-S-A in my S-E-D issued silver
21		Expedition. The T-S-A tactical staging area at; I don't know the address but it was on
22		Japatul Valley Road.
23	Q	Okay.
24	A	Just south or west of the scene of code-eleven.
25	Q	And, uh, we've gone through; you're the third one to go through this so this makes it easier
26		for us. Describe just; they; step outta yourself and take a look at the way you were dressed
27		and what you were carrying. Just start head to foot and talk about your uniform from even
28		hats and face paint, shirts, pants, boots, etcetera, etcetera and then go through your, um, all

your weapons; everything that you got on your person.

- A Okay. At the time of the shooting?
- Q Yeah.

- Q* Um-hmm.
- A Okay. Um, I had a digital camouflage Woodland booney hat. Um, then I had a, a Woodland-type camouflage balaclava. I had green face paint base with some other black, brown different colored green on top of that on the face paint covering what was exposed outside the balaclava. Uh, for a shirt I had my regular patrol vest on underneath then I had my S-E-D B-D-U. It's an olive jack green B-D-U with, uh, Sheriff's patches on the arms and Sheriff patch I think over the left breast. Over that I had an H harness which is basically a gun belt.
- Q* Load-bearing.
- A Yeah, it's a load-bearing harness attached to a gun belt. Uh, I had two on my; the chest strap of the load-bearing harness. I had two forty-caliber magazines on the belt. I had a radio, a couple sleeves of, uh, specialty three-o-eight ammo in case you need to punch through like thick glass or something. Uh, my duty; my S-E-D issued forty-caliber Glock, radio. I think that's all I had on the load-bearing belt. Um, I had green O-D, B-D-U pants on.
- Q* O-D?
- A O-D green.
 - Q* Okay.

Α

Uh, B-D-U pants on, uh, black socks, black boots. Over that I had Woodland cammo gortex pants and then I had a Woodland camouflage gortex jacket over the whole thing. And then I was laying on a; like a close-cell olive green mat with my sniper rifle which is; it's a three-o-eight rifle. It's a; has a Remington seven-hundred bolt. The rest of the rifle is entirely customized by the Department. So it's not really recognizable as a Remington seven-hundred but it's a, it's a bolt-action rifle with a scope painted a; like a, like a green forest-color camouflage pattern. Uh, and then I was laying on the mat and over that I had a;

1		like a gilly suit kind of a mesh tarp kinda thing over for camouflage purposes.
2	Q	And that's the same thing and when we photographed you that you had placed around
3		your
4	A	Yes.
5	Q	person?
6	A	Yes, the same
7	Q	Well
8	A	thing.
9	Q	in your photo, that's, that's depicted.
10	A	Um-hmm.
11	Q	(CLEARS THROAT) Okay and is that everything?
12	A	I had a black t-shirt on underneath and that's; yeah, that's it.
13	Q	Have you received training on the gear and weapons at all; and I'm talking now inclusive of
14		everything you had today?
15	A	Yes.
16	Q	And when was the last time that you qualified and I'm gonna; broke this down. I'm gonna
17		break this into leth-, lethal and less-lethal. Your lethal weapons; you said you had a Glock?
18	A	I had it on me; my person. Yes.
19	Q	On your person?
20	A	Um-hmm.
21	Q	So your lethal is your Glock and your three-o-eight or Remington seven-hundred
22	A	Yes.
23	Q	is that what you call it?
24	A	Um-hmm.
25	Q	Um, any other lethal weapons?
26	A	No.
27	Q	When's the last time you qualified with both of those?
28	A	The Remington seven-hundred I; training; we had a training day; I think it'll be two weeks

1		this Friday and I qualified then. So two weeks ago this Friday we had a training day I
2		believe.
3	Q	Okay. What about with your duty, uh, patrol
4	A	This
5	Q	pistol?
6	A	Glock, uh, we do our S-E-D quals quarterly and we just did them (SIGH) within the past
7		month, month-and-a-half I believe but I'd have to look at the training schedule to tell you
8		exactly when I qualified with it.
9	Q*	Were you also issued the M-four?
10	A	Yes, I have; it, it was; I just didn't; it was in my car.
11	Q*	Okay. Um
12	Q	That's a good question.
13	Q*	and when you, when you arrived, they designated you as sniper or is sniper your primary
14		function on these types of S-E-D, uh?
15	A	Sniper is my primary function. I could do either sniper or be a perimeter just like, uh, Gavin
16		or Bill.
17	Q*	Okay.
18	A	But for this, I was; usually, I'd be a sniper 'cause we don't have a lot of us.
19	Q*	Okay.
20	A	And generally I would have a M-four with me as a primary weapon while I'm getting into
21		position but because I drove up to my position and got outta my car, it was in the back seat
22		of the car the whole time.
23	Q*	Okay.
24	Q	Okay, now less lethal weapons. What did you have; did you have any?
25	A	No.
26	Q	I didn't think you discussed any.
27	A	No, I had none.
28	Q	So on this Remington seven-hundred, there is no fixture for a forty-millimeter launcher or

1		anything?
2	A	No.
3	(BRIE	F EXCHANGE OF WORDS BETWEEN Q AND Q*)
4	A	It's primarily a long-distance rifle and that's all it's used for.
5	(BRIE	F EXCHANGE OF WORDS BETWEEN Q AND Q*)
6	Q	Uh, was the gear; all your gear and all your weapons operational at the beginning of your
7		shift?
8	A	Yes.
9	Q	At the beginning of your shift, do you do a safety check, an operational check with your
10		weapons? Obviously you can't fire 'em but do you know what I mean?
11	A	Um-hmm.
12	Q	Take, look at 'em, make sure they're
13	A	Yeah, before you deploy on a S-E-D mission, you obviously gonna check and make sure the
14		bolt works properly and you can see through the scope. All that kinda good stuff.
15	Q	And, go ahead.
16	Q*	And your bolted rifle is one round? It's not; you don't carry a; it's not; you; magazine-fed?
17		It's
18	A	There's an internal magazine that holds four total rounds.
19	Q*	Okay.
20	A	So, but you load those in through; you open the bolt. You load those in through
21	Q*	Yes.
22	A	the
23	Q*	Okay
24	A	chamber down in
25	Q*	Gotcha.
26	A	and then you close the bolt on a round.
27	Q*	Okay.
28	A	So but there are four total rounds in the gun which I gave to the (UNIN).

1	Q*	Okay.
2	Q	And just for the record, when we took your photograph, all the clothing you displayed was
3		the clothing that you were wearing at the time of the incident?
4	A	Yes.
5	Q	And you already described this. When you turned over your, um, Remington seven-
6		hundred, is that what you call it or do you call it the three-o-eight?
7	A	Either or.
8	Q	Either?
9	A	It's both.
10	Q	Well, who took it from you? What condition was it in? Who directed it? And who took it
11		from you?
12	A	Uh, John DEBUS, the sniper; the Sniper Team leader because they were bringing me here
13		took control of the rifle. Um, it was unloaded. I unloaded it when the entry team started
14		going to contact the suspect 'cause there's no reason for me to have rounds in it and it was
15		pointed in their direction so. Uh, he took it. It was unloaded and in the exact condition as
16		when I shot it except no rounds in it.
17	Q	How many; uh, this is a little premature but just so I can get this straight, the, the internal
18		magazine holds four rounds.
19	A	Yes.
20	Q	And then you got one in the chamber so a total of five?
21	A	You can but I only did four.
22	Q	So you have four?
23	A	Um-hmm.
24	Q	And you fired one?
25	A	I fired one.
26	Q	So there was three that you unloaded?
27	A	Right.
28	Q	Is; that's why we got that call and (b)(5)(B) collected the other three rounds from you?

1	A	I gave him ex-; un; the expended cartridge as well.
2	Q	And you had the expended cartridge?
3	A	Yes.
4	Q	So, three unexpended rounds and an expended cartridge
5	A	Correct.
6	Q	that you had in your possession here in the building that you carried with you?
7	A	Correct.
8	Q	So 'cause this is gonna
9	A*	That accounts for it.
10	A	Yeah.
11	Q	So the weapon went from where you; where you were at when you shot it
12	A	Um-hmm.
13	Q	you carried that down to the tactical staging area.
14	A	Um-hmm.
15	Q	You handed the weapon over to, uh, DEBUS.
16	A	It was in my car. I gave him my car keys.
17	Q	Okay.
18	A*	And you (UNIN)
19	Q	And then he got it?
20	A	Yeah.
21	Q*	He collected the weapon but you maintained the, the actual, um, rounds?
22	A	I put the rounds; actually I left 'em in my car in the little map door pocket on the side
23	Q*	Yeah
24	A	of the driver's door.
25	Q*	Um-hmm.
26	A	And that's where they were when I walked away from the car and that's where they were
27		when I
28	Q*	When you drove?

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1	A	Well, I didn't drive the car here. Somebody else drove it here.
2	Q*	Okay.
3	A	But when I took the F-E-T guy out, that's where they were.
4	Q*	That's where they were.
5	Q	It's right where you had put 'em?
6	A	Right where I had put 'em.
7	Q	Three unexpended rounds
8	A	And one
9	Q*	And one
10	A	expended round.
11	Q	Casing.
12	A	Correct.
13	Q	Or cartridge whatever. Your nomenclature is.
14	Q*	And is that; is the, uh, the three-o-eight round, is that a; was it a special three-o-eight round,
15		uh, or is it something that the Department or your Department; your, uh, S-E-D unit; is that
16		a normal three-o-eight round that they issued to people that are qualified as a, as snipers?
17	A	Yes it is.
18	Q	Does every weapon you had on your person issued to you by the Sheriff's Department as a
19		duty-weapon?
20	A	Yes.
21	Q	And the weapon that you used is the issued three-o-eight that you used during the shooting
22		incident?
23	A	Yes.
24	Q	All the ammo that you had on your person, was it issued by the Department?
25	A	Yes.
26	Q	And you had no outside influences of magazines or ammunition that are personally used?
27	A	No. None.
28	Q*	(UNIN) doesn't (UNIN).

- And you described how your weapon was loaded. I already got that. Is that always how you load and carry your weapon; your three-o-eight before and, uh?
- A Yes.

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- Q And we talked about where you weapon land and where your rounds went. Okay. Easy part. Your turn to tell me the story. Start with the beginning of your shift and take me through the day. You know, whatever that; whatever time. Six-thirty in the morning I go to Boulevard. Boom.
- A I...
- Q Nice day in Boulevard?
 - Yeah. A little rainy. Yeah, I woke up, got ready. Six-thirty logged-on. Uh, shortly after that left my residence. Drove down to the Campo pumps. Got some gas. Then I drove to the Pine Valley Office. Um, I had to talk to the clerk there for a minute or two. From there I left. I drove out to Boulevard. I cruised down a little bit. Went to the office. It was, uh, it was raining and miserable so I was just gonna log-on and or write a report I needed to write. Uh, Sean AKIN, a guy from S-E-D sent me a text message. Uh, um, like early on asking me if I was involved in the, the two-forty-five out here. Well, I think he actually meant out in rural. And I had just heard on the radio that Ten-Edward-eighty or something enroute to Santee. So I assumed that's what he was talking about so I told him "No, I think that's Alpine." So I went out and got my S-E-D radio and switched it to the Santee dispatch hoping I could listen in and find out what was going on. They didn't say a whole lot on the radio. Um, I think at nine-thirty I think they cleared E-T and I checked CAD and there really wasn't a lot of information as to what was going on after nine-thirty. Uh, so I just kinda hung-out. I was working on a report waiting to see what was gonna happen. Then I heard on the radio, uh, I think Sergeant BROWNING said, uh, you know, we're requesting a code eleven. Uh, thirty seconds later, I; my pager went off so send some text messages out to the some of the guys and make sure they got the page. I left Boulevard in my black and white. Drove to Lake Morena where S-E-D vehicle was. I switched out some gear out, uh, from the black and white to the Expedition. Left there, drove down to Eight. Um, went to

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the T-S-A, checked in. Uh, they told me to get out as a sniper. To gear-up as a sniper. So I did. Um, went down to where they, they had the T-S-A actually set-up 'cause we were parked a little ways away. Some of the other guys, some of the other guys had made it there sooner so they already got paired-up as snipers and I was just kinda hanging out at the T-S-A waiting for a partner or an assignment. So I was hanging out in the armored car for what felt like hours but it was probably fifteen, twenty, thirty minutes somewhere around there. And I called on the radio by DEBUS, John DEBUS, told me to go meet him on the road; on Japatul Valley Road and he would direct me to a spot where I would be working alone as a sniper. So I carried all my gear out to my car. I got in and drove up and met DEBUS. He showed me the house. Um, the road is significantly higher than the house. Um, he told me just to set-up somewhere on the road; off the road and parked so no one ran me over. So I did that. I got all set-up. Set-up my sniper rifle, got eyes on, side three; the back side and most of side four of the little granny flat where he was at.

- Q* Up side three of the granny flat and not three of, of the residence; the main residence?
- A Uh, it's the same thing.
- 16 Q^* All right.
- 17 A They're; 'cause they're all; they're right next to each other so side three is the same.
- 18 Q^* The same? Okay.
 - A But I can; I mean the granny flat is where we thought he was at that point so that was my primary focus. I, I was also watching the house at that...
 - Q* Okay.
 - A point 'cause we weren't a hundred-percent sure where he was 'cause I don't think anyone had seen him for several hours.
 - $||Q^*|$ Okay.
 - A Um, so I was watching side three and then what I could see inside four. Uh-huh. Sometime after that; I don't know; ten minutes maybe, the, uh, armored car drove by me and went down to the front of the building; side one. And the Santee started to do their calls on the, the P-A and I could him 'em telling him what? You know "Come on out. We need to talk

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to you." All that sort of nice stuff. Very soon after they started talking to him, the snipers on the front side saw; they said the suspect, um, in the, the front. I guess there's a sliding glass door on the front. They saw him in the sliding glass door moving the, the, the blinds back and forth and they could see him and he was shouting something but no one could really say what he was shouting.

Q* Could you actually hear that; the...

A Oh...

Q* shouting?

A No, I couldn't hear a thing.

Q* Okay.

I mean, I was;; when I was setting up, I used my range finder and ranged the distance so I could change the, uh, the settings on my scope and it was about a hundred-and-sixty yards give or take. I think my range finder was jumping around from one-fifty-six to one-fiftynine or fifty-eight; somewhere in there so. It was called at one-sixty; called it good so I couldn't hear anyone except I could hear the P-A. So they're talking to him and he's back and forth to the window. Uh, at some point snipers from side one, uh, John WEST and Mike FORBES saw him put something up against the front of the, uh, of the sliding glass door; possibly some kind of a barricade to block it off. They couldn't tell what it was. Uh, and then more shouting out the glass window. It was put out that he shouted something about give me my phone back or something. Uh, and then at some point he actually opened the sliding glass door a few inches and threw something unknown out. Um, nobody could tell what it was. We had gotten some information that; during the briefing before we deployed that he, uh, he was armed with a three-fifty-seven handgun. He had pointed it at, at his wife and actually shot a couple of rounds either at or very near her head. It didn't injure her though. Um, and that he; on previous residences he liked to booby-trap his residences usually with like lights or whistles or noise makers or stuff like that. But there was also something put out about he might possibly be trying to make a bomb or an explosive device. So that was kinda concerning. He was throwing stuff out the, the sliding glass door

that we didn't know.

Q* And, and the information that you just discussed right now was information that you received during the briefing?

A Yes. B-; yeah I skipped that part.

Q* You did.

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A Before I got deployed...

Q All three of you did

Q* (LAUGHING)

Q (LAUGHING).

A Yeah, well. (LAUGHING).

A* They didn't with me. (LAUGHING).

Before we got deployed it's very important that you get a briefing so you know what you're dealing with so they showed up a picture of; his physical description. He's five-nine, twoten, two-twenty although he looked quite a bit heavier than that. Big bushy beard, black; or dark brown hair. Um, showed us a picture of him. Showed us a; I think like a Google Earth picture of the, the, the complex basically. Um, told us that he'd been arrested recently within the past couple days or week at a b-; a local bar and he fought the deputies there. So, he seems to like to fight with deputies. Um, and something was said at the briefing about he wants to; he's gonna fight it out with the police and have a shoot-out. We weren't gonna take him. So all that's going through my head as he's throwing stuff out the, the window. You know don't know what it is. They couldn't tell what it was. Um, he, he shut the window. Uh, the entry team and Santee they were preparing and Bomb Arson were preparing to deploy a throw phone which is just; it's a phone that Santee uses so that they can get some two-way communication with him using the robot so the bearcat was maneuvering in front of the house, um, trying to get in a position where they could dump off the robot and the phone so that they could move the robot on up. I think they'd actually dumped the robot off and they were starting to maneuver it when I was watching the side three and side four of the granny flat 'cause that's; we knew he was there for sure now. I

thought I saw some movement in the one window on side three so I zoomed in just a little bit with the scope to get a better look and, of course, as soon as I did that I think it was KERR who put out on the radio "He's coming out on side three." So I was like "Oh" so I quickly zoomed back out. I saw him walking out on the back patio. No shirt, shorts and, you know, hair and beard just like (PAUSE) the picture. Uh, and then I saw (PAUSE) him; I think it was a right hand but I, I, I'm not a-hundred-percent sure. I saw him pointing a gun. It was obviously a big looking Dirty Harry type revolver gun.

- Q What color? If you remember.
- A It; I; gray or silver I would say but it was kinda hard. Um, pointed in the direction that DEBUS had told me "Heh, we've got some perimeter guys over here by that area. There's some guys over there." He pointed it in the direction of where those guys were. I didn't know exactly where they were 'cause they were doing a good job of hiding in the bushes.
- Q* And given your knowledge of the tactical, you know, uh, uh, uh, nomenclature of the building...
- A Um-hmm.
- Q^* one, two, three, four, five or whatever...
- $7 \parallel A = Um-hmm$.
 - Q* would, uh, he explained to you that there were people at the two, three corner; three, four corners, is that the way he put it or?
 - A Uh-hmm. Well we were up above so he actually pointed and said "Heh, over in that area. See those"...
 - $||Q^*|$ Okay.
 - A 'Cause see where those bushes over there, they're in that area somewhere. There's some guy. And, and he; I'm sure he did say "Two, three corner over there." You know, three or four...
- 26 || Q* Okay.

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- 27 | A corner but he pointed and showed a general location of where they were.
 - Q* Where they were.

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A So I, I, I mean, I, I couldn't see him 'cause they were doing a good job of hiding in the bush but I knew they were in that general location.

Q* Okay.

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Uh, he pointed the gun in that general location. Uh, I assumed that he was pointed at the gun at my partners 'cause they were the only ones out there and maybe he saw them. About that same time I heard one shot and then I shot and then I thought I heard one more shot and that's all I heard but um, I shot. He went down. Um, he was lying on the cement patio just, if I'm looking at the house just to the right of the, the chair. There's some chairs and a table out on the patio, on his back. Uh, didn't see the gun anywhere. I didn't see where it went. Um, he was obviously a live 'cause his head was moving and he was moving his hands. I didn't see anything in his hands. Uh, several people put out that shots were fired. Um, then one of the guys either KERR or GAVIN, I 'm not sure who put out they didn't have obs where; they couldn't see the suspect anymore. So I put out I had obs at least on his upper half. The; his lower half was kind of behind the chairs and table so I couldn't really see it that good. Then they were talking about sending in a robot out to, to look at him. To, to see if; keep an eye on him. Then I; someone at the T-S-A or somewhere decided that since I had a good visual on him I could tell them "His hands are empty. He's still on his back" while the entry team, uh, advanced on him. So that's what I did. I kept obs on him. Um, and somewhere in there I thought "Oh, I need to reload in case I need a follow-up shot" but apparently I had already done that 'cause when I did that, uh, a live round came out of the chamber. I was like "Oh, okay, well, so." I reloaded anyway and put in a fresh round in the chamber and just kept eyes on him. I had KERR 'cause KERR could talk to him. He was close enough. Well, I; KERR's the one that was talking on the radio. I don't know who was talking to him. Just told him "Keep your hands above your head" 'cause when he put his hands down around his waist, I would lose sight of him so he, he did. He pretty much kept his hands up around his head and his head was moving side-to-side but nothing else on his body was moving and I just watched him and reported every few seconds "His hands are still out. His hands are still empty." The entry team came around

Well, I obviously wasn't in any danger. Um, but I guess I; DEBUS had told me that some of

16	Q*	Somewhat bladed?
17	A	Yes, some; just a little bit bladed. I mean, I could see his, his belly but I could also see his
18		side right here so
19	Q	Is
20	A	I targeted the center mass area somewhere in here.
21	Q	And you're rubbing on your chest and your belly area.
22	A	Yeah. The chest and the stomach area.
23	Q	And; but off to the
24	A	Oh, off to the right side.
25	Q	right side?
26	A	Yes.
27	Q	In his armpit so you believe his right arm was up? Like could it have been his left arm?
28	A	I mean, it could have been but I think it was his right but I, I'm not a-hundred-percent sure.

1	Q	Okay. That's fine.

3	A	Uh, it should've but I have no; um, no, I don't know.
4	Q*	Heh, I, I don't know if I misheard but if you; during your narration that you said, uh,

Uh, do you have any initial safety concerns regarding the call? It's kind of a weird question

Yes. Never when we've used lethal force but.

A Any initial; like...

- Q Safety concerns. When you were headed for the, uh, when you go from T-S-A to the scene and you're gonna be setting up as a sniper, what are your safety concerns?
- Well, I mean, there's several. There's obviously; I have an armed suspect somewhere. We don't really know where he was when I was enroute. Um, he's already shot a couple rounds either at or near his wife and threatened to shoot it out with the cops so that's obviously in your mind. Um, he's got a t-; according to this wife, he has a history of setting booby traps although, you know, noise makers and stuff but there's also some info that maybe he has been trying to figure out how to make an explosive devise. So that's huge in my mind. Um, also in the briefing, he had several other weapons that his wife had given to the neighbor. I don't know which neighbor. One of 'em included a; I believe it was a twenty-two-two-fifty rifle which, uh, DEBUS put out on the radio is a big-game high-powered rifle. So...
- Q* Do you know anything about that type of weapon personally?
- A No. Nothing at all. Nothing at all. Um, so, I mean, that's in my mind if I have a high-powered rifle and I can see and shoot him. If he has that, he can see and shoot me. So that's definitely a safety concern. Um, he's an Army medic so who knows what kind of tactical knowledge or experience he has. Um, he's been to Bosnia and he's actually seen or been in a combat region area so, you know, suffering from possibly post-traumatic stress disorder and on psych meds and drunk is what they also put out at the briefing that I didn't tell you earlier (LAUGHING).
- Q* (LAUGHING).
- A So, you know, put all those things together. Um, and, so there's that and then there's obviously the other stuff not getting run-over and hypothermia; all that other personal safety stuff.

- A So, yeah, there's all that going through your mind as you're going there.
- Q Okay. Do you; did you or your cover deputy stage before arriving on the scene?

I get 8 here, meet up with, uh, LOZOYA at the... 9 Q Where'd you, where'd you get here? Where in Alpine were you headed? 10 Α Um, to Japatul Valley Road near mile marker, uh, thirteen. That's where the T-S-A was 11 being, uh, uh... 12 The tactical staging area for the lady who's gonna be typing this. 13 Q Α Right forgot my loved ones wouldn't know that. 14 Q (CHUCKLING) Right. 15 Α Um, so the tactical staging area, uh, I went to where Deputy LOZOYA was at. Uh, he told 16 me to gear-up for a scout meaning I would go and check the residence in order to describe it 17 and relate that to my partners. So, I parked, geared-up, got all of my Department-issued 18 equipment on me and then, uh, Deputy KERR and I were teamed up as scouts. We used 19 my vehicle to drive from the tactical staging area over to the incident command. 20 Q You can say T-S-A now. 21 Α Incident command, the I-C... 22 Q (CHUCKLE) 23 Α and then from there drove down to meet up with the other scouts, um, Phil BEAUMONT 24 and John DEBUS. 25 Q Um-hmm. 26 They had finished it so they needed our help so we went back up to identify, you know, 27

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positions for everyone to be in. They, of course, did that back at T-S-A. Once everyone

was done, everyone in all those positions were delegated to everybody that came to us and then we went back down towards the residence and were put in our positions. DEBUS took half one way, BEAUMONT took half the other way which is on my side. And I was in the position of three-four corner with Deputy KERR. And just keep going?

They were telling us that over the air but, uh, I never heard him yell or anything from the front. They were dealing with trying to get a robot in place to bring in a phone. Uh, we had a; the crisis negotiation team inside doing the announcements, uh, so that that's they had first got the communication going with him. They wanted to use the throw phone in order to hopefully get better communication going with him. From back there we heard, uh, sound of things dropping or maybe just doors closing so we're guessing it's the slider opening and closing while they're dealing with him up front. Uh, shak-, uh, I need to actually go back. Should I tell my brief on what LOZOYA gave...

Once we were ready to go, he came; we came to him and he gave us a debrief on; or a brief on what was going on today. Uh, Michael FOSTER was at this residence earlier today. Had a three-fifty-seven handgun and put it to his wife's head and said he was gonna kill her. Somehow she managed to get away. He fired at her once, missed and then as she was running, he fired at her again and barely missed her head. She was able to leave and call nine-one-one but before she left that scene, I guess she last saw, uh, Michael FOSTER put the gun into his mouth. That was the last time she saw him. Not that he pulled the trigger or anything; just that he had put the gun in his mouth at one point. Um, LOZOYA also told us that he was a former Army medic. So he's; all the way in the back of my mind based on his training and experience, it's not an easy job. Combat experience maybe so worried about, you know, a lot of going up against a lot of experience on top of that. Um, we knew that he had the handguns; possibly other guns unknown and at some point I remember hearing something about, uh, medications or drugs or something. I don't know. I don't remember the details on that. I just remember something about medications. Um, so then fast forward back up to the entry team...

 - Q an... A an ear-wire...
 - Q Okay.

- A um, just so I can hear and other people can't. Um, over the radio, they were telling us everything that was going up front 'cause we couldn't see or hear him sliding the door open and throwing things out, yelling and stuff. Uh, and then it kinda went quiet for a minute or two and while we were laying; we're on the three-four corner so it was a; we were laying here more at an angle to the residence. Uh, actually the diagram that we were told...
- Q Um-hmm.
- based on the scout is from where we were positioned on three-four corner. That was the main residence. Then to the right of that was a granny flat and then to the right of that was a garage. From where I was sitting, um, couldn't see the garage at all. We could see the main residence and just a bit; a portion of the granny flat where we said that's where the whole incident occurred between husband and wife and then that's where he was actually positioned because that's the door he kept going in and out of or sliding open.
- Q* Let me make sure it's clear in my head. So the three-four position that you took up was on the main residence or on the granny flat?
- A It's uh, it was on far end of the whole thing. So, it's; really be on the main residence.
- Q* Okay.
- A And that, um, and there wasn't really much of a separation between the two. It's more like a overhang that separated the two. Like a patio kinda thing.
- Q* Um-hmm.
- A Um, so like I said, it kinda went quiet for a minute and then he came out one of the doors there; out, out of the granny flat and started coming around and we were looking up and I barely saw like his hair. So we started calling out to our partners so everyone could see that he was coming outside. "Okay, he's coming out." He started going to the right so I got up

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on my knees and then that's when I saw him, uh, raise the black revolver. And it looked like he was pointing towards the two-three corner where I thought my partners were and based on all the trees and shrubs and everything, I wasn't sure if they could actually see him coming so I was fearful that he may get a good shot on them without them even knowing. Um, plus of course, I feared for my own safety 'cause he wasn't that far and could easily move towards myself or Deputy KERR and at that point, I fired. Well, excuse me. I yelled out, uh, I heard someone yell out "He's coming out the back". He comes out. I yell out, uh, "He's got a gun." I hear one gunshot and then I fired. I fired two rounds and then I didn't see him anymore. He went down and then, uh, we started talking to ourselves; just making sure everybody was okay. Um, making sure nobody was hit. Then I started talking to KERR "Should we go up and check?" And then all of a sudden someone got on the radio saying "I see him. He's laying face up. Nothin' in his hands." So at that point, we knew someone had a visual on him so we didn't have to worry about well, is he gonna get the jump on us and start shooting again. They could see him. Uh, so at that point, we just held position and the next thing I remember is the entry team coming around from the front; from the far side coming to the left dealing with the suspect.

- Q Okay, did; on your weapon, do you have optics? Are there sights?
- A I have a hard sights and then I've got a, um, (UNIN) point. It's like a, a red dot in the; I think it's a; you know, I guess it's a scope.
- Q Which one were you using?
- 21 | A I use my hard sights.
 - Q And where on the suspect were you targeting?
- 23 | A On center mass.
- 24 | Q And do you know if you struck the sus-, uh, suspect?
- 25 A I think I did.
- 26 | Q Okay.
 - Q* But you mentioned that you were out and you, uh, you fired two rounds. Was that two rounds actual or was that your perception? Did you confirm it afterwards by counting your

2	A	It, it naturally felt like two rounds but then afterwards I looked down and I only saw two,
3		two rounds on the ground.
4	Q*	Okay.
5	Q	Two casings?

8		straight to the three-four corner?
9	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.

26	A	No. Um, like I said I was; we were at an angle like this towards the residence and I saw his
27		back and the gun pointed in that direction.

2	Q	say; yeah, kinda; but when you say "center mass" what is center mass to what he's presenting
3		you?
4	A	To his back.
5	Q	Okay.
6	A	So like, uh, shoulder blades
7	Q	We have to try to figure out which projectiles went where on
8	A	Right.
9	Q	him.
10	A	The picture that I saw of him; can I stand up
11	Q	Sure
12	Q*	Show us
13	Q	Absolutely. I've got
14	A	So
15	Q	to try to explain this to my partners so
16	A	I know.
17	Q	Ha-ha-ha.
18	A	Say you were in my position?
19	Q	Yeah, let me
20	A	And you
21	Q	Okay.
22	A	just see the top of my head as I'm walking out this way? By the time I come here, the gun's
23		out and this is what you saw with no shirt on.
24	Q	Okay.
25	Q*	Okay. You
26	A	So I aim center mass right here.
27	Q	On his back.
28	A	So, about mid-back to shoulder blades.

1	Q	And for the recording, what he's showing me is, uh almost a perfect back view with the right
2		arm extended out towards your partners; aimed in the direction of your partners.
3	A	Correct.
4	Q	And, uh, presenting his back to you and center mass would've been in the center of his back.
5	A	Yes.
6	Q	Okay. On; I should've, I, I should have had KERR clarify this. Wha-, and, and I'm
7		probably gonna have to have KERR eventually clarify but would KERR's vision be the back
8		or would it be the front?
9	A	Uh, his would be the back also.
10	Q	His would be the back also?
11	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.
12	Q	Okay.
13	Q*	Were you firing from the prone position?
14	A	On my knees.
15	Q*	On your knees?
16	A	I was, I was prone first when I saw the top of his hair
17	Q*	Um-hmm.
18	A	and then as he was going, I got up to my knees. That's when I saw
19	Q*	The full
20	A	basically the torso with the gun straight-out. It looked like he was going at, at my partners so
21		I fired.
22	Q	Which partners were in danger? The direction of the pointed weapon.
23	A	I don't remember the; I don't know who was specifically there. I just know someone was on
24		the two-three corner.

So, I feared for 17 my safety and my partners (UNIN) next to me at the time and then once he came out, he, he 18 went to the opposite corner. I, I worried about them too 'cause like I said, I don't know if 19 their vision; their position they would've seen him coming. 20 Q Okay. Have you been to many calls of this nature? 21 Α Um. 22 Q (CLEARS THROAT). How many code elevens have you; code-eleven is a... 23 Α I... 24 S-E-D call-out. Q 25 Α Five maybe seven? 26 Q And with the potential for deadly force? 27

7	Q	Did you formulate a plan of action? That's part of the S-E-D briefing. You covered that.
8		Uh, what did you determine was actually occurring with this incident after arriving on scene?
9		And you covered that. The sounds, the noises, the radio transmissions, the moves,
10		something coming out. Was a crime likely in progress?
11	A	Yes.
12	Q	Had a crime occurred?
13	A	Yes.
14	Q	Tell me what crimes; just from a cop's point-of-view, what crimes had occurred and what

2	A	I; she said her name, I think was Amber at the beginning of the whole thing when she
3		started talking to Mike FOSTER.
4	Q	Do you know her?
5	A	I know of her. I don't know her that well.
6	Q	Okay. Uh, it says "Was there any reaction from the suspect?" You covered that. Did you
7		consider which weapons; less-lethal weapons. Less-lethal equipment was available to you
8		when you contacted the subject? Did you consider that? You had less-lethal.
9	A	I had less-lethal on me. I did not consider that because the minute I saw a handgun, I'm not
10		gonna use a less-lethal on a lethal situation.
11	Q	Okay. Uh, it says "What did you consider when you realized force was necessary?" You
12		talked about that. Friends or your partners being in danger. And what were you thinking
13		when you fired your weapon? Same thing. What happened after you deployed force?
14		When you d-; when you shot, what happened? What's happens to him?
15	A	Like I said, I fired two rounds and then he disappeared. I didn't see anymore so I assumed
16		he, he went down to the ground. Um, the last
17	Q	Or what blocks your vision?
18	A	Based on the elevate; 'cause the residence was, was in an elevated position.
19	Q*	Um-hmm.
20	A	So there was a cinder block wall up to the level ground that he was at plus he was a little
21		further back from the edge of it so he had the highest point. So from my position, I was
22		looking up at a cinder block wall.
23	Q	(COUGHING)
24	A	That's why I never say anything below his waist based on the position at an angle.

26	Q*	What about the distance of your, uh, from your position to the target position?
27	A	To the target, um, about thirty yards.
28	Q	(CLEARS THROAT) What do you think would've happened if the subject's actions were

1		not stopped? And you did cover this but I wanna hear it again.
2	A	He ultimately would've ended up shooting somebody. He tried it earlier with his wife and
3		possibly himself and then we were on scene and it looked like he was going directly at one of
4		my partners.
5	Q	Was the subject restrained after forced was used? And it says "How and with what?" Do
6		you know what happened after you guys shot?
7	A	From my position, uh, of course, like I said, there was somebody who had a visual on him
8		could see that he wasn't moving. Um, Deputy KERR was giving him verbal commands to,
9		uh, not move "Put your hands up above your head." Uh, I saw the entry team from the
10		right come in and once they; I heard them, um, "Move the gun" or "Secure the gun outta

4	A	Prior? Sixty-Ida-fourteen. During Ten-Edward-eight.
5	Q	What area does that cover? I know the first one is Lemon Grove Detective.
6	A	Correct and that's my S-E-D number.
7	Q	And that's the whole County?
8	A	Correct.
9	Q	Were you a one-person or two-person? That doesn't matter. Uh, that's; well it asks if you're
10		a one-person or two-person vehicle. You're actually responded to the S-R-T call-out?

13	Q	Okay.
14	A	It, it looks very similar to the patrol rifle that you're familiar with.
15	Q	Um-hmm.
16	A	The R; A-R fifteen?
17	Q	Um-hmm.
18	A	Um, what gives it a different des-; designator based on the M-four is the capability of it
19		being automatic. Uh, I did not use an automatic mode today. Our S-E-D weapons are also
20		capable of being fitted with that less-lethal platform. It's one piece on the gun. That
21		launching platform can launch gas, less-lethal baton rounds, high-energy explosives if need
22		be although I didn't have those on my person. Um, lots of different types of platforms.
23	Q	And that's actually affixed to the
24	A	It's affixed to the front of the M-four. Yes.
25	Q	Uh, have you received training for this; this was the only other weapon other than what
26		you've told me here?
27	A	The, the Glock, the knife, the, the rifle. That's it.
28	Q	Okay. But then, out, outside of the equipment that's right here; your M-four

1	A	The M-four is outstanding.
2	Q	Is still out there?
3	A	Yes.
4	Q	And that's being collected somewhere else?
5	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE (CLEARS THROAT).
6	Q	And that's the only other piece of equipment that you had
7	A	Correct.
8	Q	other than what's in this room?
9	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.
10	Q	When did you last qualify with the M-four?
11	A	That was the two or three weeks ago we, we did
12	Q	And that
13	A	all of our qualifications.
14	Q	And again, did you test or check the equipment before beginning your shift?
15	A	I did.
16	Q	Um, in here they talked about the; that we took your photograph prior to the interview. We
17		don't have a F-E-T here so we're going to do that and when we do that, we're gonna ask you
18		to get fully dressed the way you were at the scene. Um, and we'll, we'll discuss that then but
19		you; were you wearing every piece of equipment that you've just identified?
20	A	Yes.
21	Q	You did and you're already explained what you were wearing.
22	(BRIE	F SIDE CONVERSATION)
23	Q	And you know that they
24	(BRIE	F SIDE CONVERSATION)
25	Q	when they collect your M-four, um, usually if you use your patrol weapon, we do an
26		exchange. I don't know how they're gonna do that out there. I wish I could tell you but
27		Suzanne FISKE is collecting your M-four and I'm sure S-E-D'll just give you another M-
28		four through Weapons Training. I don't know.

1	A	I, I asked the question.
2	Q*	I (UNIN).
3	A	Um, and my understanding; thank you sir. My understanding is that that has to be expedited
4		because we don't have proper replacements for all the guns that are involved.
5	Q	Oh, so you know more than I know. But I just wanted you to know that's
6	A	I understand.
7	Q	where I'm coming from.
8	A	I understand. Like I said
9	Q*	(UNIN)
10	A	that; sometimes
11	Q*	unique.
12	A	I understand sometimes weapons are gone for up to a year for testing.
13	Q*	Um-hmm.
14	A	I was told that that can't happen in this case.
15	Q	Yeah. All right. Um, the; let's talk about the M-four. Is the M-four the weapon you actually
16		fired
17	A	It is.
18	Q	at the scene?
19	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.
20	Q	Did you fire any other weapon?
21	A	I did not.
22	Q	Okay. So we're gonna discuss the M-four. Is that your issued duty weapon based on the S-
23		R-T call-out?
24	A	It is.
25	Q	Is that the weapon you used during the shooting?
26	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.
27	Q	The shooting
28	A	Yes.

1	Q	incident? Is the ammo used during, during the incident your issued ammunition?
2	A	It is.
3	Q	Is the ammo in your magazines your issued ammunition?
4	A	It is.
5	Q	How is your weapon loaded? Your M-four?
6	A	Uh, I have a side-by-side double-stacked magazine in which I insert one into the magazine
7		well of the rifle. I chamber the round. I put the r-, the weapon on safe, assume my position
8		on the perimeter until need be.
9	Q	Do you know how many rounds are in your magazine? Did; does that go; pull back to the
10		twenty-eight, twenty-nine?
11	A	Yeah, they're capable of carrying thirty. I typically load twenty or twenty-nine so that the
12		weapon doesn't jam. A fully
13	Q	Do you know specifically what you had?
14	A	I do not.
15	Q	Okay. Is that how you always load and carry your weapon; that weapon?
16	A	Yes.
17	Q	Since the shooting incident, have you maintained custody of the weapon? We already know
18		that it's
19	A	No.
20	Q	no. You have relinquished custody of the weapon to, uh; do you remember who?
21	A	I do. Sergeant STRONG ordered me to release to Corporal DEBUS.
22	Q	Okay. And was that at the staging area where S-E-D was set-up on Japatul?
23	A	The T-S-A. Uh
24	Q	At T-S-A; the Tactical Staging Area.
25	A	Correct.
26	Q	All right. Have you or anyone else altered the condition of your weapon since the shooting
27		incident? As far as you know when you turned it over was it as it was after the shooting
28		incident?

A Loaded on safe.

Q

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Okay. And what occurred during your shift before this incident? This is where we get into and this is where I actually enjoy it. So, I'll try not to take too many notes too. Go ahead and just start with, um, start with your work day. I came to work and this is what I do and. I came to work. Arrived at the Lemon Grove Station at about seven-fifteen hours. Uh, I was scheduled for (CLEARS THROATS) testimony in a civil trial Downtown, San Diego Department Charles Seventy-two regarding an arrest I made in March of two-thousand-eight at a business, El Cajon Ford, for four-twenty-two of the California Penal Code. The arrestee was suing El Cajon Ford for something that transpired related to that arrest. I have no idea what the actual case involves. They called me as a witness. Uh, I testified. I got off the stand I wanna say about ten A-M. Uh, while I was on the stand, I felt my phone and my pager vibrating. Uh, as I walked out the courtroom, I noticed that Deputy FARR had sent me a text saying that scouts; meaning S-E-D scouts, were enroute to Alpine for a two-forty-five. Uh...

- Q Were you a scout?
- A I am. I can be. I was not at that moment in time.
- Q Okay.
- We, we can all be scouts. Uh, I got into my assigned vehicle at the Downtown Court. Uh, while enroute to the call, I notified my Lemon Grove partners that I was enroute an S-E-D call and will not be back to the station. Uh, by the time I reached Grossmont Summit, the official call for all of us to respond to the Alpine code-eleven had occurred. I got onto S-O Admin frequency. Notified the Comm Center with my radio number and that I was enroute. I responded to the assigned location. I was the first S-R-T member to arrive.
- Q Was this the T-S-A?
- A The T-S-A. Uh, about nineteen-thousand-six-hundred Japatul Road I believe is the address. Uh, as I said I was the first S-R-T person to arrive. Corporal LOZOYA who is a full-term S-E-D member; not S-R-T; full-time S-E-D, uh, was there and, and instructing us where to go and what to do as the first person there, he ordered me to; or, or instructed me to suit up

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as a scout. Um, our uniform changes slightly if we're gonna scout versus up standard perimeter position. Mainly we go in a little lighter. Uh, a hat versus a, a tactical helmet. Um, we, we wouldn't typically carry a big backpack; things like that. Just a little bit lighter so we can move more than efficiently. Um, I suited up as instructed. By the time I was about half-way dressed removing my suit and putting on my tactical equipment, Brandon GAVIN, uh, pulled up next to my car and said he and I had been partnered up as scouts and that we would respond to the target location in his assigned S-E-D vehicle. We did that shortly thereafter.

- Q What is his vehicle?
- A It's a silver Crown Victoria.
- Q Okay.

And most of our vehicles are silver Crown Victorias; uh, varying shades. We responded to the target which, which was just a little further down the road to Japatul; a little further east. We went into the mouth of the driveway and pulled up behind a Sheriff's marked K-9 vehicle and contacted uh, Corporal DEBUS and Deputy BEAUMONT via radio; S-E-D two frequency because they had been prior assigned as scouts and we were suppose to linkup with, with them. We contacted them on the radio and said "We're ninety-seven. We're available to you." They said "Stand-by". A few minutes later they approached us and then informed; physically approached us and informed us they had completed the scouting mission and that our assistant wasn't; our assistance wasn't needed. We walked back up to the mouth of the driveway where the actual driveway meets Japatul Road and we stood by with them as Corporal DEBUS contacted the T-S-A and relayed all of the evolved information with scouting and the next step involved in the process which is, uh, essentially containment and a perimeter around the target. I overheard much of that conversation because I was there with Corporal DEBUS. I also heard the responding conversation on my radio on the frequencies. Uh, I understood that Corporal DEBUS had volunteered Deputy GAVIN and I to just immediately fall into a perimeter position from our location without returning to the T-S-A. He also requested some other S-E-D units to move into perimeter

positions. We stood by for several minutes while that occurred. Shortly thereafter, we were joined by a large portion of the team who had all been assigned various perimeter positions around the target location. The specific location that Deputy GAVIN and I were assigned was the three-four corner of the target location. I assume you guys recall how we number buildings?

- Q I do but just for the tape...
- A* But go over...
- Q The number one side is the primary; you guys say that's the primary side of the residence where?
- A Typ-, typically...
- Q Front door, most action, highest threat.
- A Absolutely. Typically the first person on scene will s-, will establish what they believe is to be the main entrance; the front of the location and that's given a designation of one and then moving in a clock-wise movement, we number the next side two, the next side three, the next side four. So, in this case, when we were given the three-four corner, we were giving the back and right side as you face the building...
- Q Um-hmm.

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corner as an area of responsibility in a perimeter sense. Uh, Deputy BEAUMONT having been part of the scouting team escorted a portion of the team members into the assigned locations because he had been there and pointed out where he thought the best deployment was. Corporal DEBUS took the other portion of the team. I was included in Deputy BEAUMONT's group, uh; along with the deputies assigned the one-four corner and I believe that was it. So it would've been five of us total moving into position. Led by Deputy BEAUMONT, Deputy GAVIN and myself and the folks on the one-four corner who, their names escape me at this point. We all look the same. Uh, we made a tactical approach of course using concealment and cover through the bushes as much as we could. We set up in a position where we felt we had, um, as much concealment and cover as possible yet maintained our position on the three-four corner. We estimated our position as

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and about thirty yards out. We radioed that position back into the T-S-A so that they could also map our location. Deputy GAVIN and I, uh, separated ourselves behind two separate trees with a distance of maybe ten or fifteen feet between us. I was, uh, on Deputy GAVIN's right which put me more on the three side of the target. He was to my left pull; putting him more on the four side of the target. We discussed our positioning. We discussed, uh, what happens if a suspect comes out as far as if he runs, if he fights, uh, who's responsibility it's gonna be depending on where he's standing geographically. If he leaves three side, my responsibility. If he leaves the four side, Deputy GAVIN's responsibility. We discussed, uh, line of sights, what he could see on the target location versus what I could see and so on just so that our communication was clear and we maintain a; our, our safety and our positions of advantage. Um, we assumed; we each assumed prone positions laying down on our bellies, uh, with our rifles forward pointing towards the targets and we endured the conditions; raining....

is our training and protocol, um, to be about forty-five degrees off of that three-four corner

- Q May I ask you this? Target. When you say "targets" or "target", what is your target at that point? Is that the entire three-four corner or the residence itself or did you have a window, a door or?
- A All the above. Uh, the; we had received briefing about the target location which I probably should have mentioned.
- Q Well, I was gonna ask you but...
- A Okay.
- Q I was lettin' you roll.
 - (SIGH) Prior to being assigned, we received, uh, a briefing from Corporal LOZOYA regarding the suspect. Also prior to moving into the, uh, perimeter position, we received further briefing from Corporal DEBUS. In each briefing we, we learned pretty much the following. The suspect was armed with a three-fifty-seven handgun. He was a White male by the name of Michael FOSTER, uh, approximately five-foot-nine, two-hundred-plus pounds, brown hair, beard. Uh, I even saw his JIMS booking photo, uh, sheet and, and

photographed it with my phone so that I would have that with me in the field. If you'd like 1 to see that... 2 Q Yeah, just... 3 it's on my phone. Α 4 Q bring it up so I can say that I've seen it. 5 Α Let me fire it up this way and not. Uh, we were, we were told that he fired one round at his 6 wife. She fled the residence as he put the gun to his own head and made some kind of 7 threat about suicide. 8 Q Do you know... 9 Α She... 10 Q who the reporting party of that story was? 11 Uh, from what I understood, it was his wife. Uh, we were told that he had, uh, been a prior 12 Army medic so therefore, we knew, uh, that he had all those experiences; camouflage-cover 13 weapons, those kinds of things; tactics. Uh, we also had heard he knew and was in the 14 process of either making, possessing or building improvising explosives devices. And we 15 understood that the Bomb Arson Units were enroute due to that, uh, probability. See if 16 that's ready to go for you. 17 Q Is this a County issued phone or is this...? 18 This is my private phone. Α 19 Q (CLEARS THROAT) 20 Α As you could see in the photograph, there's a hand. It was Corporal LOZOYA's hand 21 holding the JIMS photograph for purposes of just making sure I knew who the suspect was 22 and having it at my, my fingertips, I took a photo of that with my phone and went into the 23 field with my phone. 24 And what I'm observing is on his Blackberry cellular phone. Is a, uh, picture taken with the Q 25 phone of the; it looks like it's a; is it a JIMS booking sheet? 26 Α It is. 27 Q A JIMS booking sheet of the male that I also saw of the booking photo during our briefing 28

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which matched that photo being, uh, the same subject he spoke of. Okay.

So, uh, Deputy GAVIN and I were in our positions. As the situation evolved, we, uh, continually received updates via radio, uh, via voice contact with other positions. We knew, uh, that we had perimeter positions on the two-three corner. We knew that Deputy BEAUMONT was singularly in a position in the three side; basically dead-center in the three side. We knew that Deputy FARR had achieved a sniper position on a roadway three-four corner and he reported that he was about a-hundred-and-sixty yards out. That was all broadcast via radio. Um, we, we understand that Deputy FARR's an assigned sniper and he has the assigned equipment which includes a, a telescoped rifle. So we understand he has better vision that we do at that point. Um, we heard continuing radio traffic from both the command post and T-S-A that the owners of the home; the main home; the proper home had communicated in some way, shape or fashion that there were other weapons present scattered throughout the home. I think scattered was the word used which included other handguns, a twenty-two-two-fifty rifle, uh, which I understood immediately to be a highpowered, uh, rifle and Corporal DEBUS broadcast on the radio that it was a very serious high-powered, uh, highly-capable rifle. Um, I think I heard something about a over-under shotgun; sev-, several different types of guns. So...

- Q May I interject? Uh, when you're listening to the radio, how was the transmission coming?

 Do you have your; did everyone have ear pieces or do you have...
- A I can't speak for everyone but I, I have a shadow wire with an earpiece and a concealed mic so all the traffic coming into my ear can't be heard by anyone ne-, next to me.
- Q Okay.
 - I know that, that; well, I shouldn't say. No, I believe Deputy GAVIN had the same arrangement. We typically all do but I can't speak for everyone. Uh, so that information is, is out there. We'd also received information in the initial brief and corresponding radio traffic continually being broadcast that while we suspect the suspect was in the granny flat, the main home was, in fact, open, unoccupied and he had access to it. So therefore, we know he had access to all of the other weapons. Um, we also understood from the layout

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and the photographs that we've seen at; of the target, that there was a detached garage, um, and a breeze-way between the granny flat and main home. I think that covers that. So again, we, we laid in position for a considerable amount of time. Um, while the situation evolved, I heard engine sounds that I'm familiar with from my training experience of the armored vehicle approaching. We, uh, heard corresponding radio traffic that both the bearcat and the armored car which are assigned S-E-D vehicles armored to prevent gunfire had approached the front of the target.

- Q The number one side?
- A The number one side and that, uh, the entry team or, or other members of S-E-D, um, were in position in those vehicles to take down the suspect if in fact he came out the number one side. And that members of the C-N-T, uh, Crisis Negotiations Team, was present in the vehicle. Shortly thereafter we heard a female voice on a P-A announce herself, uh, to Michael, the suspect. Uh, I; something to the degree of "Michael, this is Amber. I want to help you."
- Q Do you know who that is?
 - I know Amber LEVITT. She's a deputy, uh, that I've worked with as a beat partner and I know she's assigned to the C-N-T. I did recognize the voice as, as hers. Her dialogue through the P-A went on for a considerable amount of time. I couldn't tell you minutes but, uh, I guess it was a long dialogue. Uh, while I listened to her P-A announcements, I also heard radio traffic continually updated from multiple sources. Uh, one that sticks out in my mind is I heard Deputy FORBES who is an assigned sniper. I knew him to be assigned to the number one side because of the radio traffic. Uh, I heard him broadcast that there was movement at the front of the blin-; the front number one side blinds in the granny flat. From prior briefings, of course, I knew that the home was suppose to be unoccupied except for the suspect so therefore, we all understood very rapidly that the suspect had not taken his own life. He was, in fact, alive and he was in fact in the granny flat. Of course, I didn't preclude the possibility that other suspects were there but it, it kinda tied things together for us to a degree. That went on for a while. There was movement. I believe he was trying to

shout through the door. We heard radio traffic of him trying to communicate as Amber continued to communicate. Uh...

Q Did you hear him?

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I heard shouts. I couldn't tell you what the words were. We heard muffled responses. Um, while that dialogue continued, we heard continued radio broadcast. Again, I, I remember specifically Deputy FORBES and Deputy WEST who, uh, from what I understood on traffic, they were partners in a sniper position talk about something was being placed against the windows of the granny flat and it was suspected that he was barricading the location. Um, we heard banging and thuds inside. I reported once on the radio that I had heard a scraping sound from my position that sounded as if a door or window had been drugged closed or, or, or rapidly closed. You know like grinding sound of a window frame? Um, I heard some more yelling and screaming from inside that you just couldn't make out. It wasn't audible to us. Uh, that went on for, for a time. Simultaneously radio traffic had broadcast that, uh, a mixture of S-E-D units, Bomb Arson Units and C-N-T units were working together to send robots towards the suspect's location with a throw phone; a, a means of communicating by phone with the suspect and that was being facilitated. We heard, uh, Deputy AlTKEN broadcast that he was moving the bearcat closer to the target as instructed to facilitate the robot picking up a phone and deploying it.

Q (CLEARS THROAT)

- Right around that time or just, just (PAUSE) minutes after seemed very close together to me. Um, let me take one step back. At one time the suspect, in fact, opened that front sliding glass door, shouted something at the C-N-T armored car folks and actually threw something and there was some radio traffic about trying to decide, heh, what did he throw? We were all concerned because of the previous discussions of I-E-Ds.
- Q Did you see that or did you just...
- 26 || A I was not...
 - Q hear this?
 - A in a position to see. I only heard the radio traffic. Um, at some point in time when he

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reached that door and presented himself enough to the, the people on the number one side, it was clear that somebody got enough of the view of him to describe him because I heard a voice on the radio that I couldn't identify say "He looks a lot like his booking photograph. Brown hair, beard, no shirt, heavy set" and so they, they gave a description of the suspect over the radio that matched the, the picture that I showed you gentlemen. I didn't bring my water in, did I? (CLEARS THROAT). That's okay. I, I'll make it. Um....

- A* Are you sure?
- A I'm good.
- Q^* (UNIN).
- A Uh, so we all had that in mind what he looked like currently.

(SOUND OF DOOR OPENING AND CLOSING)

As that progressed, as I said, they, they were trying to get a phone to him. Minutes thereafter, as I'm still prone in my position on the three-four corner (CLEARS THROAT) I heard, an...

Q* (UNIN)

an, another sound that sounded like a door or window either opening or closing and almost immediately on top of that sound I saw a White male, shirtless, that I recognized immediately as the suspect coming out of the breezeway between the granny flat and the main home. I again, as, as quickly as I can perceive seeing him I saw a gun come up in his right hand. It looked to be like a black handgun. Uh, I didn't reach for my radio, however, I shouted as, as loudly as I could "Suspect side three" while at the same time bringing my rifle up removing the, the safety and aiming at the suspect. As I said, his (COUGHS) his right hand was up. I believe he said something to the degree of "Get off my property" and he aimed or was aiming the handgun towards the two-three corner where my partners were setup on their perimeter position. And as I said, I knew this to be true because of the radio traffic about reporting positions and such. I immediately feared that he was gonna kill my partners with that handgun. He had already shown himself to be willing to shoot at people. Um, he had already established of the fact it was real gun. I knew he had access to the real

guns and I was, I was convinced he was trying to kill one of us. Um, so as I said I brought my gun up, took the safety off and I pulled the trigger, uh, aiming at the suspect. I fired, uh, I would've told you six or seven times but as trained like I am, I was smart enough to count my brass after the incident and I found nine pieces of brass which I didn't move. I just counted. Um, so I, I'm convinced at this point that I fired nine times. After that ninth round or what I perceived as my sixth or seventh round, the suspect dropped and because of my line of sight with him, the angle; the way of the geographically location; a, a, a block wall that's; I'm sure you've seen or will see, that was between me and him, I lost sight of him when he dropped. While this went on and I'm talking immediately simultaneously, I also heard Deputy GAVIN scream "Gun". I knew exactly what he's talking about 'cause I was watching this myself. I heard gunfire to my left which I felt comfortable with because I assumed it was Deputy GAVIN returning or firing on the suspect because he had perceived a gun as well. Uh, as I said, the suspect dropped out of sight, I got on the radio. Of course there was a lot of radio traffic. I think I got blocked from (UNIN) on the radio once. The second time I was successful. I can't tell you exactly what I broadcast but something to the degree of "Shots fired. Side three. Suspect down". And I believe I said something about my position meaning my partner and I being okay. The other perimeters units and I are in ear shot. That's how we lay it out. So I verbally turned to my; or I turned to my right and verbally yelled "BEAUMONT, DEBUS are you code four?" I heard affirmative responses from them. I couldn't tell you the exact words they used but I, I understood them to be and they were code four. In turn I heard them shout to their right to assure that their partners were, were safe. I heard those responses in an affirmative manner. (SIGH) I heard something to the one-four side meaning to my left further away than Deputy GAVIN. I took that to mean that those, those units were also okay. I got on the radio and I let the T-S-A know that, in fact, the suspect was down, there were shots fired. Everyone that I was able to get in contact with had no injuries to report. Obviously was more animated than that. Um, there was a p-; bit a lull at that point. Uh, it probably only seconds but perception is probably skewed and I heard radio traffic from Deputy FARR whose voice I recognized

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say that he did have view of the suspect through his; I, eh, well, I shouldn't say. I know how he did it but I assumed because of the distance that it was through his scoped rifle that the suspect was in fact downed. I believe he said "laying on his back with his hands out" and that nothing was in his hands. Deputy FARR received lots of instruction from T-S-A, command post and everyone else to maintain that observation. Uh, a, a bit more time went on as this evolved and I thought it was necessary to give the suspect some voice commands. I couldn't see him. I couldn't hear him. I didn't know his status. I only knew that Deputy FARR could see him but wasn't in voice range. I asked the T-S-A if that's what they desired. They said "Affirm. If you can establish voice contact with the suspect, do so." I repeatedly yelled "Michael, do not move. Put your hands above your head. Put your hands above your head. Do not move." I probably yelled that six, seven times. The first one or two yells I got groaning in response. The next couple yells I got; I believe he said "I'm dying. Help me." I broadcast that. "I get groans from the suspect. He's asking for help. He says he's dying." I again said "Put your hands above your head. Do not move." In response to the fifth or sixth yell, he said "I'm not moving. You idiot. I'm dying." And the whole while Deputy FARR is broadcasting on the radio "His hands are empty. His hands are at his side. The gun is x" so on and so forth. So I, so I knew him to be following the instructions.

- Q Do you remember where the gun was; what the direction was?
- A I couldn't see it and I don't think it was reported.
- Q Okay.

Again I, I, I had no visual. I was giving voice commands and relying on Deputy FARR to tell me if he was responding or not. Um, that continued until; I wanna say it was Sergeant BUTTERFIELD but I'm not sure. I heard on the radio a voice that I thought I recognized as Sergeant BUTTERFIELD make a decision that the entry team; meaning the people in the armored cars on side one, were gonna make some kind of a, a approach to take the suspect into custody and to render aid. I heard Deputy FARR get instructions to maintain that contact and, and give a running update as far as the suspect's actions obviously to protect everyone because he was more than willing to kill us. (SIGH) Um, some amount of time

thereafter we heard that a corresponding radio traffic of (CLEARS THROAT) the guys moving out of the armored car and reporting that and moving around the building and reporting that and ultimately coming into contact with the suspect and reporting that on the radio. Uh, shortly thereafter, I believe again was Sergeant BUTTERFIELD's voice asked for the tactical medics to respond and for an eleven-forty-one ambulance to respond. Um, I understood that the suspect was in fact injured but conscious and, and talking. Uh, I could see now was with people standing at that position, I can see them working on something on the ground. I assume that was the suspect. Um, I heard them giving him commands, I heard the medics talking to him about where he was hurt and how he was hurt. Um, and I saw in an evacuation by the medics take place. We held our positions. Um, some radio traffic confirmed that we are in fact suppose to hold our positions and we did. And it seemed like a long time. It seems like we were out there a long time. Um, and ultimately a decision was made that we would mark our locations for further investigation to preserve the, the evidence. Um, and Corporal LOZOYA brought a white roll of duct tape that he had secured from the medics to that patio where I had initially seen the suspect. I walked towards that, that patio that raised; elevated patio. Took the, uh, the duct tape from him and returned back down, uh, marked my position the best I could by stringing duct tape in this; the trees and everything where I had been laying. Gave that duct tape to Deputy GAVIN who I watched do the same thing with the duct tape as far as marking his positions. We were told to meet up at the armored car or bearcat. (SNEEZE) Excuse me. I met up with Sergeant BUTTERFIELD. He insured that we were okay. I asked Sergeant BUTTERFIELD, um, because of my prior knowledge of how shooting investigations go what he wanted us to do with our weapons; if he wanted us to, to maintain them as they were loaded on safe, um, as apposed to how we would typically do it after a SWAT operation which is we, we would download them completely and store them. He didn't want us to store them how we typically would. He wanted us to maintain them as they were for, for their investigation. I did not manipulate my weapon at all. I kept it loaded with a forty millimeter less-lethal round. I kept it loaded with the two-two-three ammunition and

1		on safe. I loaded up in the bearcat with, uh, tactical medics, other members of S-E-D and
2		Deputy GAVIN and I was driven to the T-S-A where I met with Sergeant STRONG who
3		instructed me to release my weapon to Corporal DEBUS. I was then assigned to a Fugitive
4		Task Force deputy that I know only as Randy and Randy drove me here where I've waited
5		for you.

Foster was a patient in room #219 and was guarded by Deputy Michael Spears. The interview was recorded with my Olympus DS-2 digital recorder. Please refer to the transcript and recording for details.

At about 2219 hours, I read the Miranda admonishment verbatim from my deputy note pad. Michael Foster said he understood his rights and he needed a lawyer present. Foster made the following spontaneous statement.

What good is it if I'm walking in jail? They should have just killed me. Why'd they shoot me in my back like that? Why'd they even shoot me? I made no aggressive attempts, and I didn't point my weapon. Nothin'.

And after I got...I was laying in the bed when I heard on the phone. Not on the phone, the microphone, "Michael FOSTER this is the crisis team. We're to help you." And so I went and I was just closing the blinds. They said "We have (b)(5)(B) or my brother there. I said "Let me talk to him." And they said "We will. Just walk outside to this." And I was like "Oh, no" because I didn't know what was going on.

So like a dumb ass, I walked outside and around the back just to close the, the gutters, these things. I said "Hey guys hiding in the bushes. How ya' doin'?" That's when they shot me in my back. Took me for a second to realize I was shot. This isn't the first time I had problems with the Sheriff. One time we got pulled over. I admit it, I was drunk and when I'm drunk I shouldn't be driving. They didn't let me call my lawyer and this one sheriff just grabbed me. Do you work with the Alpine Sheriff's Department?

At this point, the spontaneous statement ended.

At about 2244 hours, I ended the recording. Detective Fiske and I left the hospital shortly thereafter.

Investigation:

On 10-19-10 at about 1402 hours, Detective Sergeant D. Martinez briefed the Homicide Detail regarding an officer involved shooting at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in the City of Alpine. At about 1425 hours, I responded to the 19500 block of Japatul Road, Alpine, and arrived at approximately 1515 hours.

At approximately 1550 hours, I attended a patrol briefing conducted by Alpine Patrol Sergeant Browning #2569, Crisis Negotiation Team Sergeant Moore #0754, and Special Enforcement Detail Corporal Debus #1843. Homicide Detective Hillen #1635 was the assigned case agent. Briefing ended at approximately 1620 hours. For details of the briefing, see Detective Hillen's scene report.

At the conclusion of the briefing, Detective D. Hillen directed Detective Fiske #1918 and me to contact SED Corporal J. Debus who was in possession of the rifles used by the three invovled SED deputies. We were also tasked with contacting the suspect, Michael Foster, at Sharp Memorial Hospital at 7901 Frost Street, San Diego, for the purpose of evidence collection and an interview.

At about 1633 hours, I contacted Sheriff's Communications to request a phlebotomist respond to Sharp Memorial Hospital with instructions to contact Deputy Fuhr to facilitate a blood draw from Michael Foster. Please see Deputy Fuhr's report for further details.

At about 1658 hours, Detective Fiske and I were present while F.E.T (b)(5)(B) and Criminalist (b)(5)(B) received the three rifles from SED Corporal Debus which he identified as rifles belonging to SED Deputies Kerr #2623, Gavin #2649, and Farr #2618. We concluded this process at about 1743 hours. Please refer to Detective Fiske's report for details.

At approximately 1800 hours, Corporal Debus pointed out the area where SED Deputy Farr had taken a position along Japatul Road. At 1812 hours, Sergeant Martinez escorted Detective Fiske and me to (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road to view the scene. I viewed the scene from the patio area, but did not enter the residence. Detective Fiske and I cleared the scene at 1837 hours and left the area at approximately 1843 hours.

At about 2030 hours, Detective Fiske and I met Criminalist (b)(5)(B) Memorial Hospital located at 7901 Frost Street, San Diego. At approximately 2040 hours, we arrived at Surgery Intensive Care Unit room #219 and met with Deputy

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Michael Spears#5632. Deputy Spears advised me he had relieved Deputy Fuhr at about 1903 hours. Deputy Fuhr retained the blood sample drawn by the phlebotomist and suspect Michael Foster's boxer shorts. Please see Deputy Fuhr's report for details.

Detective Fiske telephoned Homicide Sergeants R. Frank and D. Martinez to confirm what clothing Foster was wearing when SED made contact with him. Sergeant Martinez reported back that Foster was only wearing boxers at the time.

I observed a white male adult, previously identified as Michael Foster, lying on his right side in the hospital bed. Foster was dressed in a hospital gown with a blanket over his legs. Detective Fiske and I introduced ourselves to Foster and the nursing staff.

Attending Regestered Nurse (b)(5)(B) was present in the room. Nurse (b)(5)(B) advised us that Foster was admitted in the Emergency Room at 1435 hours. At the time of admission, Foster tested positive for ethanol, opiates, and benzodiazepine. Since his admission and up to approximately 2035 hours, Foster had received 16 mg. Morphine. Foster's current diagnosis stated he was paralized from the waist down. It was not known if this was a permanent condition and he may undergo surgery at a later time.

I read notes written on a white board mounted on the wall of room #219. Foster had the following injuries:

- #1) Left scapula
- #2) Right upper back
- #3) Left lateral back (kidney level)
- #4) Lower middle back
- #5) Right hip

Michael Foster volunteered, "Doctor feels too dangerous to take out shrapnel from my back. I have spinal shock."

Criminalist (b)(5)(B) obtained a DNA reference sample from Foster's mouth. She also collected hair samples and conducted a gun shot residue (GSR) collection swab. Foster stated he was right handed. Criminalist (b)(5)(B) next obtained photographs of Foster and his injuries. Each of the bandages were labled in black with a number and date which corresponded to the numbered injuries on the patient information board. Nurse (b)(5)(B) exposed each injury to allow (b)(5)(B) to photgraph them. (b)(5)(B) also photographed a mark near bandage #2, as well as a minor discolored spot on Foster's right abdomen, marks to his right arm and right hand, and a scrape to his top right shoulder.

On 10-20-10 at about 0150 hours, Detective Fiske and I returned to Sharp Memorial Hospital to give Deputy Spear the original booking documents along with the original Medical Records Release form. Since Foster was asleep, I asked Deputy Spear to retain the form with instructions to ask Foster to sign it when he awoke. Detective Fiske and I left the hospital at approximately 0210 hours.

On Tuesday, October 19, 2010, at about 2020 hours, Deputy Fuhr #6655 handed Detective T. DuGal #2425 a white plastic bag with a Sharp Memorial Hospital logo. Inside the bag was a pair of shorts Michael Foster had been wearing during this incident. Deputy Fuhr also handed Detective DuGal a sealed evidence envelope, which contained (2) vials of Michael Foster's blood, which had been drawn at the hospital.

On Tuesday, October 19, 2010, at about 2030 hours, Detectives S. Fiske #1918 and L. Hall #1083, and Forensic Evidence Technician (F.E.T.) (b)(5)(B) arrived at the Sharp Memorial Hospital at 7901 Frost Street, to process Michael Foster.

On Tuesday, October 19, 2010, at about 0150 hours, Detectives S. Fiske and L. Hall, returned to Sharp Memorial Hospital to provide Deputy Michael Spears #5632 with booking documents for Michael Foster.

On Tuesday, October 19, 2010, at about 2330 hours, Detective DuGal handed the packaged shorts and vials of blood over to F.E.T. (b)(5)(B) to log into evidence.

On Wednesday, October 20, 2010, at about 0828 hours, Detectives S. Fiske and L. Hall, and F.E.T. (b)(5)(B) arrived at the Emergency Services Office at 1745 Marshall Avenue in El Cajon. F.E.T. (D)(5)(B) took photographs of the white boards used by S.E.D. during this incident.

He told had informed me that the two S.E.D. deputy's that were on the 2-3 side of the perimeter were Jason Phillips #4874 and Kevin Olin #5523. These were the deputies that Michael Foster had pointed his handgun at, and are the victim's of 245(D)(1) ADW on peace officer. Sgt. Martinez received this information from Detective S. Fiske.

On Wednesday, October 20, 2010, at about 1613 hours, I received a phone call from Detective A. Tsuida #2099. She essentially told me Michael Foster had sustained (5) gunshot wounds to the back, was paralyzed from the waist down, and had a collapsed lung. The Doctors were deciding whether or not to perfom surgery in an attempt to get some mobility back. There was also a possiblity that Foster would be transfered to U.C.S.D. Medical Center.

Origin:

On 10/19/10, at about 0930 hours, I was requested to assist Deputies with the apprehension of a felony suspect located at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in the unincorporated area of San Diego.

Investigation:

I held my position in the BearCat Armored Car. A few minutes later, I was instructed to assist other Deputies to ensure there were not any other people within the suspects' house.

I returned to the BearCat Armored Car. I remained at the vehicle until instructed to return to the Tactical Staging Area.

ORIGIN:

On 10-19-10, I was assigned as the Detective/Admin/Patrol Sergeant for the Ramona Station. At about 0930 hours, Sergeant Russ Moore contacted me and asked me to respond to Dapatual Road in Alpine for a Crisis Negotiations Team (CNT) callout. I arrived on scene about a half hour later and was briefed by Sergeant C. Browning, the Incident Commander, and Detective F. Passalagua.

INVESTIGATION:

The information I was given at the time was (b)(5)(B) Michael's wife, was woken up by Michael at about 0300 hours. He was armed with a handgun and he pointed it at before discharging it several times throughout the house. One of the discharges was done in close proximity to (b)(5)(B) head. Was scared and she fled the home to call for help. When she left the home, Michael was laying on the bed, with the handgun pointed under his chin and a towel was covering his head. There was no phone in the home because took the cell phone with her. She did not have cell phone service there, so she went to neighbor's house to call for help.

When patrol arrived they tried to communicate with Michael by yelling into the home and using the PA system on the patrol vehicles. There was no response from Michael.

Sergeant Moore, the Acting Team Commander advised me I was going to be the CNT Team Leader for this callout.

While other members of CNT were responding, I spoke with and obtained some other personal and background information about Michael. She told me he suffered from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). She explained that he also suffered from other medical ailments. She said he often would wake up in the middle of the night and grabbed her and tell her to identify herself. Said they had an appointment for Michael to get some help, but he was not looking forward to it. She gave us other background information about weapons he might have, family issues and information, and possible contacts that might be able to help us.

I assigned CNT members as they arrived, to contact family members and friends of Michael and obtain Third Party Intermediary (TPI's) recordings of them in case we needed to use them to encourage Michael to come out.

When most of CNT had arrived, I conducted a briefing on the information we had about the incident. We talked about possible methods of communicating with Michael since there weren't any phones in the home.

I was advised by Sgt. Moore that our mission was going to be to attempt to communicate with Michael through the PA system on the Bomb/Arson robot. In addition, a plan was devised where we would give SED our throw phone. The Bomb/Arson robot would take the phone to the home and deliver the phone in hopes that Michael would accept the phone and we would be able to communicate with him. Once we were able to establish communication with Michael, our mission was to have him exit the home where an arrest team would take him into custody.

I assigned Deputy W. Voth and Deputy A. Leavitt to deploy on the armored car with SED. Deputy Leavitt was the primary negotiator and Deputy Voth was be the secondary negotiator. At about 1250 hours, they deployed with SED in the armored car. I assigned Deputy M. Rand and Deputy S. Dayrit as the primary and secondary negotiators, respectively, inside the CNT van. They would be utilizing the throw phone if it was able to deployed. When SED deployed, the remainder of the team, in the CNT van, was moved to an area closer to the home, adjacent to where Bomb/Arson personnel were.

Once the Bomb/Arson robot was deployed closer to the home, Deputy Leavitt began speaking to Michael through the PA system. Deputy Voth communicated to me via radio and advised me what they were doing. After a few minutes of utilizing the PA, Deputy Voth advised me that the blinds in the home were moved and a few minutes later, Michael began yelling out of the home. Soon after, Deputy Voth advised that a "pop" sound was heard coming from the home.

Deputy Leavitt continued to make announcement into the home and after several more minutes, Michael moved the blinds again, yelled out of the home about wanting his phone back, and slammed the sliding glass door. Deputy Voth also advised at one point that Michael opened the sliding glass door and threw something out of the door.

During this time, Michael was given instructions via PA by Deputy Leavitt, to exit the home but he did not comply.

While the above communication was going on, I was assisting my team in transferring the throw phone to SED so they could deploy it. At about 1323 hours, I heard several popping sounds that I believed to be gun shots coming from the area of the home. At some point I was advised that SED had exchanged gunfire with the suspect, injuring him.

I saw medical staff being deployed to the scene. I was advised by Sgt. Moore to stand by with the team in the CNT van. Eventually, I was advised my Sgt. Moore to back up the CNT van and return to the Command Post. CNT debriefed the incident and was released from the scene

On 10-19-10, at about 0908 hours, I received a telephone call from Deputy Lozoya #2190 directing me to respond to (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine to assist with a tactical mission. (CAD# S8708726).

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

I arrived at the above location at about 1005 hours and contacted Deputies Lozoya and Chantler #2305. Deputy Chantler directed me to gear up for a scouting mission. Shortly thereafter, Deputy Chantler told me the suspect, Michael Foster (b)(5)(A) was last seen in the granny flat of the above address. Deputy Chantler explained the suspect was wanted for attempted murder on his wife, (b)(5)(B) Deputy Chantler explained the suspect had held a .357 magnum revolver to the victims head, threatened to kill the victim, and then fired his revolver into the interior of his residence. With this information and a map of the property, Deputy Debus #1843 and I began a scout of the property.

After Deputy Debus and I scouted the target, we began placing perimeter containment teams around the residence. I placed two perimeter teams on the property's perimeter at about 1205 hours. I placed Deputies Ladieu #4812 and Gale #4869 near the ¼ corner of the residence and placed Deputies Kerr #2623 and Gavin #2649 near the ¾ corner of the residence. Shortly thereafter, I took up a containment position on side 3 of the residence, approximately 40 yards from the residence. Side 3 of the residence had a steep hill flowing down from the residence with tall brush and trees that blocked my ability to see the residence.

While at my containment position, I could hear the public address (PA) announcements from the armored car to the suspect. The armored car was located on the front side, side 1, of the residence which was situated on the opposite side from my location. Shortly thereafter, Deputy Debus joined me at my position and together we moved further back off of side three.

At about 1320 hours, I heard one of the perimeter containment team's radio traffic that stated the suspect was coming out of the residence from side 3, the rear of the residence. I scanned the rear area of the residence looking for the suspect, but was not able to see him. My view was blocked by all the high vegetation. After the radio traffic, I heard several sounds of gunfire and determined some of the gunfire was coming from Deputies Kerr and Gavin's position. After the gunfire stopped, I heard via the radio the suspect was on his back on the patio at the rear of the residence. I was never able to see the suspect.

I held my position at the rear of the residence until I was told to meet the rest of the team back at the Tactical Staging Area (TSA).

(b)(5)(B) voluntarily made two recordings for Michael to listen to if we contacted him. The recordings were given to the primary negotiators, Deputy A. Leavitt (2720) and Detective W. Voth (2633).

After making the TPI recordings, I entered the CNT duty vehicle. At approximately 1240 hours, the CNT vehicle followed the Special Enforcement Detail (SED) armored vehicles to park near the residence to attempt negotiating with Michael. Deputy Leavitt and Deputy Voth were with SED in their vehicle and were closer to the residence. I remained in the CNT vehicle and became one of the recorders for significant events during the negotiation. I did not have visual of the SED vehicle or the residence. I was advised of events over the radio and recorded that information. Negotiations were attempted via the blow horn by Deputy Leavitt and Deputy Voth.

At approximately 1304 hours, while I was writing times and events that happened, I heard a loud "pop" which I believed to be a single gunshot. It was unknown what the sound was at that time and I was advised negotiations were continuing. I was advised there were noises coming from the residence that sounded like furniture moving and Michael had yelled something from inside his residence.

At approximately 1324 hours, I heard one "pop" which I believed to be a single gunshot. Shortly after the "pop" sound, I heard four similar sounding "pops" which I believed to be gunfire. I was advised a male came outside the residence and may have been shot. At that point SED had taken over negotiations. I had no further involvement with this incident.

SYNOPSIS:

This is a narrative for my personal accounting of the occurrences surrounding the officer involved shooting at [b)(5)(5)(B) Japatul Valley Rd., on 10-19-10.

ORIGIN:

I responded to a SWAT callout (Code-11) on the morning of 10-19-10 at about 1100 hours. See CAD No: s8708726.

INVESTIGATION:

After I arrived, was sufficiently briefed, and geared up, I was deployed in the Bear Cat armored vehicle with Deputy Aitken, Reserve Deputy Borges, and two Tactical Medics. Sometime around 1245 hours, our vehicle and personnel were tasked with delivering the CNT (Crisis Negotiations Team) throw phone to a pre-designated location for the Bomb/Arson robot.

As we were paying out the hard line for the throw phone from the rear of the Bear Cat, I heard what sounded like four or five quick bursts of gunfire from the nearby target structure approximately 30 yards away. I could only hear the sound of gunfire, but did not see anything.

ORIGIN:

On 10-19 -10 at about 1000 hours, I was advised of a Code-11 (SWAT activation) in Alpine.

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

I responded to the staging area located at about the 13 mile marker on Japatul Road in Alpine and was briefed reference the incident by Sergeant Strong and Deputy Lozoya. I was informed Michael Foster (DOB: (b)(5)(A) was the suspect in a 245, 664/187 PC incident involving his wife and was possibly barricaded inside the residence. Foster was described as a recent war veteran with mental/ emotional issues and possible suffering from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder. Foster reportedly held his wife against her will for several hours and fired at least one round from a handgun very close to her head. Foster's wife was able to leave the residence and call the Sheriff's Department.

I responded to the front of the residence at [b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in the Armored Car. The plan was to have CNT negotiators, also in the Armored Car, attempt to make contact with Foster using the vehicle PA. CNT Deputy Leavitt began using the PA in an attempt to contact Foster. Movement from inside the residence was confirmed by containment positions and within a few minutes I heard a male yell out of the residence asking about the location of his phone. Deputy Leavitt continuously asked Foster to exit the front of the residence and told him we were there to help him.

While we were in the process of delivering a phone to Foster with a robot, I heard an advisement over the radio he had exited the residence from the back door (side 3). Shortly after exiting the residence, I heard what sounded like several gunshots. I then heard via the radio Foster was laying on his back on the patio area to the rear of the residence (side 3).

I was able to confirm via the radio Foster's hands were empty and he remained on his back. The Entry Team then moved on foot to Foster. I observed Foster lying on his back with a revolver a few feet from his left hand. Deputy Lozoya guarded Foster while Deputy Chantler secured the weapon. The remainder of the Entry Team checked the interior of the buildings.

I had the San Miguel Tactical Medics respond to provide medical care to Foster. They began assisting Foster who was then transported from the scene by medical personnel.

I remained at the property until relieved by Detective Bolter.

ORIGIN:

On 10-19-10 at approximately 0900 hours, I arrived at Emergency Services Division office and was informed by Sgt. Strong (#1997) that Alpine Patrol units were dealing with an armed suspect who was barricaded in his house. Sgt. Strong then directed Deputy Lozoya (#2190) and I to respond to (D)(5)(B) Japatul Road, Alpine and make contact with Sgt. Browning (#2565) in order to evaluate the situation and conduct a scout of the area in case a Code 11 was requested. At approximately 0930 hours, I arrived at the above location and contacted Sgt. Browning.

Deputy's Observations & Origins:

Sgt. Browning informed me that Michael Foster ((b)(5)(A) was believed to be barricaded in the granny flat on the property with a pistol. He also informed me of the location of the patrol Deputies on scene. After discussing the situation with Sgt. Browning he informed me that he was requesting SED to respond to the scene.

I then contacted the victim, (b)(5)(B) along with Sgt. Moore of CNT. (b)(5)(B) informed me that her husband Michael had woken her up at approximately 0300 hours and was talking about making a bomb. He then produced a .357 revolver and during the next few hours fired it several times in the residence, including firing one round just past her head. At approximately 0730 hours, she left the residence and had last seen Foster lying on the bed with the pistol pointed at his head. (b)(5)(B) also informed me that Foster was former Army medic who had combat experience in Bosnia, Somalia and Afghanistan. She also stated that Foster has been prescribed several physiological medications, but she was unaware if he had been taking them. She also informed me that a few days earlier Foster had started a fight at a local bar and then fought the Deputies that had arrived on scene. (b)(5)(B) stated that since that incident Foster had made statements about committing "suicide by cop".

I relayed all of this information first to Deputies Debus (#1843) and Beaumont (#2635) who arrived to conduct a scout of the location. I then relayed the information to Deputy Lozoya at the Tactical Staging Area (TSA) by and radio and telephone. Deputies Kerr (#2623) and Gavin (#2649) then arrived at the location to assist with the scout and I directed them to the residence and instructed them to coordinate their scout with Debus and Beaumont. Sometime after this I was informed by a Deputy from CNT that (b)(5)(B) had informed them that in the past, Foster had set up "trip wires" around their property that were attached to whistles and lights. I relayed this information to the scouts and the TSA by radio. When Lt. Brust (#1723) arrived on scene he took over as the SED liaison at the Command Post. I drove to the TSA and was assigned to the entry team for the operation.

I was in the Armored Car when it deployed to the residence and parked on side 1 of the granny flat. While at the Armored Car I heard one loud pop coming from the residence that may have been a gun shot. Later I saw Foster open the front sliding glass door and throw something out of the residence. A few minutes later I heard several guns shots on side 3 of the residence and was informed that the suspect was down on side 3. After a movement plan was discussed, the entry team moved to side 3 and I observed Foster lying on the patio. He was bleeding and appeared to have suffered multiple gunshot wounds. A black revolver with the hammer in the cocked position was lying to the left of Foster. I moved the pistol approximately two to three feet to the left – away from Foster to further insure he would not be able to access the pistol. Deputy Lozoya took a position between Foster and the pistol and I went to clear the residence. After the residence was cleared and Foster was transported by the fire department I returned to the Armored Car and then to the TSA.





ORIGIN:

On 10-19-10, at about 1005 hours, I received a page to respond, as a part of the Sheriff's Department Special Response Team, to (b)(5)(B) Japatul Rd., Alpine, for a barricaded suspect. (Event #S8708726).

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

I arrived at the tactical staging area at 1107 hours and prepared for a perimeter position. I, along with other perimeter deputies, were briefed on the incident. Deputy Lanning #3841 and I were paired up and took up a position on the south east corner of the perimeter, about 40 feet from the garage of the residence. From my position I could see the garage, a portion of the front (southeast) side of the guest house and the roof of the main house. I could not see the side sliding glass door of the guest house, located on the front side of the house. The view of the sliding door was blocked by the garage.

During the initial briefing we were advised that the suspect, later identified as Michael Foster, was possibly armed with a handgun and had access to other weapons in the home. Prior to Sheriff's Department response, Foster had fired rounds from his handgun, near his wife, and made statements to "shoot it out with police." Because of the statements and the possibility of Foster being armed with a firearm, I trained my department issued M4 rifle towards the one side of the guest house.

Soon after containment was set, the armored car arrived and was positioned in front of the residence. Crisis Negotiation Team personnel began public address system announcements from the armored car, in an attempt to communicate with Foster. Soon after announcements were made, perimeter personnel advised, over the radio, that they could see Foster in the guest house at the front side sliding glass door. While in place I heard, what I believed to be, one round being fired inside of the residence, although, the sound was muffled. As CNT continued to attempt communications with Foster, I could hear the sliding glass door open and heard Foster yell, "What kind of car is that?" Then I heard the sliding glass door slam shut. A short time later I heard the sliding glass door open again and Foster yell, "Give me my phone!"

At about 1324 hours I heard perimeter personnel advise over the radio, "suspect coming out," followed by a volley of shots being fired. I could not tell how many shots were fired but did hear different types of weapons being fired. Over the radio, I heard a perimeter position say that the suspect had pointed a weapon towards deputies or that the suspect had fired his weapon at deputies.

ORIGIN:

On 10-19-10, at about 0915 hours, I was notified by Sgt. Moore (0754) of a developing incident at [b)(5)(B) Japatul Valley Rd. in Alpine. Sgt. Moore advised me that patrol deputies on scene had requested the assistance of the Sheriff's Crisis Negotiations Team and asked me to respond to the location to assist.

INVESTIGATION:

I arrived on scene at about 1015 hours and met with Sgt. Moore at the intersection of Japatul Valley Road and the dirt road leading to the residence in question. Sgt. Moore introduced me to (b)(5)(B) who is the wife of Michael Foster.

Statement of (b)(5)(B)

On 10-19-10, at about 1025 hours, I met with (b)(5)(B) She told me the following: (b)(5)(B) said she last saw Michael inside their residence with a gun pointed to the side of his face with a towel draped over his head. (b)(5)(B) advised me that Michael is feeling suicidal, and she felt he was going to commit suicide either self-inflicted or suicide by cop.

(b)(5)(B) stated Michael suffers from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), survivor's guilt and chronic depression escalated by his increased gain in weight.

She said when she went to bed that night he seemed fine. She noticed he took his evening medication without her reminding him. At approximately 0300 hours, she woke up to him talking to himself and pacing. She believed he was having a "flash back," and he felt the "enemy" was outside. For the next several hours, she said he continued to become more paranoid. He fired the gun in her direction several times throughout the early morning hours. She stated, when he finally realized what he had done to her, he sat down and pointed the gun to one side of his face. At that time, she took their cell phone, left their house to call 911.

Based on Michaels' military background, I asked (b)(5)(B) the following questions: If Michael had any other weapons, had set up any booby traps in or around their home, and if he had any excessive chemical/corrosive materials. She stated, they had a rifle, but Michael gave it to their neighbor to hold several days ago. In their prior home, he had set booby traps, noise-indicator type, but did not believe he had placed any around this house. He does have a lot of stored medication but no chemical/corrosive materials.

She and Michael have been married for 7 years. They have no children together. He does have 2 children from a previous marriage. He has not had contact with his children for years due to his estranged relationship with his ex-wife. He has a close relationship with his brother who lives near by. He has several friends at the VFW and American Legion Auxiliary who possibly could provide assistance. Audio tapes were made by Michael's friends asking him to surrender. Copies of those tapes accompanied the after action report.

Job History;

Michael is currently unemployed. He did serve in the Army as a combat medic in Bosnia and Somalia. He was injured by shrapnel to his lower body during a deployment and was given an honorable medical discharge 13 years ago.

Medical/Mental History;

Michael is currently taking Trazodone, Ativan and Paxil prescribed to him for depression, PTSD, survivor's guilt and insomnia.

In the past year, he has "self committed" himself into the VA Hospital in La Jolla for depression.

According to (b)(5)(B) he is an alcoholic and consumes beer daily.

Hobbies;

He is active member at the Alpine VFW as well as American Legion Auxiliary.

After speaking with (b)(5)(B) met with Sgt. Bavencoff (2227) and Sgt. Moore to discuss the situation. Ultimately, other members of CNT arrived and a plan was established to attempt to contact Michael.

My particular assignment was to assist the primary negotiator, M. Rand (4713), with Michael if contact was established via the "throw phone" which was to be deployed to the residence Michael was in. I rode in the CNT van with other CNT members to a closer position to the residence and began the process of deploying the throw phone with the assistance of the Sheriff's Special Enforcement Detail (SED). During this process, I heard five gunshots from the area of the residence and was later advised that Michael had been shot in an exchange of gunfire with SED deputies.

A short time after hearing the gunshots, CNT members began collecting the throw phone and securing the van for the ride back to the command post. Upon arriving at the command post, we de-briefed momentarily before leaving the scene.

ORIGIN:

On 10/19/2010, at 0912 Hrs, I returned a cell phone call from Deputy Juan Lozoya (2190). I was told to respond to Japatul Rd. in Alpine reference a potential SWAT Call-Out. I was told that it involved a 245 PC with a weapon, with the suspect possibly barricaded inside a residence (CAD S8708726). I was to respond to the location and start planning for a SWAT activation.

DEPUTY'S OBS/ACTIONS:

While enroute to the location I heard via radio traffic that the call had been declared a Code-11 or SWAT activation. I was told via radio traffic that I and Deputy Beaumont (2635) were to begin a scout upon arrival. I arrived on scene at 1009 Hrs and met with Deputy Chantler (2305). Deputy Chantler gave me a "Google Earth" photo of the property and told me that the suspect was last seen in the "granny flat". He told me that the suspect had assaulted his wife with a handgun, and had fired a round near her head, in addition to other shots inside the residence. Although he was last seen by the victim lying on a bed inside the flat, he could possibly have moved into the nearby main residence.

Deputy Beaumont and I began a scout of the property and structures at 1025 Hrs. During the scout, we were advised via radio that the suspect's wife had relayed that he was known to set up "trip wires" around the property, that could be used with IED's or signaling devices. After completion of the scout, we were met by SED containment personnel. We briefed them on the scout information, and then began moving them into positions around the target. I placed a sniper team consisting of Deputies West (2686) and M. Forbes (2401) off of Side 1 of the target at about 1205 Hrs. I then placed the 1/2 Containment team of Deputies Lanning (3841) and Collis (3306). I then placed the 2/3 Containment team of Deputies Phillips (4874) and Olin (5523). I then placed Deputy Farr (2618) into a sniper position deep off the 3/4 corner of the property, near a guard rail on Japatul Rd. While setting containment, I heard via the radio that the suspect may have access to a .22-250 caliber rifle and shotgun, in addition to the handgun that he was known to have.

After setting containment teams, I returned to the TSA and met with the Entry team. Once they were prepared, I directed the large Armored Vehicle into its position directly off of Side 1 of the granny flat. I then returned to my vehicle and changed clothing and retrieved equipment to assume a containment position. During the time that Crisis Negotiators where attempting contact with the suspect, there was discussion on the radio that the suspect may have fired shots inside the granny flat. After retrieving containment gear, I met with Deputy Beaumont at Side 3 of the target to assist him with containment. After meeting with Deputy Beaumont, we moved to a new location further back on Side 3 from the target. From our new position we could not see the target due to heavy foliage, but we could assist with containment in the event the suspect attempted to flee in our direction. I was in the process of trying to notify the TSA of our new location, when I heard yelling from a containment position near us.

I associated the yelling with typical containment directions when addressing a suspect. During the directions I heard a voice say "I don't want to hurt you" or "I don't really want to hurt you". I do not know who said this, but it had a tone of gravity, or demand to it. Immediately after, I heard a series of about 10 shots. I associated a lower tone to the initial shot, and then perceived a series of higher pitch, rapid cracks, which I also saw out of my periphery, as being fired from an M4 Carbine from the 3/4 Containment team. During this volley, I also perceived a lower pitch shot further off of the 3/4 corner, which I associated with a .308 rifle. I could hear the suspect moaning and saying "I'm dying". The 3/4 Containment, 2/3 Containment, and Deputy Beaumont and I established verbal contact with each other confirming that we were all uninjured. I remained in my position until the suspect had been taken into custody and the residence cleared.

Once the scene was secure, I walked to Deputy Farr's position to check on his status, and remained with him until we began marking team positions. I took several digital photos of Deputy Farr's position and condition of his rifle. Deputy Farr had already unloaded and placed his rifle in a safe/storage condition. I then marked his location with a piece of yellow crime scene tape on the guard rail.

All SED personnel returned to the TSA for de-brief. Upon Sgt. Strong's (1997) request, I took custody of Deputy Kerr's (2623) M4 Carbine and placed it in my department vehicle with the heater on so that it could dry. Deputy Kerr told me that it was in the same condition as when he left his containment position; that it was on "safe" with a round in the chamber and a less-lethal round in the M203 launcher. I confirmed that the M4 and M203 were on "safe" and placed the weapon in my vehicle. I did the same for Deputy Gavin's (2649) M4 Carbine. I took notice that Deputy Kerr's M4 had a "fastex clip" type release, and that he retained the strap that the weapon attaches to; therefore, his M4 had no sling with it. Deputy Gavin's M4 had a different type sling which does not separate from the weapon; thus, his M4 had an attached 3 point sling. I knew that Deputy Farr's rifle was inside his department vehicle. I turned his vehicle on and left the heater running so that his rifle would dry. I later put his rifle in my vehicle as well.

As the SED team de-brief was finishing, I responded to the Homicide team briefing. I gave a synopsis of SED involvement in the incident. Afterward, Homicide detectives and Evidence technicians took all three weapons from my vehicle. I assisted in answering questions on how the weapons functioned, make/model, etc. I then showed detectives where Deputy Farr's location had been.

Origin:

On October 19th, 2010 at about 1925 hours, Detective Palmer and I interviewed Deputy Farr in the conference room on the second floor of the Alpine Sheriff's Station. Attorney (b)(5)(B) represented Deputy Farr and he was also present throughout the interview. Attorney (b)(5)(B) used a handheld voice recorder to record the interview. I used my handheld digital recorder to record the interview.

The following is a summary of Deputy Farr's statement. For specific details of his complete statement see the transcript for Deputy Farr's interview.

Investigation:

Deputy Farr was assigned as a rural patrol deputy who works in the Boulevard area of San Diego County. He was also assigned to the "Secondary Response Team (SRT)" for the Sheriff's Department "Special Enforcement Detail (SED)". His primary duty on SED was as a sniper. His sniper rifle was a .308 caliber Remington 700 long rifle that has been customized by the Sheriff's Department. During this event, the rifle was loaded with four rounds of .308 ammunition.

On October 19th, 2010 at about 1000-1015 hours, Deputy Farr received a call out by SED to respond to Japatul Road as a function of his SRT duties. Deputy Farr attended a SED briefing where he received specific information pertaining to the mornings events related to the Foster's residence.

Deputy Farr was told the suspect, Michael Foster, had armed himself with a .357 handgun. (b)(5)(B) Michael's wife, had reported that Michael had pointed the gun at her. She also reported that Michael had fired a couple of rounds at or near her person. Deputy Farr was shown a booking photograph of Michael during the SED briefing to familiarize himself with Michael's physical appearance. Deputy Farr was told Michael was suffering from possible post-traumatic stress disorder and he took "psych meds." It was also believed that Michael had been drinking an alcoholic beverage and he may be drunk.

Deputy Farr understood there was probable cause to arrest Michael Foster for the attempt murder of his wife, (b)(5)(B). He also understood Michael was possibly suicidal and he remained armed with the revolver. He received information that Michael had previous military training and Michael could possibly be making or utilizing explosive devices. He was also briefed that Michael had been arrested the prior week and during

that arrest, Michael fought with deputies. He learned from the briefing that Michael made a statement to an unknown source that he was willing to fight it out with police or shoot it out with police. Michael claimed he would not be arrested again.

After the briefing, Deputy Farr was assigned to a sniper position on Japatul Road that overlooked the rear area of the main house and granny flat on the property. Deputy Farr referred to his position as the 3-4 side with a better view of the 3 side (rear) of both residences.

Deputy Farr took his sniper position on Japatul Road. He used a range finder to determine he was about 160 yards away from the rear of the granny flat. He maintained his position and never changed his location throughout the event. Deputy Farr was listening to his Sheriff's Department issued radio for updated information at the scene. Deputy Farr heard Deputy Kerr put out a radio transmission indicating Michael was coming out of the granny flat. Deputy Farr used his scope to sight in on Michael's location. He saw Michael walk out onto the back patio area. Michael was wearing shorts and no shirt. Michael was pointing a gun. The gun was a large "Dirty Harry" type revolver. Deputy Farr was not sure of the color of the revolver.

When Deputy Farr initially took his sniper position Deputy Debus had told him, "Heh, we've got some perimeter guys over here by that area. There's some guys over there. Deputy Debus pointed in the direction of where those guys were. I didn't know exactly where they were 'cause they were doing a good job of hiding in the bushes." When Deputy Farr saw Michael coming out of the residence with the gun he saw Michael pointing his weapon in the same location that Deputy Debus had pointed out as the position of the other deputies. Deputy Gavin was aware that the SED vehicle arrived in the front of the residence. He could hear a female who identified herself as "Amber" attempt to negotiate with the suspect and get the suspect to come out of the residence peacefully.

Deputy Gavin was in a prone position on the perimeter watching the residence when he heard radio traffic which described possible suspect movement at the front of the granny flat. He was informed on the radio that the suspect had thrown an unknown item from the sliding glass door in the front of the residence.

Deputy Gavin described how it went quite for a minute and then the suspect came out of the granny flat. He estimated his position to the suspect was about 30 yards. He first noticed the suspect's hair coming from an area near the granny flat in the breeze way area. The suspect held a revolver in his right hand. Michael was approximately 5'09", 200+ pounds, with brown hair with a beard. He understood Michael had shot one round at his wife and that she fled the residence as he put the gun to his own head and threatened suicide. Deputy Kerr believed there was probable cause to arrest Michael for the attempt murder of his wife. He also understood that Michael had prior military combat experience and Michael may be capable of making and deploying explosive devices. He was shown a previous booking photograph of Michael at the TSA where he used his own cellular telephone to take a photograph of the booking photo for reference.

position on the 3-4 corner of the property from a further distance near the roadway on Japatul Road. He was also aware that there were additional deputies in perimeter positions around the rest of the property and specifically deputies in position on the 2-3 corner.

Deputy Kerr was in position on the perimeter watching the residence when he recognized the sound of the SED armored vehicle coming from the front side of the residence. He heard subsequent radio traffic that confirmed the SED armored vehicle was in position on the 1 side. He also heard a female voice on a PA that identified herself as "Amber." He recognized this voice as Amber Levitt, a deputy. He recognized that Amber was announcing in her role as a crisis negotiation team (CNT) member. 
EXAMINATION:

- Item 1 The fired cartridge case is nickel-plated with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and parallel breechface marks. The headstamp is "WINCHESTER 38 SPL+P". Green and brown materials were observed on the cartridge case. This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Taurus revolver (Item 4).
- Item 2 The fired cartridge case is nickel-plated with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and parallel breechface marks. The headstamp is "WINCHESTER 38 SPL+P". Green material was observed on the cartridge case. This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Taurus revolver (Item 4).
- The Taurus model 689 revolver, caliber 357 Magnum, serial #(b)(5)(B) was examined for operability and test fired to obtain fired components. No malfunctions were observed. An apparent hair was removed from the revolver's hammer and repackaged with Item 4. The measured trigger pull values for the revolver were a minimum of 3½ pounds in single action and 10¾ pounds in double action. The cylinder capacity of the revolver is six cartridges. Test-fired components were designated Item 4.03.
- The unfired cartridge has a nickel-plated case with a nickel-plated primer, and an aluminum-jacketed hollow point bullet, typical of Winchester Silver-Tip ammunition. The headstamp is "WINCHESTER 38 SPL+P". Green and brown materials were observed on the cartridge.
- Item 6 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and smooth breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 04". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).
- Item 7 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and smooth breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 04". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).
- Item 8 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and irregular breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 04". This item was compared to other



evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).

- Item 9 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and irregular breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 04". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).
- Item 10 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and irregular breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 04". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).
- Item 11 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and irregular breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 04". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).
- Item 12 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and irregular breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 04". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).
- Item 13 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and irregular breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 04". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).
- Item 14 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and irregular breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 04". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).
- Item 15 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and irregular breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 04". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).



- Item 16 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and irregular breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 04". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).
- Item 17 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and irregular breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 06". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).
- Item 18 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and irregular breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 05". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).
- Item 19 The fired 223 Rem/5.56 NATO cartridge case is brass with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and irregular breechface marks. The headstamp is "FC 04". This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).
- The five fired cartridge cases are all nickel-plated with nickel-plated primers, and have hemispherical firing pin impressions and parallel breechface marks. The headstamps are all "WINCHESTER 38 SPL+P". The cartridge cases were designated Items 21A 21E for documentation. Green and brown materials were observed on each cartridge case. Items 21A 21E were compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Taurus revolver (Item 4).
- The fired cartridge case is nickel-plated with a nickel-plated primer, a hemispherical firing pin impression, and parallel breechface marks. The headstamp is "SPEER 38 SPECIAL". Apparent hairs or fibers were removed from the side of the cartridge case and repackaged with Item 27. Green and brown materials were observed on the cartridge case. This item was compared to other evidence cartridge cases and cartridge cases fired in the Taurus revolver (Item 4).
- Item 28 The fired semijacketed hollow point bullet is damaged, weighs 123.9 grains, and has an approximate diameter of 0.30 to 0.38 inch. The projectile has five conventional rifling impressions with right twist. White powdery debris



was observed on the bullet. This item was compared to bullets test-fired from the Taurus revolver (Item 4).

Item 43 Item 43 consists of two medical containers (designated 43A and 43B for documentation) containing metal fragments.

Item 43A consists of two lead fragments with apparent biological material and impact damage. The fragments weighed 11.2 and 4.1 grains. No rifling marks were observed on these fragments.

Item 43B consists of one heavily damaged and distorted copper bullet jacket fragment. The fragment weighs 9.8 grains. Apparent biological material was observed on the fragment. This item was compared to bullets test-fired from the Remington 700 rifle (Item 34) and the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33).

CONCLUSIONS:

The Taurus revolver (Item 4) is operable.

The unfired Winchester cartridge (Item 5) is correct for the Taurus revolver (Item 4).

Eight cartridge cases (Items 1, 2, 21A, 21B, 21C, 21D, 21E, and 27) were identified as having been fired in the Taurus revolver (Item 4).

The fired bullet (Item 28) was identified as having been fired from the Taurus revolver (Item 4).

Three cartridge cases (Items 6, 7 and 8) were identified as having been fired in Item 33 (Colt M4 Carbine – Gavin). Item 33 was previously examined and described in a Laboratory Service Report dated 11/15/2010.

Eleven cartridge cases (Items 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, and 19) were identified as having been fired in Item 32 (Colt M4 Carbine – Kerr). Item 32 was previously examined and described in a Laboratory Service Report dated 11/15/2010.

The lead fragments (Item 43A) are not suitable for comparison.

The copper bullet jacket fragment (Item 43B) has different class characteristics than the the Colt M4 Carbines (Items 32 and 33). Therefore, it was not fired from Item 32 or 33. Item 43B has similar class characteristics to the Remington 700 rifle (Item 34). However, due to the limited size and severe damage to the jacket fragment, insufficient individual detail was present to conclusively identify or eliminate Item 43B as having been fired from the Remington 700 rifle (Item 34).

Origin:

On 10-19-10, at about 1404 hours, Sgt. David Martinez (1136) asked me to attend a meeting regarding a call out of a deputy involved shooting at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine. Sgt. Martinez told me that the incident had a CAD (computer aided dispatch) number of 8708726. I printed the CAD information. During the meeting, I read information from the CAD. See the printed CAD documents for more details. I then responded to (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine.

Investigation:

I arrived on scene at about 1510 hours. The following personnel conducted briefing between about 1550 and 1620 hours: Alpine Patrol Sgt. Charles Browning (2565), Crisis Negotiations Sgt. Russell Moore (0754) and Special Enforcement Detail (SED) Corporal John Debus (1843). I was advised that three deputies from SED were involved in the shooting. These three deputies were: William Kerr (2623), Brandon Gavin (2649) and Bradley Farr (2618). I was told that Corporal Debus had secured the three firearms used in the shooting in his county vehicle. I was advised that the suspect had been identified as Michael Foster. Foster had been transported to Sharp Memorial Hospital by tactical paramedics for injuries sustained during the shooting. Detective David Hillen (1635) was assigned as the case agent. Detective Hillen asked Detective Leslee Hall (1083) and me to process and collect the firearms used by the SED deputies during the shooting and to review and photograph diagrams used by SED during the incident. Detective Hillen also asked Detective Hall and me to respond to Sharp Memorial Hospital to process and interview suspect Michael Foster. Sgt. Martinez (1136) asked Detective Hall and me to meet with SED Sgt. Michael Strong (1997) prior to our other assignments. See Detective Hillen's report for more information regarding the briefing.

Sgt. Strong advised us that the front of the residence, granny flat and garage at Japatul Road in Alpine had been designated as side one. The sides of the structures as one moved clockwise from the front were designated as side two, side three and side four. Sgt. Strong said that he would document a chronology of the operation the following day. Sgt. Strong provided us with the following times until the written documentation was completed:

1321 hours - Michael Foster was seen throwing an unknown object out of the sliding glass door on side one

1322 hours - Michael Foster was seen exiting side three of the granny flat



Investigation:

On 10-26-10, at about 0900 hours, I attended a meeting with Sheriff's Crime Laboratory Personnel at the Sheriff's Main Office, 9621 Ridgehaven Court in San Diego in order to discuss the evidence in this case. See the lab requests by Detective Hillen for more information. On 10-28-10, at about 0755 hours, I met with Detectives Hillen, DuGal and Hall regarding follow-up planned for later that morning.

On 10-28-10, at about 1030 hours, Forensic Evidence Technician (FET) (b)(5)(B) (0099) and I went to (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine. Detective Hall arrived a short time later. FET (b)(5)(B) painted a yellowish orange colored rectangle with "SDSO" in the middle in the approximate location of Deputy Bradley Farr's position at the time of the shooting. This was done in order to enhance the visibility of aerial photographs scheduled for later that day.

At Detective Hillen's request, FET (b)(5)(B) took additional overall scene photographs from Japatul Road, the hill to the north of Deputy Farr's position and the driveway which led to (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road. FET (b)(5)(B) also took exterior photographs of the house, guest house and garage at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road. At about 1135 hours, Detective Hall, FET (b)(5)(B) and I left the area. See the photographs and report by FET (b)(5)(B) for more information.

On 10-28-10, between about 1255 hours and 1305 hours, Detective Hall and I attended a briefing led by Detective Hillen at the Alpine Sheriff's Station, 2751 Alpine Road in Alpine. See the report by Detective Hillen for more information.

On 10-28-10, at about 1320 hours, Detective Hall and I returned to D(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine where we assisted Detective Hillen and Detective DuGal. Around 1610 hours, I transported Deputy District Attorney Timothy Campen from the scene to the District Attorney's Family Protection Office in El Cajon. I dropped Campen off at about 1645 hours.

Deputy's Observations and actions:

On 10-19-10, at approximately 1000 hours, SED was requested to assist the Alpine patrol Deputies with barricaded subject, Michael Foster. Foster was at his residence located at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine.

I arrived at the tactical staging area and met with S.E.D. personnel. S.E.D. was given the mission to set containment around the property at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road. I was assigned the perimeter position at the 1/4 corner of the property. I was partnered up with Deputy Ladieu.

Once S.E.D. set containment the Crisis Negotiation Team arrived in the armored car. I could hear the crisis negotiator speaking through the public address (PA) system, attempting to make contact with Foster. I could hear Foster yelling from the direction of the front door. I was unable to understand what Foster was saying.

At about 1324 hours, I heard S.E.D. personnel broadcast over the radio that Foster had come out the rear of the house, on side 3. Around 20 to 30 seconds after that I heard multiple gun shots. I was unable to see side 3 of the house, the suspect or any of my S.E.D. partners. Shortly after, I heard via radio that the suspect had been shot and was seen lying on his back on the patio located on side 3 of the property. I could hear S.E.D. personnel telling Foster "do not move, keep your hands above your head". Deputy Ladieu and I maintained our positions at the 1/4 corner.

S.E.D personnel located Foster and detained him while paramedics treated Foster and transported him to the ambulance.

On 10-19-10, at about 1130 hours, I was working as part of the San Diego Sheriff's Special Enforcement Detail Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team. I responded to Suspect refusing to come out of his house.

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

I arrived on scene and was briefed reference the incident. I was informed a white male adult by the name of Michael Foster (DOB (b)(5)(A) was a recent war veteran with possible mental and/or emotional issues. Several hours prior to my arrival, Foster reportedly held his wife against her will for several hours before firing at least one round from a handgun close to her head. Foster then continued to fire rounds from inside his house into the surrounding areas. Foster then reportedly became very depressed and held the handgun to his head. Foster's wife took this opportunity to leave the house and call the Sheriff's Department for assistance.

During the incident briefing I was informed Foster was possibly emotionally unstable and was reportedly armed with a handgun. I was told Foster possibly had access to more powerful weapons in the residence next to where he was staying. I was also told Foster had prior military experience and has been in combat situations overseas. According to Foster's wife he also made statements of committing suicide by cop and trying to make a bomb. Foster's wife also told investigators he has a history of placing "trip wires" around his residence to alert him to intruders.

I was told Foster was staying in a granny flat or garage type structure on the south side of the property approximately 15 feet from the main residence which was believed to contain high caliber firearms. After the incident briefing I was assigned to the Entry team and deployed to the scene in an armored car. I arrived on the east side of the granny flat approximately 20 yards away at about 1300 hours. I remained behind the armored car for cover in the event Foster decided to shoot at deputies. As I was staged at the armored car I listened as the Crisis Negotiations Team (CNT) attempted to call Foster out of his house using the armored cars public address system.

I was able to hear a male yell out of the residence asking for his phone. CNT continued to attempt to contact the male via the PA. At about 1322 hours I heard a deputy on the west side of the property state via the radio he observed a male come outside with a handgun. I then heard several gun shots fired. I was on the east side of the property and did not see anything. I then heard a deputy state via the radio that the male who came outside was now on his back on the ground. The deputy then stated he saw a handgun next to the male's hand.

Another deputy on the east side of the property stated he could hear the male asking for help. The decision was made to approach the male, make the scene safe and call in medical personnel to treat his injuries. Myself and several other deputies walked around the residence and approached the male. I observed a white male adult laying on his back moving around and asking for help. The male fit the description of Michael Foster. I also observed a black and brown handgun laying right next the male's hand. The male did not have a shirt on and was bleeding from several holes on his body. I assisted several other deputies with clearing the remaining structures on the property to make sure there where no other individuals inside who posed a threat to law enforcement. As I was clearing the structures I heard via the radio deputies requesting medical aid for the male. I spent approximately three minutes clearing the structures and when I returned medical personnel where providing first aid to the male.

At this point I returned to the armored car to await further instructions. While walking back to the armored car I observed

ORIGIN:

On 10/19/10, at about 1010 hours, I was requested to drive the Armored Car to a Special Enforcement Detail callout on Japatul Road. I was told the callout was for a barricaded suspect.

SYNOPSIS:

I arrived on scene driving the Armored Car at about 1145 hours. It was lightly raining at that time. I was wearing the standard olive drab SED uniform with subdued Sheriff patches. I was assigned the job of driving the Armored Car during the incident.

At that time, I observed the operations at the Tactical Staging Area. Sergeant Mike Strong was coordinating the deployment of perimeter positions and marking their position on a whiteboard map. At or about 1220 hours, I received a briefing with Sergeant Mike Strong who showed me an aerial picture of the property, including the "main house", the "granny flat", and the garage. I was told the suspect, Michael Foster, was thought to be in the "granny flat". I was shown where to drive and position the Armored Car. I was briefed that the suspect was considered armed and dangerous due to his firing of a handgun inside the residence the night before. Additionally, I was told the suspect was upset at law enforcement due to an incident about a week before, when the suspect resisted arrest. I was told he would not be cooperative and would fire on deputies that tried to arrest him.

Due to the rain, I then took refuge in the cab of the Armored Car to await deployment.

At or about 1240, the Special Enforcement Detail entry team and other perimeter personnel loaded up in the Armored Car and the Bearcat for a mission to assist the Crisis Negotiating Team in making contact with the suspect. The two car caravan drove south on Japatul Road the short distance to the driveway entrance for the property and picked up two Crisis Negotiating Team members. I overhead the name of the primary negotiator to be Amber and do not know the name of the secondary negotiator.

At or about 1245, I drove the Armored Car down the driveway and was instructed by Deputy John DeBus on how to position the vehicle on side 1, the side with the sliding glass door. The Armored Car was approximately 25-30 yards from the sliding glass door. My view was partially obstructed by a palm tree. I stopped the engine and was given the task of observing the sliding glass door area for movement. I prepared the radio for PA announcements. Amber received instructions from Sergeant Brad Butterfield on where the suspect should exit and which direction he should proceed, which was towards the white VW Jetta in the driveway.

At or about 1250, Amber began to make announcements towards the "granny flat" to the suspect Michael Foster. Amber asked Michael Foster to turn on a light or make some movements so that she knew he was okay. At or about 1300, the blinds of the sliding glass door began to sway from side to side and I called that out to the deputies in the back of the Armored Car. Amber asked repeatedly for the suspect to come out and told him that everything would be okay, that we were there to help him.

During the PA announcements, the suspect repeatedly returned to the sliding glass door and moved the blinds. Since it was a one sided conversation and we could not hear a yelled out comment by the suspect, the mission was given to the Special Enforcement Detail to deliver a throw phone. The mission was to deliver the phone via robot, so that the Crisis Negotiating Team could establish a dialogue with the suspect.

At or about 1320, the Bearcat drove down the driveway with the robot and the throw phone.

At or about 1325, I heard radio traffic indicating the suspect was exiting the "granny flat" on side 3, which was the back side of the house from me. After a very short pause, I heard what sounded like gunfire. Radio traffic then indicated that

shots were fired. I do not know how many shots were fired. Radio traffic indicated that the suspect was down on his back. The entry team then moved up on the left side of the "granny flat" to the rear of the structure to make the area safe for the medics to provide first aid. The medics then moved to side 3 out of my view. Radio traffic indicated that ALS was on the way.

After a short time, the ALS ambulance came down the driveway past my position and then backed up to the garage. They went around the "granny flat" to side 3. I then backed the Armored Car out of the way of the driveway so that the ambulance could leave quicker. After probably 10 minutes, the suspect was moved by gurney to the ambulance. I observed the suspect lying on his right side, away from me, and I saw several wounds on his back. He was probably 30 yards from me.

The ambulance then transported the suspect. I remained with the Armored Car until all the Special Enforcement Detail deputies where done with their assignments and then we returned to the Tactical Staging Area. I was within the Armored Car during the whole incident.

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

ORIGIN:

On Tuesday, October 19, 2010, at approximately 1720 hours, Detective Tsuida # 2099 and I interviewed (b)(5)(B) at the San Diego County Sheriff's Alpine Substation, located at 2751 Alpine Boulevard, Alpine, Ca, in regards to the Officer Involved Shooting of suspect Michael Foster. The following is a synopsis of our conversation. A digital recording was made of the conversation. The compact disc was later placed into evidence.

STATEMENT OF

(b)(5)(B)



(b)(5)(B) stated that she lives at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road, Alpine, Ca. She lives there with her husband Michael Foster. The property which she lives on has two dwellings. The property owners and landlords, (b)(5)(B)live in the main house. (b)(5)(B) and Michael live in a granny flat off of the main house. (b)(5)(B) and Michael have lived there for approximately two and a half years.

(b)(5)(B) and Michael have been married for about six and half years. She met him when he first got out of the military and she worked for a staffing office that employed nurses for hospitals. He got employment as a nurse working for her company.

When he was in the military he was a Combat Medic in the United States Army. She stated that Michael often served in a combat capacity while on active duty. He served in Bosnia, Somalia, Afghanistan, Desert Shield and a few other places that she was not familiar with. He was in the military for approximately fourteen and half to fifteen years. When he was discharged, he was discharged honorably but medically. While serving he was injured; his unit had been ambushed. During the ambush, the flash of a grenade going off blinded him for three days, he received shrapnel in his leg, he blew his knee out and he was later diagnosed with having post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

Michael gets treated for PTSD at the VA in La Jolla, Ca and he is on medication. (b)(5)(B) doesn't know the name of his current Doctor, but she believes the social workers name is (b)(5)(B) She stated that he has been going for treatment, on and off, for the last couple of years. Prior to meeting him, Michael had been receiving

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treatment for PTSD at Loma Linda Hospital in San Bernardino, Ca. There she believes that his Doctor's name was (b)(5)(B)

(b)(5)(B) stated that he takes three types of medication. He takes Trazodone, Adavan and Paxil. She believes that he takes 125 mg of Trazodone. This medication prevents him from having nightmares and helps him sleep. She doesn't know how many milligrams of Adavan or Paxil he takes. She said that the Adavan is an anti psychotic medication which prevents him from having flashback type episodes and the Paxil is a mood stabilizer.

(b)(5)(B) stated that he suffers from survivor guilt nightmares over men he lost during combat. During normal sleep he rambles, talks and wrestles. The talking and wrestling around is a daily activity. Every few months he will grab her by the hair during a nightmare and he will ask her questions saying things like, "Identify yourself". She stated that Michael occasionally suffers from bouts of depression. When he is depressed he doesn't go out of the house, he becomes reclusive, he sleeps a lot and he isolates himself. When this happens, it exacerbates his feelings of survivor guilt which makes his nightmares worse. When he gets depressed, he makes comments saying things like, "It's not worth it, you would be better off with out me". She stated that he has never had a suicidal plan nor has he ever drawn a picture or written a note.

(b)(5)(B) stated that Michael had two brothers and two sisters. His sisters have not shown any signs of mental illness; however both of his brothers have been diagnosed as bi-polar, they have received treatment and are on medication. Both brothers were diagnosed in their twenties. Michael's mother has been diagnosed with Schizophrenia and Michael's father is not in the picture. He has not seen his father since he was small. (b)(5)(B) believes that his father is retired from the military and possibly working with Homeland Security.

(b)(5)(B) stated that Michael didn't have psychological problems as a child; he developed the problems after he was discharged from the military. (b)(5)(B) stated that when she first met him, he had been out of the military for about six months. He did not discuss his problems with her initially. She saw some behavior prior to them being married and his illness seemed more manageable when they were dating. He wasn't receiving treatment while they were dating. When they got married he got progressively worse so he went to the VA. While at the VA, he was reluctant to speak with the Doctors about his problems. (b)(5)(B) stated that he did speak enough for them to realize what was what going on. Once diagnosed, they treated him. It took a while for them to find the correct dose of medicine to get him balanced. (b)(5)(B) described it as being "Real rocky there for a while". The dose of medicine that he has been currently taking for that last few years has been working. (b)(5)(B) wasn't sure what year that Michael began getting

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treatment. He began receiving his treatment at Loma Linda. She was married to him already when he began getting progressively worse. The changes that she saw she believes were because the medication he was on was the wrong medication. He would get tired from the medication, so in order to get things done and function, he would stop taking his medication. He would stay off of his medication for a few days and than he would have some type of episode. She stated that it doesn't help that Michael is an alcoholic. She stated that before he received help he would medicate himself with alcohol. Michael has never stopped drinking even after receiving treatment.

Once Michael got on his current medication, he started showing improvement. He would go much longer periods of time without having an episode. He has been on his current medication for approximately three years. (b)(5)(B) stated that when Michael drinks, what she described as "Hard alcohol", his episodes are worse. (b)(5)(B) stated that Michael drinks beer regularly, he will usually have a few beers a night and than he'll go to bed. She stated that she was fine with that; however she believes that he shouldn't be drinking at all with the medication that he is on.

(b)(5)(B)stated that Michael does not have a driver's license, his license is suspended, but he continues to drive his vehicle. The night he was arrested, Sunday, October 10th, 2010 he had been driving. He lost his license because he wasn't making child support payments.

On Sunday, October 10th, 2010 at about 1730 hours Michael called (b)(5)(B) He told her that he was at the American Legion; he told her that he would be leaving in about three minutes. He was going to stop at the store and he would be heading home. Michael did not come home that night. (b)(5)(B) assumed that he went out with his friends so she went to bed. The next day, Monday, October 11th, 2010 she called the San Diego Central Detention Facility and found out that he had been arrested. She stated that he had been arrested on an assault on a peace officer, assault on a person and being drunk in public. She did not talk with any deputies about the arrest. She did hear rumors from Alpine citizens. She heard that Michael was in the Casino Inn parking lot, he was screaming about a car being on fire. He began pulling strangers out of their car, A woman was scared so she maced him. He approached the bartender's husband; they got into an argument and Michael punched him.

(b)(5)(B) stated that this is the behavior that he exhibits when he is having an episode. The difference she noticed this time was that Michael doesn't remember the incident. On previous occasions he usually remembers what happened. (b)(5)(B)stated that Michael doesn't remember anything from that night. Prior to that night he was not having episodes. (b)(5)(B) stated that she was completely blindsided by the incident. (b)(5)(B)

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stated she could usually see an episode coming, because she can sense it and she sees changes in his behavior. On Sunday, October 10th, 2010 she did not see an episode coming.

Michael was bailed out of jail on Monday, October 11th, 2010. He was a complete mess, he was delusional, he had no idea where he was, his clothing was disheveled, he had no shoes and he was limping. (b)(5)(B) stated that he has not used any drugs other than alcohol since she has known him.

On Monday, October 11th, 2010 Michael took his medication. (b)(5)(B) was sure he took it because he took in front of her. On Tuesday, October 12, 2010 he slept the whole day. He woke up on Tuesday evening. He was remorseful, he was fearful that he may have hurt someone because he couldn't remember the incident. He asked that (b)(5)(B) drive him to the American Legion so he could resign his post as the Post Service Officer. Members of the American Legion refused his resignation and said they supported him telling him that they would help him through this. This was a boost for Michael.

Michael helps Veterans with their veteran packets. He came home from the American Legion and he began working on a couple of unfinished veteran packets that he had. Upon completing them, he was going to check himself into the Psych ward at the VA in La Jolla. (b)(5)(B) believed Michael when he told her this, however, he never turned himself in to the VA; (b)(5)(B) stated that she should have just brought him right over to the VA instead.

Things seemed a little better, things were looking up and she thought they had a plan. From Monday, October 11th, 2010 through the evening of Monday, October 18th, 2010 Michael was taking his medicine and his behavior was good. They talked about the strategies on how they would try and get him to be able to go to a lock down treatment facility rather that having to do jail time. Michael brought up the idea of running away, but (b)(5)(B) explained to him that he needed to face it and deal with the situation. She stated that Michael is scared to death of going to jail.

During the day Michael was busy and didn't dwell on the incident. At night time, he had more time to think about it. During their night time conversations, he spoke of his fears of being incarcerated, however, they worked on getting a VA lawyer and Michael said that he was prepared to go to his arraignment.

(b)(5)(B) stated that between Monday, October 11, 2010 and Monday, October 18, 2010, Michael was scared but he was making plans to face his problems. During this time, he

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never spoke about committing suicide nor did he leave any notes. He did make comments saying things like, "I should just take off and leave, so you wouldn't have to deal with it".

(b)(5)(B) stated that on Sunday, October 17th, 2010, Michael ran into his next door neighbors (b)(5)(B) and (b)(5)(B) live next door to and Michael. They share a driveway but live on another parcel of land. described as Michael's best friend. He ran into them at the American Legion. Michael walked up to them and asked (b)(5)(B) for a hug.(b)(5)(B) said, "Don't talk to me, don't ever talk to us again, come on we're leaving". (b)(5)(B) stated that Michael was hurt and he didn't want to live at his residence anymore. He told the landlord that he maybe moving within the next fifteen days, because he couldn't live next door to people who feel that way about him. (b)(5)(B) was not with Michael when this happened she was at work.

The following day, Michael commented to (b)(5)(B) about the incident. He told her that he was going to go over to house. (b)(5)(B) told him that he was not going over to house. (b)(5)(B) told him that he was not going over to (b)(5)(B) residence alone. As far as (b)(5)(B) knows, Michael never went back over to (b)(5)(B) to retrieve any of his property.

(b)(5)(B) stated that Michael slept most of Monday, October 18, 2010; he woke up when she got home from work. They had dinner, everything was fine, he took his medication early and she eventually went to bed at approximately 2330 hours.

On Sunday, October 18th, 2010, at approximately 0300 hours, Michael woke up ranting and raving, this woke **(b)(5)(B)** up. She described him as rambling and having a full blown episode. He was talking about bombs. He was saying things like, "Three parts hydrogen, bombs and chemicals". When **(b)(5)(B)** heard this she was half asleep, but she believed he was having a flashback episode. She got up and she went and laid down on the couch in the living room.

Michael began yelling for her to get in the bedroom. She stormed in the room and said, "What". Michael responded by saying, "What side are you on". (b)(5)(B) then went into the bathroom and shut the door. He hadn't been physical with her to this point; he was yelling and accusing her of being the enemy. There was the smell of an alcoholic beverage on his breath and she stated that he had been drinking.

She came out of the bathroom and reentered the bedroom. Michael had the mattress pulled back and he had a gun. The gun was a .357 revolver; it was dark with a wooden handle. The gun had a cylinder. Michael has no other weapons in the house. He had two

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guns from a military veteran who passed away.

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guns the revolver and a rifle. (b)(5)(B) thought both of the guns were at (b)(5)(B) residence. When he initially received the weapons he took them out of the house and stored them at residence. The guns had been stored at (b)(5)(B) residence months ago. Michael got the

(b)(5)(B) stated that when she entered the bedroom from the bathroom, Michael was holding the gun. Michael was asking her, "Who's side are you on" and he was pointing the gun at her. The first time he pointed the gun at her, the hammer of the gun was not cocked back. Michael then cocked the hammer of the gun. He was holding the gun in his right hand; he pointed the gun over her right shoulder and fired it. The bullet went right passed her head and it lodged into the door behind her. (b)(5)(B) said the pop sound from the gun was real loud and then there was ringing in her ears. She thought that there was a definite possibility that she was going to be shot. This scared her and she began to cry.

Prior to aiming the gun at her and shooting it over her shoulder, Michael did not make any threats that he was going to kill her. (b)(5)(B) stated that she thought he shot the gun as a scare tactic. She further stated that this was not the first time he has pointed a gun at her. At the time that he shot the gun at her, he was standing two feet from her.

(b)(5)(B) stated that she found it difficult to remember everything that happened prior to leaving the house. She remembered that he guided her to a chair in the living room and he told her to stay put. He was holding the gun and he verbally demanded that she stay. He told her not to move; he went outside between their residence and the main residence, where (b)(5)(B) believed he was checking the perimeter. He then came back inside, he checked to see if she was still there. He again went outside and he was still holding the gun. (b)(5)(B) stated that she then heard the gun go off. She stated that now it was between 0330 hours and 0400 hours. (b)(5)(B) ran outside when she heard the gunshot. She stated that Michael had shot the stationary window of the sliding glass door at the neighbor's residence. The window was a double paned window and now there was glass everywhere.

(b)(5)(B) stated that Michael was definitely having an episode, he could hear what she was saying but he couldn't process it in a logical manner. She further stated that he could hear her but he seemed to have an agenda and she didn't know what his agenda was. The agenda seemed to have changed from moment to moment. He than began talking about killing himself. This way everyone would be rid of the problem. (b)(5)(B) went inside, Michael then shot off another round into a big glass table outside on the back patio.

(b)(5)(B) dog ran out of the residence because the dog was scared. Her dog is a medium sized dog. (b)(5)(B) ran over to the landlord's house to check on their animals.

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Michael believed that she was going over to that house to get to the telephone. Michael followed her over and he ripped the telephone out of the wall. The telephone was the landlord's home phone. As this was going on it was pitch black outside, there were no lights on outside and (b)(5)(B) said that she is familiar with the property. She stated that she was barefoot but she did not step in any glass going over to the landlord's property.

She stated that she checked on the landlords animals. Upon checking on the animals, Michael made her sit in a chair in the landlord's residence. He sat in a chair across from her; he was holding the gun the whole time. She stated that this lasted a long time. During this time, the wind would blow and the glass from the sliding glass door would tinkle down. Michael would hear the glass, he would jump up thinking that someone was coming. He could see car lights from vehicles on Japatul road and he thought that theses lights were police cars. He would then do a perimeter check, waiving the gun, because he thought someone heard the gunshots and called the police. While he did this he was not making any verbal threats.

He came back and he sat in the living for a while; (b)(5)(B) didn't say anything. She stated that she could tell that he was not as manic, his motions were slower, he was slumped as he sat in the chair and he wasn't on guard. (b)(5)(B) then began begged him to leave. She said that she would give him a head start, maybe an hour head start before she called the police. She stated that he never let go of the gun, she thought that remorse may have hit him because something changed his mind. He left the landlord's residence and he went back to their residence.

(b)(5)(B) followed him into their residence and Michael went into their bedroom. She told him that she needed to go and get help. He grabbed a towel and put it around his head, he laid on the bed, he had a blanket up around him and he had the gun under his chin. (b)(5)(B) said that she needed to get help and she left him. She was not sure whether or not if he was going to shoot himself in the face.

She went to another neighbor's residence. The neighbors are (b)(5)(B) The time now was approximately 0730 hours. When she got to the taking her children to school. (b)(5)(B) called 911; (b)(5)(B) then drove (b)(5)(B) up to Japatul road so she could flag down the police. The (b)(5)(B) did not hear the gunshots coming from (b)(5)(B) residence.

(b)(5)(B) stated, in the past, Michael had discussed that he couldn't be incarcerated. He told her that he didn't know if he had it in himself to kill himself. He told her, what she described as "Suicide by cop", would be an option. (b)(5)(B) couldn't remember if he

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used that term on this particular evening. She stated that she heard the suicide by cop term more than once. This term was used during the course of previous episodes.

While up on the road, she awaited the Sheriff's Department's arrival. waited with her. She stated that to this point she doesn't think anyone has been injured. When the Sheriff's department arrived, they had her stay there with them until approximately 1300 hours. She stated that if she needed anything within the time she was with the Sheriff's deputies, they would have provided it for her.

(b)(5)(B) stated that she knows what Sheriff's deputies look like and she is familiar with their uniforms. Responding deputies were in full uniform. She stated that the SWAT team showed up later, they wore hats, and military type camouflage uniforms, their faces were masked up and they had rifles. She stated that there were no questions in her mind that they were SWAT members, she knew who they were.

Initially a detective went to (b)(5)(B) and told her that they were making announcements to Michael, however Michael didn't respond. (b)(5)(B) did not hear those announcements. A few hours later, approximately 1200 hours, (b)(5)(B) said a big vehicle went to the road near her residence. Announcements were made on a PA system. (b)(5)(B) was about one half mile from the vehicle and she clearly heard the announcements. She stated that the vehicle was closer to her residence than they were to where she was on the road. She further stated that if she heard the announcements, Michael heard the announcements. She didn't hear every announcement, but she did hear deputies announce themselves, they asked Michael to turn on a light and make contact with the deputies.

(b)(5)(B) stated that two women from the Crisis Negotiation Team had both her and a friend named (b)(5)(B) make a taped message for Michael. They asked (b)(5)(B) to make the taped message so they could try and have a non violent outcome to the situation. They essentially told her that they wanted Michael to come out on his own with no weapons; they did not want to shoot it out. She was asked to make a tape which was positive; they didn't want her to talk about any negative outcomes. They asked her to let him know that he had a lot to live for and that she both needed and depended on him.

She was unsure if the tapes were ever played.

There was a long wait and than she heard gunshots. She heard approximately five or six gunshots, they were quick. She was then escorted to the Sheriff's Alpine Substation with (b)(5)(B)

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(b)(5)(B) stated that after the gunshots happened, the ambulance went to her residence.

(b)(5)(B) stated that Michael has had contacts with the police in the past. Michael felt like when he was contacted by the police he was in a prisoner of war situation and it was his instinct to fight. Anytime he was arrested he always resisted the police. Michael had a negative experience with the Sheriff's department once. They stopped him in his vehicle while they were looking for a suspect. They thought Michael was the suspect they were looking for; (b)(5)(B) stated that it was a mistaken identity. However, during the stop Michael was shot with a Deputy's Taser.

(b)(5)(B) stated that everyone on scene took great care in learning about Michael's background, they were thorough. She stated that it was everyone's main goal to get Michael out of the residence safely. They did not want to harm him or others. They went as far as calling the VA and (b)(5)(B) of the American Legion. They had a well thought out process and they tried to defuse the situation. She stated that they were remarkable: they went above and beyond her expectations.

19		childhood growing up? Has he ever
20	A	Well, I know
21	Q	shown and his
22	A	his mother
23	Q	behavior prior to
24	A	his mother
25	Q	joining the military?
26	A	has schizo-; has schizophrenia or had schizophrenia. Um, and his brother has bi-polar, uh,
27		disease. I don't know. Uh, I, I believe the other brother's bi-polar as well.
28	Q	Okay.

1	A	So
2	Q	Do you know
3	A	it's a (UNIN).
4	Q	if they're being treated for it?
5	A	Um, the one on-and-off when he; he does have medication. The other one definitely. He's,
6		he's on medication. He's been in-and-out of psych hospitals in San Diego. Um, the sisters
7		seem fine. They don't show any, any type of psychiatric issues. It
8	Q	Okay.
9	A	just seems like the boys have it.
10	Q	Okay, so he has two brothers.
11	A	And they're both bi-polar.
12	Q	Okay. And mom
13	A	One is worse. Mom was schizophrenic.
14	Q	Was schizophrenic so she's no longer alive? I'm taking it?
15	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.
16	Q	Okay. And what about; how many sisters?
17	A	Two.
18	Q	Two sisters. Are they local?
19	A	One. Well, one now. She's in Oceanside. She was in, um, Navy housing in Tierra Santa but
20		she's moved to Oceanside, so.
21	Q	And what's her first and last name?
22	A	(b)(5)(B)
23	Q	Is it (b)(5)(B)
24	A	(b)(5)(B)
25	Q	Oh, (b)(5)(B)
26	A	(b)(5)(B)
27	Q	(b)(5)(B)
28	A	Yeah, (b)(5)(B)

1	Q	And do you know how old she is?
2	A	I'm not sure. Um, probably; let's see. If he's; she's the baby. Sh-; I'm not sure. Maybe
3		(b)(5)(B)
4	Q	Okay. What about his, uh, his brothers?
5	A	Well, actually (b)(5)(B) the baby; she's the baby sister. Um, (b)(5)(B) is probably (b)(5)(B)
6		or (b)(5)(B) Some; or, (b)(5)(B) probably about t (b)(5)(B) and (b)(5)(B) is probably about
7		(PAUSE) (WHISPERING) let's see. I'm not real sure. Um, maybe (D)(5)(B)
8	Q	Are they FOSTERS as well?
9	A	No. They're (b)(5)(B)
10	Q	So, it's (b)(5)(B) ?
11	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.
12	Q	Different dads, same mom?
13	A	Um-hmm.
14	Q	What about the sister? Is she a FOSTER or was she a FOSTER?
15	A	No, she was a, um, a (b)(5)(B) . Now a
16	Q	(b)(5)(B)
17	A	a, uh, married to (b)(5)(B) She was (b)(5)(B) as well. He was, um, yeah, he was the
18		FOSTER and then there's (b)(5)(B) who I've never met or seen or heard. She lives on the
19		East Coast. I don't know anything about her. I'm not even sure if she's a FOSTER or a
20		(b)(5)(B)
21	Q	Okay. And this is Michael's sister as well?
22	A	Yes.
23	Q	Okay. Um, dad's in the picture?
24	A	No. Not since Michael was real small. I mean, I think he saw him once a few years back but
25		it was; I don't know but he's in the military. His name is (b)(5)(B)
26	Q	But he's outta the military?
27	A	I'm not sure if he's still in, um, like Homeland Security type but not like active-military but

1	Q	Working for the Federal Government possibly?
2	A	Yes.
3	Q	Okay. Um, now did he; did, did Michael ever talk about any, any problems psychologically
4		prior to the military? I mean, you said
5	A	No.
6	Q	it runs in his family; the history.
7	A	No.
8	Q	He didn't talk about it?
9	A	No. But both of the brothers, they didn't show signs of it until their early twenties and by
10		that time, Michael was already in the military at that age.
11	Q	Okay. Did
12	A	That's usually when Schizophrenia or anything comes up mostly.
13	Q	Did he ever, did he discuss with you when he started having problems psychologically? Was
14		it after he got in the military or was it while he was in the military?
15	A	After he got out of the military.
16	Q	After he got outta the military?
17	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.
18	Q	Um, when he first got out, and, uh; let me ask you this. When he first got out, you guys
19		were not together? Is that correct?
20	A	Right.
21	Q	Okay so you
22	A	I can't answer any thing
23	Q	so then you met him after he had been out for how long?
24	A	Probably, um, six months to a year.
25	Q	So
26	A	I mean, that's a gray. I'm not real sure.
27	Q	When you, when you met him, did he discuss the problems he was having psychologically or
28		did that come

1	A	Not at first.
2	Q	Not at first.
3	A	It came later.
4	Q	Okay. Did you see anything while you were dating?
5	A	Not really. Not like I've seen while we've been married.
6	Q	Okay.
7	A	It was, it was, um, much more mild.
8	Q	Did he
9	A	It seemed han-, you know, manageable.
10	Q	Okay. Did he discuss with you if he was receiving treatment at that time?
11	A	No, he wasn't.
12	Q	Not at all?
13	A	Um-um.
14	Q	Okay. How did it come about that he started receiving treatment?
15	A	He got progressively worse and, um, and so he, he went to the V-A and, and, he; I mean, he
16		wouldn't really talk to the psych doctors but he talked; I guess he told them enough to let
17		them know what was; you know, that they got an idea what was goin' on so for a long time
18		they've been trying to find the right dose of medicine; the right balance and it was real rocky
19		there for a while. You know, not having the right things but this bit of medicine that he's
20		been on for the past couple years has been working pretty well.
21	Q	Yeah and what year was it that he started getting treatment?
22	A	I, I'm not sure. I really am not; um, he, he; yeah, I think he first started gettin' treatment at
23		Loma Linda so that would be; um, they'd be able to tell you when he started. I'm; I can't
24		remember the years or, or, or, or when it was. I'm sorry.
25	Q	It's okay. All right so you said they were trying to get a balance on his medication to
26		stabilize him.
27	A	Yeah.
28	Q	And you said he was starting to get progressively worse.

Α Well, because... 1 Q (UNIN)... 2 in that... Α 3 Q Let me ask this. From, from the beginning, when you started seeing him progressively 4 getting worse, were you already married then or was it while you were still in the dating 5 phase? 6 7 Α We were already married. Q You were married? Okay and what were the changes you started to see in him? 8 Α Well, I think it was; I mean, he, he was on medication but then because it wasn't the right 9 balance, he would be too tired. You know, it was off like too much medication so in order 10 for him to get things done around the house or whatever, he would stop taking his 11 medication so that he would be awake enough to be able to function and then, you know, 12 instead of only taking a little bit or something and then he would be off of his meds for a 13 few days and then he would have some sort of episode. Um, it, it also doesn't help that he's 14 an alcoholic because that's how he was medicating himself before he got help and he's, he 15 never stopped. 16 Q And, uh, how long did it take him to get on the medication that he's on now where you start 17 seeing some; I'm, I'm guessing that he; who was it; is it fair to say that he was startin' to 18 show some improvement? 19 Yes. Α 20 Q Okay. 21 Α I mean, he, he was going much longer, uh, without any incidents or episodes or... 22 Q Uh-huh. 23 Α you know, so, um; when was that? That, that was (PAUSE) probably about three years 24 25 ago... Q When? 26 Α where he was get-; you know, 'cause they were few and far in between. 27

Okay. So between three years ago up until this point, has he started to recently; starting to

2	A	Well, I; or he's found that drinking hard alcohol as opposed to just beer makes it worse.
3		Last week he was drinking hard alcohol. He was in the public. It's, you know, I've; I don't
4		mind so much if he drinks beer at home but when he goes out, that's when he's not under
5		(GIGGLING) supervision.
6	Q	Sure.
7	A	You know.
8	Q	Sure.
9	A	Um, and I; he had a, a black-out episode. He doesn't remember anything but he was trying
10		to pull people out of a car. He ended up punching someone in the face at a local bar.
11	Q	Are we talk-; are we talking about on the tenth; October tenth
12	A	Yes.
13	Q	when he got arrested
14	A	Yes.
15	Q	at the Casino Inn
16	A	Right.
17	Q	(UNIN)?
18	A	Yes.
19	Q	Okay.
20	A	Um, that came outta nowhere. I mean, he was doing great and for a long time.
21	Q	Now, why don't we stop there for a second? Prior to ten-ten, was he startin' to have some
22		problems or he was
23	A	No.
24	Q	good up until that point?
25	A	I was completely blind sight. Usually I can sense or at least and not that surprised if
26		something happens because I've seen changes.
27	Q	Sure.
28	A	But I didn't see any changes this time. None at all.

- And prior to that, had he been drinking beer at the house? Not, no, no, in the (UNIN)...
- 2 | A It's no; yes, no, he drinks beer regularly.
- 3 || Q But the beer you saw him with?
- 4 | A Yeah.
- 5 | Q Doesn't really...
- 6 A The beer is fine.
- 7 | Q give him problems. Okay.
- 8 A It's once he changes to; I mean, he needs to not drink at all with the meds he's on...
- 9 Q That's...
- obviously but he was able to; I mean, his baseline was a few beers at night. No big deal.
- 11 || Q Okay.
- 12 | A No issues. After that arrest, he's been in a spiral...
- 13 || Q Okay.
- 14 A from there. Um...
- Let, let's go back to that arrest for a second.
- 16 | A Okay.
- The night that he went out, had he been drinking in the house prior to leaving?
- 18 | A No.
- 19 Q Okay. Let me ask you this. Does he have a driver's license?
- 20 | A No.
- 21 | Q Okay. Does he drive?
- 22 | A Yes.
- 23 || Q Okay. Um, did he drive that night?
- 24 A (PAUSE) Um (PAUSE) yes.
- 25 | Q Okay. He's not gonna get in trouble for driving...

2	A	Okay.
3	Q	I just wanna and I'm just trying to get a picture as to what

6	A	His, his license was suspended due to child, um, child, uh, support issues.
7	Q	Okay.
8	A	So, that's; I mean, it's, it's in the courts so it's; that's, I mean, he has a valid license. It wasn't
9		revoked or anything for any
10	Q	It's (UNIN)
11	A	driving type of situation.
12	Q	Right.
13	A	Right.
14	Q	You don't pay child support, they'll take your
15	A	Right.
16	Q	license.
17	A	And it got suspended.
18	Q	Okay. So that night on the tenth, um, did he plan on going to the Casino Inn or he just go
19		to the Casino Inn or just
20	A	Yeah.
21	Q	did he go somewhere else prior?
22	A	He's not even sure how he ended up there. I mean, I talked to him at five-thirty in the
23		evening. He's like "Okay, honey, I'm leavin' here in three minutes." He was at the, the Post

27	Q	Okay and where were you when he called?
28	A	At home.

3	Q	Had he been drinking up there, do you know?
4	A	He, he just sounded totally sober. I think maybe he had one. I mean, with; not for; I mean,
5		he was sober for him completely. He's like "I'm on my way home. I'm stopping at the
6		store." And he gave; he rattled off the list of what he was gettin' and he's like "I'll see you in
7		a little while."
8	Q	'Kay.
9	A	And he never came home. So, um.
10	Q	Now when was; then; let me ask you this. He didn't come home and when was the next
11		time you heard from him?
12	A	The next time I heard from him was Monday. I didn't actually hear from him. I, um, well,
13		the; immediately in the morning. Well, I ended up; I thought he was just out with his friends
14		so I just went to bed and, um, 'cause he has come home late at night.
15	Q	So the tenth is Sunday?
16	A	When; right.
17	Q	Okay.
18	A	So that morning my first call was the jail. The next would've been the hospitals and he was
19		in jail.
20	Q	He was locked up?
21	A	Yeah.
22	Q	And what'd he get arrested for?
23	A	Uh, assault on a peace officer, assault on a person, and disorderly contact; duct; drunk in
24		public
25	Q	Okay.
26	A	were the three charges.
27	Q	Okay. Did you talk to anybody about what happened? Did you talk to any, any of the
28	A	After

1	Q	deputies or did
2	A	No, no, none of any deputies. I've heard lots of rumors from Alpine citizens
3		(LAUGHING).
4	Q	What's your understanding of what happened?
5	A	Um, that he was, um, screaming about the car being on fire. He was trying to pull complete
6		strangers outta their car and, of course, they didn't know what the hell was going. I mean, I;
7		the girl maced him and (LAUGHING). Um
8	Q	Was she from the bar?
9	A	I gu-; I'd; a, a
10	Q	Employee?

28	A	He hadn't been booked. He didn't get bailed out until Monday

14		jail before so being outside if he was if he was of sound mind, he would've known where he
15		was. He was calling on the phone s-; you know, crying which; that is not what he does.
16	Q	Okay.
17	A	I don't know where I am. I don't have these shoes. I'm, I'm scared. So, I mean, I'm trying
18		to race there as soon; as fast I can and, and he was; I mean, he was a complete mess.
19	Q	Okay. Was this; was he disheveled. Like, was his clothes a mess?
20	A	Oh, yeah, well, from; 'cause the clothes that he obviously had; the huge altercation in the bar
21		parking lot. He was; he had no shoes. He was; he, he was
22	Q	Did he
23	A	limping.
24	Q	did he smell like alcohol?
25	A	He smelt horrible but I don't know if it was necessarily alcohol or it was from three days. I
26		don't know.
27	Q	Let me ask you this. Has he ever used any other drugs other than alcohol?
28	A	Not to, to my knowledge. No.

1	Q	Okay. So no meth use. No heroin use. Nothing like that?
2	A	No.
3	Q	Okay. Did he ever?
4	A	Alcohol's bad enough.
5	Q	So you got home on Monday and
6	A	I wanted to put him right into the hospital then.
7	Q	Did? Well, let me ask you. Did he take his medication on Monday?
8	A	Yes.

10	A	In front of me that time.
11	Q	Okay and after he took it?

3	A	And so each person has a packet. Well, he's a gotta a few unfinished packets and so he

5		to go with him to walk himself into the V-A La Jolla; into the psych ward but he didn't
6		wanna do it until he finished everybody's packets so that they wouldn't have to be hindered
7		by his mistakes and I went for it. I should've just put him in the hospital right away but
8		hindsight is twenty-twenty so.
9	Q	You're trying to help.
10	A	So, um, yeah, it was planned for Monday that we were gonna go to the V-A.
11	Q	Okay. But we're on Wednesday still.
12	A	Yeah.
13	Q	I just wanna walk you through the days up until tonight.
14	A	Okay.
15	Q	So just
16	A	No problem. So in this time he's actually, he's doing great. He's, he's going to the, you
17		know, he's not drinking at the Legion. He's doing the packets. He's, you know; 'cause I
18		told him. I'm like "You cannot drink. Zero tolerance. You; not even one."

20	A	And, uh, so he's, he's finishing up business. He's comin' home; you know, he's at home.
21		He's (PAUSE) he's on his best behavior at this point.

18		was coming up with everything and I'm, you know, I'm like "We can't. Where are we gonna
19		go?" and we, you know, we have to face the music. You have to face the music and what
20		you've done.

Don't ever talk 2 to us again. we're leaving." Like she was completely; because I, I assume... 3 (UNIN) it up (UNIN). Q 4 Α Right. Exactly. 5 Q Okay. 6 Α And that gave him a blow. Um, and, uh, you know, my landlord; our friends said, you know 22 "I'm sure that'll blow over. We don't" you know "We don't feel that way" you know type of 23 thing. Um, or (b)(5)(B) get over it. What have you. But, um, so then that was Sunday. 24 Today, you know, so over this next day he's still commenting on it. And, uh, and not talk to, 25 you know, and he was like "Well, I'm gonna get all my stuff from over there." And I'm like 26 "Well, you're not gonna go over there by yourself." You know, so as far as I know, he 27

didn't go over there. Um, I think...

25		Um, but he was talking about bombs; the three parts; hydrogen, for; I; you know, I don't
26		know exactly what he was saying but he was

28	A	saying things about chemicals or something which I don't even know. I don't know if that

was actually real things. You know, I mean, he was just talking about bombs and, and... 1 Q Is this a flashback episode? 2 Α I don't. 3 Or was he was just talking? Q 4 A I don't know. I; he's; and I'm half asleep when I wake up to this and he's; I'm, I'm thinking 5 it's a flashback episode because when I got up, you know, I started to yell at him because he 6 had woken me up and, uh, and I went; 'cause he was looking for something on the dresser 7 or he's ra-, rounging around so I went and laid on the couch. And, uh, then he yelled for me 8 to come in there and he just kept yelling for me to come in there so I was like; I had stormed 9 in there and I'm like "What!" and he started asking what side I was on. And that's when I 10 went into the bathroom and I shut the door. And... 11 And what do you mean by that? Q 12 What side I was? 13 Α He just said "What side are you on?" Q 14 "Whose side are you on?" That's what he said. Α 15 Q Okay. 16 What side are you on? Who's side? I'm not sure. Α 17 Q Has he; was he? Now... 18 Α He's done that before. 19 Q Is he physical with you at this point or is he just... 20 No... 21 talking? Q 22 Α he's just yelling. 23 Q Yelling. 24 He's yelling like accusing me. Α 25 Q Any al-.... 26 Α Like being an enemy kinda thing. You know, like, like I betrayed him too. 27 Q Okay. 28

5	Q	What happened after the, that gun went off? What did you do?
6	A	(SNIFFLE) I
7	Q	Were you scared?
8	A	started to cry.
9	Q	Were you scared?
10	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.
11	Q	Okay. Were you in fear for your life at that time?
12	A	(PAUSE) Can I go on record? I don't want to in any way press charges against my husband.
13	Q	I understand that.
14	A	Okay, so and even, I mean, I, I do not want to press; I; he's got enough charges with what
15		he's done
16	Q	I totally understand.
17	A	is, uh.
18	Q	We just have; we have to; when we; when we're interviewing you we just have to get an idea
19		of what happened.
20	A	I understand but anything I say on tape I don't want you to decide later well, if you don't
21		want to press charges, the City will or the State will press charges and that's; I don't want

2	Q	I know I'd fear for my life if someone shot a gun at me. So. Is this the first time he's ever
3		pointed a gun at you?
4	A	No.
5	Q	Okay.
6	A	And that's why I didn't want to (UNIN).
7	Q	Did he say anything prior to shooting the gun at you?
8	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.
9	Q	Say "I'm gonna kill you" "What side are you on?"
10	A	No.
11	Q	Or he just
12	A	He didn't
13	Q	"What side
14	A	he didn't
15	Q	are you on?"
16	A	threaten to kill me.
17	Q	Okay.
18	A	And at that point I don't think (PAUSE) he had any; I think it was a scare tactic at; if
19		anything at that point.
20	Q	And how far is he from you when this happens? Where; see this is my
21	A	Probably
22	Q	thinking
23	A	about two feet from me.
24	Q	The, the barrel of the guns is about two feet from you?
25	A	And this is about as far as it.
26	Q	Okay. So he shot at you but he was trying to scare you; maybe shooting it like above right
27		or left shoulder?
28	A	Right here.

7		everybody got there, I'm finding it difficult to piece together exactly what happened before I
8		got outta the house.

10	A	I mean and (PAUSE) he told me to; he guided me to a chair in the living room and told me
11		to stay put.
12	Q	Did he say "Go over there and sit down and stay
13	A	Yeah.
14	Q	put" or he grabbed you and physically moved you over there?
15	A	No, he just; he had the gun in his hand and demanded verbally. He didn't
16	Q	Okay.
17	A	he never physically
18	Q	Okay so you gotta listen.
19	A	And, um, uh, he did; he told me not to move and he went outside. He was gone for a
20		couple minutes.
21	Q	At the front, the back?
22	A	The, the door in between the two houses.
23	Q	And is it a slider or is it a regular door?
24	A	Regular door.
25	Q	Okay.
26	A	Um, I really don't remember how (PAUSE) he came back and then
27	Q	Do you know what he did outside?
28	A	I think he was just checking the perimeter but that's

1	Q	Okay.
2	A	speculation.
3	Q	Okay.
4	A	He came back in to check to see if I was see in the chair. He still had the gun and he went
5		back outside; the same door.
6	Q	'Kay.
7	A	I heard the gun go off.
8	Q	'Kay and is it still within like the three o'clock, three-thirty timeframe
9	A	It's
10	Q	or is it
11	A	Yeah, maybe
12	Q	maybe later?
13	A	Maybe four.
14	Q	Or is it
15	A	At; somewhere in between three-thirty and four 'cause we yelled out for a little bit before I
16		slammed the bathroom door and the gun came out so. Um, when I heard the gun shot and
17		I; that he obviously hit something. It wasn't just into the canyon.
18	Q	'Cause he went outside and now he shot the gun again?
19	A	Yes.
20	Q	'Kay.
21	A	I ran outside to see what he had shot and he had shot the glass. Well, I mean, it's a glass
22		door but it's the wall part of the door. Not that part that moves.
23	Q	Okay.
24	A	You know, it's like a glass door but
25	Q	I understand.
26	A	the stationary part.
27	Q	The stationary part of the slider.
28	A	Right. Exactly. Double pane glass. Glass everywhere. Now I'm freaking out because he's

1		now shot our landlord's house.
2	Q	Okay.
3	A	You know, it's one thing I can, you know, try to talk him down and wait till he crashes
4	Q	Um-hmm.
5	A	when he's that manic and then I can take him to the hospital the next day but, you know, if
6		he doesn't do any damage but this; it's; it'll; you can't go back now.
7	Q	Let me ask you this. During this time are you thinking to yourself "He's having an episode"
8		or is he?
9	A	Yes. Absolutely.
10	Q	Can you talk to him? Is he coherent?
11	A	He's hearing me but he's not processing what he's hearing in, in a logical manner.
12	Q	He's inside of his body?
13	A	Yeah. He, he's
14	Q	Like a
15	A	hearing me but he's got an agenda going on and here that I have no idea and it, and it
16		changes from moment to moment. Um.
17	Q	Is he yelling anything at this point?
18	A	That's the thing I'm trying to remember the things he was yelling. At this point, he was
19		talking about how he should just kill himself and, um, and everybody would just be rid of the
20		problem and, and, h-; you know, and then (SIGH) God (PAUSE) I'm not even sure. I went
21		back in the house and he shot off another round into the patio table. It was a big glass table
22		on the, on the back patio.
23	Q	Okay.
24	A	I'm not even sure what happened in between there. I really am not.
25	Q	Okay.
26	A	I can't; um.
27	Q	You're doing fine.
28	A	(SIGH). At this point, my dog's taken off 'cause she's scared to death. I run over to the

1		other; 'cause I'm now taking; my neighbors are outta town. They had just left that day.
2	Q	These are the (b)(5)(B)
3	A	Yes.
4	Q	Okay. Let me ask this real quick. Did the (b)(5)(B) have any children in the house?
5	A	No.
6	Q	Is there any children in your home?
7	A	No.
8	Q	It's just you and your husband and your dog?
9	A	Yes.
10	Q	What kind?
11	A	Um, half, uh, poodle; half, uh, (UNIN).
12	Q	A small dog?

14	Q	So the dog took off outta the house?

7		guard. And I told him; I'm like "What are we gonna do?" I, I, you know, I even begged
8		him. You know, 'cause he's still has the gun. I begged him. I'm like "Go. Uh, get a head
9		start. I won't call the police for an hour." Something. I just wanted to
10	Q	It's preservation of life at this point. I understand.
11	A	(CRYING) So, I think either remorse hit him. I'm not sure what changed his mind. He

14	A	Yeah.

22	A	No, the one in between. I didn't wanna go there. I didn't know how
23	Q	I gotcha.
24	A	they felt. My God.
25	Q	Do you know their
26	A	The other neighbors.
27	Q	Do you know?
28	A	(b)(5)(B) I (SNIFFLING) Hold on. It's H (PAUSE) (SIGH).

1		and (UNIN). Once again. (b)(5)(B)
2	Q	(b)(5)(B)
3	A	(b)(5)(B)
4	Q	It's os you said?
5	A	(b)(5)(B) yes.
6	Q	Is (D)(5)(B) married?
7	A	Uh, yes.
8	Q	What's was the phone number in there?
9	A	Oh, uh, um, I only have it here 'cause I wrote it down on my num-; phone dis. (b)(5)(B)
10		(b)(5)(B)
11	Q	Um-hmm.
12	A	(b)(5)(B)
13	Q	And, I'm sorry. You said he's married.

3	A	So southwest.
4	Q	Southwest of your house. Okay. All right so you went over there to call nine-one-one?
5	A	Yes. I mean I, I grabbed a cell phone as I ran out of the house.
6	Q	Your cell phone?
7	A	Yes.
8	Q	Okay.
9	A	But I didn't wanna call from just outside our house. I wanted to get as far away
10	Q	Sure.
11	A	as I could so I called. I; and I also wanted to; someone else besides. I needed to see
12		someone else so I ran to their house.

14	A	I (CRYING) just feel like I abandoned him. I (CRYING).

16	A	I couldn't talk him down from (CRYING – UNIN). I love my husband. He's a; he's a
17		wonderful man. He just needs psychiatric help. He needs to be in a locked psychiatric ward
18		where he can get some; the medications and the group therapy and the alcohol abuse

20	Q	Running to get help's not abandoning him. It's helping him. You guys are out there. I
21		mean, no one's hearing
22	A	It's

27		it's such a rural place, I, I had or drive me up to the road; Japatul Road where our

2		just walk in?
3	A	Well as I was coming this way, (b)(5)(B) was taking her kids to the bus stop.
4	Q	Okay.

6	Q	Was it light out now?
7	A	Yes, it's about
8	Q	This was going on
9	A	seven-thirty.
10	Q	like
11	A	Yeah.
12	Q	This was going on for a few hours? So you're; we're talking through it fast but

14	Q	it's a few hours into this?
15	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.
16	Q	Okay.

19	A	Yeah, and, and I said; and I didn't wanna say anything in front of the kids and she said
20		"Well, (b)(5)(B) down at the house" you know "I'll be right back once the kids are on the bus."
21		So I, I went onto the house and was asleep so I mean, the door was open like this much
22		and I was yelling in there and I kinda stepped. I'm like [DISTB] I'm in your house"
23		(LAUGHING) you know and he came out and then he stood there while I called nine-one-

25	Q	Did they hear anything, did they say?
26	A	No.
27	Q	(UNIN).
28	A	That's why I was worried because when the detectives asked me h-; once I left the house had

1		I heard a gunshot and I, I said "No." You know, he didn't hear the six that had gone off
2		and so
3	Q	Yes.
4	A	I didn't know if he was laying in there.
5	Q	Gotcha. Let me ask this. In the whole time; in those few hours before you went to (b)(5)(B)
6		house did he make any threats about killing any police officers?
7	A	No.
8	Q	Killing himself? Saying that he wanted the cops to kill him, anything like that?
9	A	(SIGH) He had, uh, he had discussed that in prior times.
10	Q	And not good.
11	A	Not; I, I'm not really sure if he specifically did this time but he, he had discussed the fact that
12		he could not be incarcerated.
13	Q	Okay.
14	A	And that he didn't, he didn't feel that he had in him to kill himself.
15	Q	Okay.
16	A	So his term suicide-by-cop would be his only option.
17	Q	And has he made that; did, did he say more than once?
18	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.
19	Q	Did you hear it once?
20	A	More than once.
21	Q	More than once?
22	A	NO VERBAL RESPONSE.
23	Q	And did he talk about it like matter-of-factly or when he was having an episodes?
24	A	Uh, more; not like adamantly matter-of-factly but more like resigned matter-of-factly. Like
25		he wouldn't have any other choice not "bring 'em on" you know and try.
26	Q	So it wasn't during an episode?
27	A	Right.
28	Q	He was talking to you. He's just discussing it.

1	A	Yeah.
2	Q	Okay. Now did he; was this recently he said this or was it just throughout the course of the
3		months
4	A	Just.
5	Q	years?
6	A	It was throughout the course of, of different times that he had episodes not recently. 'Cause
7		he was doing really well.

On 10-19-10, at approximately 1000 hours, I received an electronic page reference a Code- 11 (SWAT Call) in the area of (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine.

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

Upon arrival I was instructed to deploy to the ¼ corner of the main residence with Deputy Gale #4869. Before leaving the tactical staging area I received a briefing about the suspect. I was told his name was Michael Foster, he weighed approximately 200 pounds, was a white male adult, and I was shown a picture of him. I was told SED was called out because Foster allegedly held a pistol to his wife's head and fired numerous rounds into the residence on 10-18-10. The firearm was suspected to be a .357 caliber weapon. Foster was a combat veteran in the US Army and possibly suffered from PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Syndrome). Foster was known to set up trip wires around his residence, it was unknown if there were explosives set up on the trip wires or not. It was also possible the trip wires were connected to chimes or whistles.

As we arrived to the prescribed location we took up a position approximately 20 yards away from the main residence.

Some time later I heard over the radio the suspect exited the residence on side three (The back side of the residence), I then heard numerous gunshots.

I did not see the suspect at any time.

ORIGIN:

On 10/19/2010, at about 1004 hours, I received a pager activation reference a Code-11 (SWAT Callout) of a barricaded suspect at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine.

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

I responded to the Tactical Staging Area (TSA) and was briefed on the incident. We were advised the suspect, Michael Foster, was a combat veteran. He was in possession of a handgun and had threatened to "...shoot it out with the cops." We were advised he had assaulted his wife and had kept her against her will for many hours. We were also told he had a history of setting trip wires and booby traps around the location.

I was paired up with Deputy Collis (#3306) and we were assigned to a perimeter position on the ½ corner of the location. Deputy Collis and I set up a position behind a large rock and tree on the south side of the garage. There was a white VW Jetta between our position and the garage.

The entry team element arrived on scene in the armored truck. A member of the Crisis Negotiation Team (CNT) began making announcements to Michael Foster inside the residence. Shortly after announcements began, I heard via the radio that someone was seen near the sliding glass door on the front (Side 1) of the residence. I heard the sliding glass door open and then saw something being thrown from the residence. I then heard Foster yell, "Give me back my phone!" Foster went back inside and closed the sliding glass door.

After a few minutes, I heard via the radio that Foster was exiting the rear of the residence. I then heard multiple gunshots from the rear of the residence. I heard via the radio that Foster was lying on his back behind the residence. The entry team began moving toward the residence to secure Foster.

I directed the tactical medics and EMS personnel to the location of Foster. I assisted with getting the ambulance into position for extricating Foster. Deputy Collis and I waited at our position until the order was given to break down and return to the TSA.

REPORT NARRATIVE

Origin:

On 10/19/10, at approximately 0802 hours, Alpine Sheriff's Deputies received a radio call to investigate a report of an assault with a deadly weapon, specifically a firearm. The location of the assault was [5)(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine. (b)(5)(B) reported her husband Michael Foster had fired several rounds and held her against her will. (b)(5)(B) was able to get out of the house and call for help, while Michael remained inside their residence with the firearm. I responded to the scene at about 1045 hours as a part of the Crisis Negotiations Team.

Deputy's Observations and Actions:

Upon arrival to the scene, CNT was briefed on the incident and I was assigned to be Primary Negotiator and Deputy Voth was assigned to be Secondary Negotiator. Our mission was to establish communication with Michael Foster and negotiate a peaceful surrender.

At about 1240 hours, Deputy Voth and I entered the armored SED vehicle and rode with SED deputies down to the front of the residence. At about 1250 hours, the SED armored vehicle was positioned in front of the house about 25-40 yards away. Deputy Voth and I waited for a few minutes to make contact, so SED deputies had time to exit the armored vehicle and move to a perimeter position.

At about 1255 hours, I began making PA announcements from the armored SED vehicle in effort to make contact with Michael. I few moments later, Michael moved the blinds at the sliding glass door. I told Michael I cared about him, was worried about him, and was there to help him. I told Michael I wanted to make sure he was not injured and asked him to move the blinds again to ensure he could hear me. I repeated reassuring statements to Michael and asked him to exit his home through the sliding glass door and to walk on the pathway towards the white Volkswagon Jetta that was parked outside. I repeated these instructions numerous times over the PA and continued to reassure Michael we were there to help him and wanted to make sure he was okay. I told Michael his wife and friend (b)(5)(B) were outside waiting for him. I told Michael how I learned of all the good service he had done for his community and how his family, friends, and community still needed him.

As I made these announcements, Michael yelled something from inside the residence, but I was unable to verify what he said. At about 1304 hours, I heard a single "pop" noise and thought Michael had shot himself. I told Michael I was worried about him and said I had heard the noise. I asked Michael to move the blinds again so I knew he was okay. At about 1308 hours, Michael moved the blinds again indicating he was okay. I continued the same reassuring announcements and continued to ask Michael to exit the sliding glass door. At 1318 hours, Michael moved the blinds again and yelled something, which I could not understand. Michael then opened the sliding glass door, yelled, "I want my phone back!" and then closed the door again. A few minutes later, Michael opened the glass door again and threw something outside. I was unable to recognize what the item was.

At 1323 hours, I heard about 5-10 gunshots coming from Michael's residence. I was unable to determine the actual number of rounds that were fired because the sounds were overlapping each other. SED assembled and entered the residence. Within a few minutes, paramedics arrived at the residence. A short time later, I saw Michael exiting the residence on a gurney. Michael was lying on his side and appeared to have four wounds on his back.

I was released from the scene and concluded my involvement.

ORIGIN:

On 10-19-10, at about 10:01 hours, I was dispatched to a SED callout at (b)(5)(B) Japitul Road in Alpine. I arrived at the tactical staging area near that address at about 1107 hours.

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

Upon arrival, I prepared my equipment for assignment as a sniper. I was briefed on the situation before I left the tactical staging area. I learned that Michael Foster and his wife lived in a granny flat at [b)(5)(B) Japitul Road. Last night, Foster had fired several rounds inside the residence and forced his wife to stay in the residence with him. Foster's wife had escaped this morning and Foster was supposed to be the only person left at the property. Foster had prior military experience and a history of mental illness. Foster had recently been arrested and fought with Deputies during that arrest. Foster had also threatened to shoot at law enforcement. I saw a recent booking photo of Foster.

Deputy West and I took a sniper position on top of a trailer about 40 yards away from the granny flat that Michael Foster lived in. Deputy West and I were on side one of the property. From this position, there were two trees between me and the structure. I had a view of part of the sliding glass door leading into the structure. Part of my view of the door was blocked by the two trees.

Once in position, I kept an eye on the entire area but focused my attention on the sliding glass door. There was reflection from the glass and I had a very limited view inside the residence. I saw no movement inside the granny flat until the SED armored car drove into position on side one of the granny flat and a negotiator began making announcements using the PA loudspeaker on the armored car. Approximately one minute after the announcements started, I saw the interior blinds covering the sliding glass door close. I could hear muffled yelling from the residence several times. I could not make out the words. The negotiator asked Foster to exit the residence through the sliding glass door.

A short time later, Foster opened the sliding glass door just far enough for his head to fit through and yelled, "What kind of truck is that?" Right after yelling this, Foster closed the door and went back inside. The negotiator continued to talk to Foster using the PA but he was unresponsive. A couple of minutes later, Foster opened the sliding glass door just far enough to put his head through and yelled, "Give me back my phone." As soon as Foster yelled this, he closed the door and stayed inside the residence. I recognized Foster as the same person in the picture I had seen when I was briefed.

The blinds were pushed up against the door as if someone leaned something against them. I heard a pop that sounded like a gunshot round going off inside the residence. There was no response from

Foster after this sound. The negotiator continued talking to Foster using the PA and after a couple of minutes, I could see the blinds covering the sliding glass door move. A short time later, Foster opened the sliding glass door and threw something out. I could not see what he threw out. Foster closed the door and went back inside. About a minute later, I heard Deputy Kerr on the radio saying the suspect was on side three. Seconds later, I heard approximately ten gunshots. I could not see what happened on side three from my position.

Deputy Kerr said on the radio that the suspect pointed a gun at Deputies and Deputies fired but had now lost sight of the suspect. Deputy Farr was in a sniper position on side three. Deputy Farr broadcast over the radio that he could see the suspect lying on his back on side three.

The entry team approached the suspect from the armored vehicle and got medics to the suspect to treat him.

ORIGIN:

On 10/19/2010, at about 10:04 hours, I received a pager activation reference a Code-11 (SWAT callout) on a barricaded 245 PC suspect off Japatul Road in the unincorporated community of Alpine.

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

I responded to the Tactical Staging Area (TSA) and was briefed on the incident. I then joined the entry team element and responded to (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road via the S.E.D. Armored Car. I was assigned as the less-lethal operator for suspect take-down.

I remained behind the cover of the S.E.D. Armored Car while the Crisis Negotiations Team was attempting to make contact with Michael Foster via P.A. system. At one point, I could hear muffled yelling coming from inside the residence. I then heard Foster yell that he wanted a phone. As arrangements were being made for a portable phone to be delivered to Foster via a robot, I heard an advisement via radio that Foster was coming out a back door ("side 3") of the residence. Within seconds of hearing that radio transmission, I could hear what sounded like a single gunshot coming from the back side of the residence. Almost immediately following, I could hear the report of several rifle rounds being fired. I remained behind the cover of the S.E.D. Armored Car during the gunfire and was unable to see anything.

Shortly after the gunfire stopped, I heard via radio that Foster was lying on his back on the back patio area of the residence. I moved with the entry team up to Foster. When I rounded the corner to where Foster was laying on his back, other deputies of the entry team were contacting him. Foster was looking up and said that he felt like he was going to throw up. I saw that Foster was bleeding from wounds on his back. I noticed that on the ground, next to Foster, was a revolver. I could not tell the make, model, or caliber of the revolver and I did not touch it.

I stepped around Foster and made entry into both Foster's residence and to the main residence adjacent to his residence. Once ensuring that there were no other persons in either residence, I returned to the patio where Foster was laying. At this point, paramedics were treating Foster's injuries. I returned to the S.E.D. Armored Car and awaited further instructions.

ORIGIN:

On 10-19-10, at about 0920 hours, I was notified by Sgt. Browning of a developing incident at Japatul Valley Rd. in Alpine. Sgt. Browning advised me that patrol deputies on scene had requested the assistance of the Sheriff's Crisis Negotiations Team and asked me to respond to the location to assist.

INVESTIGATION:

I arrived on scene at about 0945 hours and met with Sgt. Browning at the intersection of Japatul Valley Road and the dirt road leading to the residence in question. Sgt. Browning introduced me to (b)(5)(B) who was the wife of Michael Foster. (b)(5)(B) reported that Michael was inside their residence and was armed with a revolver. (b)(5)(B) advised me that Michael was feeling suicidal and that she felt he was going to commit suicide, if he had not already done so. (b)(5)(B) stated that she had called 911 because Michael had pointed a gun at her and had fired the gun several times during the night. (b)(5)(B) additionally advised me that Michael was suffering from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) due to having served in the Army in the Iraq war. (b)(5)(B) also told me Michael had told her he planned on having a "shoot out" with the police (Suicide by Cop).

After speaking briefly with (b)(5)(B) I met with Sgt. Bavencoff (2227). I assumed the role of CNT Commander and she assumed the role of Team Leader. My primary function was to be the CNT representative at the Command Post and interface with the SED and Alpine Incident Commander (now Lt. R. Haley).

Because there was no telephone in the home, I requested SED deliver the CNT throw phone to establish communications with Michael (approved by Haley). While this plan was being formulated, CNT personnel were deployed with SED in the armored vehicle and were attempting to contact Michael by loudspeaker.

At the Command Post we were told Michael was yelling out the home's windows and moving about the home's interior. Shortly after CNT began the loudspeaker announcements, Michael exited the rear door of the home and was shot by SED personnel.

All CNT personnel were debriefed at the scene and prepared written reports. I remained at the scene and participated in the Homicide Briefing, providing the CNT actions.

I left the scene at approx. 1630 hrs.

ORIGIN:

On 10-19-10, at approximately 1005 hours, I received a pager call out from SED of a barricaded suspect at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine.

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

I responded to the tactical staging area near the location and was briefed on the incident. I also received information of the suspect (Michael Foster(b)(5)(B) along with his criminal history and background. I then responded to (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in the armored car with the entry team element.

The armored car and entry team was posted near the garage and "granny flat" side of the main residence. I remained behind the armored car with the entry team while the Crisis Negotiations Team (CNT) attempted to call Foster out. I could hear the suspect yelling out of the window asking for something. I also heard on the radio later on that the suspect had thrown something out of the window.

There were reports of the suspect moving around the windows and opening and closing doors. Finally I heard on the radio that the suspect was coming out of the residence on side 3. Within seconds I heard several shots fired from the direction of side 3. I did not see anything from where I was at. Shortly afterward, I heard on the radio that the suspect was on the ground in the back patio of the residence. The suspect was calling for help and moving his arms around.

A decision was made to move up to where the suspect was at. I moved up with the entry team toward where the suspect was last seen. On side 3 where the back patio was at, I could see the suspect on the ground bleeding and a black revolver lying nearby on the ground. The suspect fit the description of Michael Foster. The suspect did not have a shirt on and I could see a couple of holes on his body.

I assisted the entry team with clearing the remaining structures on the property. As I was coming out, I could see medical personnel were treating the suspect on the ground. I returned to the armored car and had no further contact with the suspect.

Origin:

On 10-19-10, at about 1000 hours, I received a SWAT callout and requested to respond to the 19000 block of Japatul Road in Alpine, located in San Diego County.

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

Once I arrived at the Tactical Staging Area I was informed that the suspect, Michael Foster, had held his wife against her will with the use of a hand gun, which he had fired several shots inside and outside of the residence. Information from the wife indicated that some of the shots Foster had fired inside the residence narrowly missed her. I was advised that Foster had possible set up trip wires around his property. Foster was taking medication for Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and wanted to have a "Shoot out with the police." Foster was last seen in the granny flat by the wife. The granny flat is inline with the main residence and located on the south side.

I as well as Deputy Jason Phillips were assigned to the 2/3 corner of the granny flat. Once in position we were approximately 30 yards away at about a 45 degree angle. From my position I was unable to see the granny flat as it was blocked by dense vegetation that was close to the granny flat.

The SED armored vehicle pulled up to the front of the granny flat. From my position I could hear Deputy Leavitt from Crisis Negotiations Unit talking over the loud speaker asking Foster to come out. I did hear Foster yell something but unknown what. While Deputy Leavitt continued to try to get Foster to talk I could hear noises like something heavy was being placed up against something inside the granny flat.

Over the radio I heard "Suspect coming out on side 3." I heard voices coming from the perimeter deputies and Foster and then heard 5 to 8 shots fired. From my view I was unable to see the suspect. I heard Foster crying and saying "I'm Sorry." The entry team contacted Foster and secured the area.

INVESTIGATION:

On 10/19/2010 at about 0825 hours, I heard a call dispatched over the Sheriff's radio of an assault with a deadly weapon on [b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine. Being the detective assigned to that area, I decided to respond to the scene in order to assist the patrol deputies.

I arrived at the location at about 0854 hours. I saw Deputy Barnes speaking to a woman, later identified as (b)(5)(B) I spoke with (b)(5)(B) and she told me the following:

Victim Statement: (b)(5)(B)

(b)(5)(B) told me her husband, Michael Foster, was suffering from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. He was a veteran of Desert Storm and served in Bosnia. He was a medic and was having problems. On several occasions in the recent past, Michael has woken her up yelling at her asking her who she was and to identify herself. She knew he was suffering from flashbacks. She has always been able to "talk him down" and get him to "come back." He had agreed to go get mental health treatment next Monday (10/25) after he completed his case files for other veterans he was helping.

Michael is on medication but sometimes he does not take it. She does not like to "hound" him about it because he becomes angry stating he is not a child and should not be treated like one. (b)(5)(B) said Michael took his medication the evening before.

At about 0300 hours, **(b)(5)(B)** awoke to Michael grabbing her hair yelling at her and asking her who she was, to identify herself and what side she was on. Michael was in possession of a large hand gun, a revolver type. She knew he had inherited two firearms recently, a revolver and a rifle. **(b)(5)(B)** had taken the guns away from Michael and given them to a neighbor to hold. She did not know Michael had the revolver until this morning. **(b)(5)(B)** called the neighbor who confirmed that Michael got the gun about a month prior. The neighbor would not give him the rifle.

After being awoken, (b)(5)(B) tried to "talk him down" but he was extremely agitated. (b)(5)(B) said he fired a shot through a bedroom door, through the sliding glass door, a glass table top on the patio as well as fired several shots into the canyon our behind the house. I asked (b)(5)(B) if Michael had tried to shoot her. (b)(5)(B) began to cry and nodded her head.

(b)(5)(B) told me she opened her eyes to Michael pointing the hand gun right at her head with the barrel pressed up to her forehead. He asked her what side she was on. She tried to calm him and stated she was, of course, on his side. Michael pointed the gun slightly off and fired one shot. The bullet "whizzed" by her head.

After a while Michael lay down on the bed and put a towel over his face. He had the gun in his hand. He would raise it to his chin and then back down. He told her to run and call the police so "they could take care of it." (b)(5)(B) ran out of the house trying to call 9-1-1. She was unable to get reception, so she went to a neighbor's house to call the police.

Sgt. Browning responded and advised Sgt. Moore from the Hostage Negotiation Team was responding as was a Special Enforcement Detail scout team, to assess the situation. Once a course of action was determined I was assigned to be the scribe for the incident.

Origin:

On October 19th, 2010, I was assigned to the Santee Detective Unit and was working as an area investigator.

At approximately 1325 hours, there was an officer involved shooting in the town of Alpine located in the county of San Diego. The shooting occurred at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road, also in the town of Alpine.

At approximately 1345 hours, the Alpine Sheriff's Station requested assistance form the Santee Sheriff Station's area investigators. Detectives Murtaugh, Brambila, Thygesen and I responded to the command post which was located near where the shooting occurred.

Observations and actions:

Upon our arrival at about 1450 hours, the four of us checked in at the command post and were given an assignment. Our assignment was to relieve the Special Enforcement Detail (SED) Deputies who were still on scene and were providing crime scene security.

We contacted SED Sergeant Butterfield who was approximately half way down a long driveway which led to the crime scene (residence located at [b)(5)(B) Japatul Road). We walked with Sergeant Butterfield to the residence.

As we approached the residence he pointed out vehicle tire tracks in the mud at the base of the driveway. Sergeant Butterfield told us this is where the SED vehicles were parked when the shooting occurred. The vehicles were no longer in place.

Sergeant Butterfield also pointed out several spent cartridges which were lying on the cement patio. This patio was on the east side of the house (number one side). Sergeant Butterfield was unsure if they were related to this day's event.

Sergeant Butterfield led us to the rear of the residence which faced to the west. Deputy Lozoya (2190) was currently positioned on the rear deck providing security for the crime scene. Sergeant Butterfield pointed out where the suspect was lying when they contacted him, the position of the gun which had not been moved and the location where two of the SED Deputies were when the fired their weapons. The deputy locations were to the northwest of the house and marked with pieces of tape.

I maintained security around the residence until the Homicide unit arrived along with the crime scene investigators. No one other than the four Deputies assigned to relieve SED ever entered the crime scene. Nor did anything ever get moved.

Once the crime scene investigators arrived I assisted them in processing the crime scene. It rained throughout the day and during the processing of the crime scene. Therefore, I assisted by providing shelter from the rain. At approximately 2300 hours I was no longer needed and left the crime scene.

ORIGIN:

On 10-19-10, at about 1006 hours, members of the San Diego County Sheriff's Special Enforcement Detail responded to a barricaded subject at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in the Alpine area of San Diego County (CAD# S).

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

On 10-19-10, at about 1006 hours, members of the Special Enforcement Detail were requested to respond to the area of (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in the Alpine area of San Diego County in response to a barricaded subject.

All the below referenced times are approximate. Please refer to the tactical staging area scribe log for exact times.

I arrived at the tactical staging area (TSA) located near the 12 mile marker of Japatul Road. I was provided an overview of the target address and a briefing regarding the subject who had barricaded himself within the residence. I was told his name was Michael Foster, he weighed approximately 200 pounds, a white male adult, with a full beard, and I was shown a picture of him. I was told SED was called out because Foster allegedly held a pistol to his wife's head and fired numerous rounds into the residence on 10-18-10. The firearm was reported to be a .357 caliber pistol. Foster was a combat veteran in the US Army and possibly suffered from mental illness. Foster also had been known to set up trip wires around his residence, it was unknown if there were explosives attached to any trip wires.

Deputy Olin (#5523) and I were assigned a perimeter position on the 2/3 corner of the target address. Deputy Olin and I along with other perimeter and sniper teams deployed to our positions around the target property. Deputy Olin and I were positioned behind a small rock pile on the 2/3 corner at a 45 degree angle from the property at a distance of about 35 yards.

A short time later contact was made with the subject inside the residence. Sniper positions on the front side of the house observed a shirtless male subject matching the description of the suspect covered in the pre-deployment briefing. After initial contact with the subject by CNT, he began displaying non-compliant behavior. The suspect could be heard screaming and moving unknown items around within the structure. The suspect reportedly threw an unknown item out of the front door and began screaming unintelligibly about a phone. A short time later I heard a loud "thud" type sound

from within the residence. I believed the sound to be a muffled gunshot and other perimeter positions reported the same to the TSA.

Other perimeter positions reported via both the radio and by shouting that the subject had exited the residence and was on side 3 of the structure. I immediately accessed and chambered my beanbag shotgun while Deputy Olin provided lethal cover. I expected the suspect to challenge our position or attempt to break the perimeter. As I shouldered my beanbag shotgun I heard a loud barrage of gunfire from immediately in front of my position. I dropped my beanbag shotgun and scanned the brush in front of my position with my M4 carbine where I had heard the gunfire. The gunfire seemed to be coming from area in front of the side 3 breezeway of the residence between the tall trees and the patio umbrella beneath the white lattice.

The gunfire was unique because I heard two distinctly different sounding gunshots. The first shots I heard were much louder than the following shots. I assumed the first shots were of a different caliber and were much closer to me than the following shots. The second group of shots I recognized as M4 rifle fire at more distance from me. Both series of gunshots were rapid and continuous. I estimated a total of six to eight gunshots.

After the gunfire ceased, Deputy Kerr (#2623) reported that he and his partner (Deputy Gavin #2649) had engaged the suspect from the 3/4 corner when he pointed a handgun at perimeter positions.

Deputy Farr (#2618) was positioned as a sniper on Japatul Road with a view of side 3 of the residence. Deputy Farr reported via the radio that the suspect was lying prone on the 3 side of the residence with nothing in his hands. I clearly heard the suspect moaning, screaming, laughing, speaking unintelligibly, and asking for medical attention. I never observed the subject during the entire incident.

After the entry team took the subject into custody, I eventually returned to the TSA to download my gear and debrief the incident.

Moore advised me that patrol deputies on scene had requested the assistance of the Sheriff's Crisis Negotiations Team (CNT) and asked me to respond to the location to assist.

INVESTIGATION:

l arrived on scene at about 1040 hours and met with Sgt. Moore and Sgt Bavencoff #2227 at the intersection of Japatul Valley Road and the dirt road leading to the residence in question. Once additional members of CNT arrived on scene, Sgt Bavencoff and Moore briefed us of the situation and gave assignments to each of the team members. It was reported that Michael Foster was barricaded and armed inside the residence. Foster was wanted for attempted murder on his wife, CNT had been tasked with making contact with Foster and negotiating his peaceful surrender.

I was assigned to assist in the CNT van with the deployment of the "throw phone" and assist the lead negotiators in any way. I rode in the CNT van with other CNT members to a closer position to the residence and began the process of deploying the throw phone with the assistance of the Sheriff's Special Enforcement Detail (SED). While waiting in the CNT van for the completed deployment of the throw phone, I heard several gunshots from the area of the residence and was later advised that Foster had been shot in an exchange of gunfire with SED deputies.

A short time after hearing the gunshots, I began collecting the throw phone and securing the van for the ride back to the command post. I retrieved the throw phone from SED near Foster's residence and walked it back to where the CNT van was parked. Once the van was secured we returned to the command post. Upon arriving at the command post, we de-briefed momentarily before leaving the scene.

This ended my assistance with this incident.

On 10-19-10, at about 0920 hours, I was notified by Sgt. Moore (0754) of a developing incident at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Valley Rd. in Alpine. Sgt. Moore advised me that patrol deputies on scene had requested the assistance of the Sheriff's Crisis Negotiations Team and asked me to respond to the location to assist.

INVESTIGATION:

I arrived on scene at about 1000 hours and met with Sgt. Moore at the intersection of Japatul Valley Road and the dirt road leading to the residence in question. Sgt. Moore introduced me to (b)(5)(B) who was the wife of Michael Foster. (b)(5)(B) reported that Michael was inside their residence and was armed with a revolver. (b)(5)(B) advised me that Michael was feeling suicidal and that she felt he was going to commit suicide, if he had not already done so. (b)(5)(B) stated that she had called 911 because Michael had pointed a gun at her and had fired the gun several times during the night. (b)(5)(B) additionally advised me that Michael was suffering from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) due to having served in the Army in the Iraq war.

After speaking briefly with (b)(5)(B) I met with Sgt. Bavencoff (2227) and Sgt. Moore to discuss the situation. Ultimately, other members of CNT arrived and a plan was established to attempt to contact Michael. My particular assignment was to be the primary negotiator with Michael if contact was established via the "throw phone" which was to be deployed to the residence Michael was in. I rode in the CNT van with other CNT members to a closer position to the residence and began the process of deploying the throw phone with the assistance of the Sheriff's Special Enforcement Detail (SED). During this process, I heard several gunshots from the area of the residence and was later advised that Michael had been shot in an exchange of gunfire with SED deputies.

A short time after hearing the gunshots, CNT members began collecting the throw phone and securing the van for the ride back to the command post. Upon arriving at the command post, we debriefed momentarily before leaving the scene.

This ended my assistance with this incident.

ORIGIN:

On 10-19-10, at about 1001 hours, I was dispatched to a SED callout at (b)(5)(B) Japitul Road in Alpine. I arrived at the Tactical Staging Area (TSA) at approximately 1115 hours.

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

When I arrived, I put on my equipment and received a briefing at the TSA. I learned that Michael Foster lived in the granny flat at (DIGIGE) Japitul Road with his wife. The previous night, Foster had fired shots inside the residence and forced his wife to stay there with him until the morning. The best information available indicated that Foster was probably at that residence by himself and could be armed with a 357 caliber handgun. Foster's history included a recent arrest after getting into a fight at a bar. During that arrest he fought with Deputies. Foster also had military training and experience.

I was assigned as a member of the entry team. After a perimeter was established around the residence, the entry team drove to the front of the granny flat in the armored vehicle. We positioned the armored vehicle in front of the granny flat and the garage and waited there, ready to safely take Foster into custody when he came out of the granny flat. As a negotiator from the Sheriff's Crisis Negotiation Team (CNT) spoke to Foster through the public address system on the armored vehicle, Deputy M. Forbes #2401 saw the blinds moving at the sliding glass door on the front side of the granny flat and broadcast that information on the radio. Foster did not comply with instructions to come out of the door. A few minutes later Deputy West #2686 broadcast information that he had seen Foster inside the residence and confirmed Foster's identity based on the photograph he had seen when he was briefed about the incident. Deputy West was in a position on the front side of the residence. He also broadcast information that Foster had thrown something out the sliding glass door on the front of the granny flat and closed the door again. I was in a position of cover behind the armored vehicle and did not ever observe Foster at the front of the granny flat.

A few minutes later, I heard a broadcast on the radio that Foster had come out on the back side of the granny flat. A short time after that, I heard several gunshots. I heard Deputy Kerr broadcast on the radio that the suspect had fired a gun at Deputies and the suspect was now out of his view. A short time later, Deputy Farr broadcast that he could see Foster lying on the back patio with nothing in his hands. Another Deputy broadcast that Foster was yelling for help.

I was assigned to hold a shield as the entry team approached Foster. A short time later, the entry team moved from the back of the armored vehicle to the garage. Deputy Galve and I each had a shield and we were at the front of the team providing cover for the remaining team members. When we reached the walkway on the front of the garage it was too narrow for Deputy Galve and I to walk side by side. At the direction of the team leader, I moved up the walkway without Deputy Galve beside me. I continued moving between the garage and the granny flat toward the area where Foster was lying. Deputy Chantler was moving with me in a position where the shield provided cover to him. Deputy Farr continued to broadcast information that Foster was on the ground and the gun was not in his hand. As Deputy Chantler and I moved around the corner of the granny flat, I could see Foster lying on the ground. I opened a wire gate at the corner of the granny flat and Deputy Chantler and I approached Foster. I could see a Foster lying on his back on the ground. He did not have anything in his hands, but there was a handgun on the ground a few feet away from him.

Other members of the entry team began checking the interior of the guest house and the main house to ensure no one else was inside. I waited near Foster. Medics arrived quickly and began to treat Foster. Medics placed Foster on a

stretcher and wheeled him to the ambulance which had driven into the driveway in front of the garage. I walked near the stretcher with Foster and the medics and waited as they loaded him into the ambulance. I got into the ambulance with them and stayed in the ambulance as medics drove him up the driveway of the residence toward Japitul Road. While I was inside the ambulance, the medics were treating Foster and he was speaking to them about his treatment. He asked them to move him up on the stretcher (moving his head closer to the end of the stretcher) and they complied with his request. I did not speak to Foster and he did not speak to me. Before we reached Japitul Road, a patrol Deputy relieved me in the back of the ambulance. I returned to the armored vehicle and later left the scene.



(b)(5)(B) described his relationship with Foster and (b)(5)(B) as a friendship. He stated they occasionally came to their home to visit and have a couple beers. (b)(5)(B) described Foster as a very caring and generous man who was always helping others. Foster gave them a van he had no use for and he brought them food during hard times. In 2008, Foster saved a woman who resided in a nearby trailer from a fire her partner started in an attempt to kill her. According to (b)(5)(B) Foster was honorably discharged from the military where he previously worked as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) and satellite technician. (b)(5)(B) understood Foster was working at the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) in Alpine near the Forestry Station.

(b)(5)(B) was under the impression Foster was previously hospitalized after being severely injured in an explosion and recalled Foster telling him he occasionally had flashbacks due to stress he endured during his time in the military. (b)(5)(B) stated he never witnessed one of Foster's flashbacks, however, according to Foster, (b)(5)(B) was the only person who could calm him when they occurred. Foster never described to him what would happen if he had a flashback. (b)(5)(B) thought Foster was taking medication but he did not know what type of medication and was unaware of Foster's health issues. Foster never mentioned being depressed or schizophrenic.

(b)(5)(B) and (b)(5)(B) felt Foster drank excessively and Foster may have told (b)(5)(B) he had been beat up and harassed by police. He described during the weekend of October 8th, Foster telephoned (b)(5)(B) from the Casino Inn in Alpine at about 2AM. Foster left (b)(5)(B) a message on her cell phone with regard to being assaulted by police officers. As a result of the incident Foster spent three days in county jail.

When Foster was released, he initially expressed to (b)(5)(B) he had a flashback at the Casino Inn as he thought he was saving a girl from a fire. Foster later told a girl at the Casino Inn with a group of men. He walked over to her, asked if she was okay and then made a comment to one of the men about his height. Following the comment, the man punched him, Foster threw him and the fight escalated from there. Foster had asked (b)(5)(B) about the cell phone message in an attempt to piece the night together. (b)(5)(B) had erased the message so he requested she write down what she remembered. In addition, Foster related to him another incident when he was tased by law enforcement.

(b)(5)(B) and (b)(5)(B) stated Foster and (b)(5)(B) seemed to be happy and had not witnessed any domestic violence between them. They knew Foster and (b)(5)(B) had been attempting to

On Tuesday, October 19th, 2010, at 1402 hours, Sergeant Dave Martinez #1136, of the San Diego County Sheriff's Homicide Detail, briefed myself and other detectives of an officer involved shooting that occurred behind the residence of (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in the City of Alpine. The following Sheriff's personnel from the Homicide Detail attended the briefing, Lieutenant Dennis Brugos #1134, Investigative Specialist (b)(5)(B) Sergeants Roy Frank #1704, and David Nemeth #1804, Detectives Troy DuGal #2425, Suzanne Fiske #1918, Leslie Hall #1083, Angela Tsuida #2099, Henry Lebitski #2079, Border Patrol Agent Manny Esparza and me (David Hillen #1635).

During the briefing Sgt. Martinez told us that at about 0822 hours, the Sheriff's Communication Center received a 911 call at [b)(5)(E) Japatul Road, in the city of Alpine. A female at this residence reported her husband had drank between 6-8 beers and is currently on psychiatric medication. He had held her against her will in their home, placed a gun to her head, and had fired the handgun with one of the rounds just missing her head. She was able to flee the residence and call 911.

On Tuesday, October 19th, 2010, at about 1327 hours, the suspect, Michael Foster, was shot by three S.E.D. Deputies. It was added during the briefing that Michael Foster suffers from Post Trumatic Stress Disorder (P.T.S.D.) and is an ex-combat army soldier, and had been suffering from "flashbacks." Michael Foster had been arrested on October 10, 2010 at 0200 hours, at the Casino Inn bar in Alpine. The case number for this incident is #10064025 and CAD #S8708726.

On Tuesday, October 19th, 2010, at 1420 hours, I left the Sheriff's Homicide Office and responded to the scene.

On Tuesday, October 19th, 2010, at 1516 hours, I arrived on scene. I noticed a marked partol unit was parked on Japatul Road and was blocking the driveway leading from the road to [b)(5)(B) Japatul Road. The weather in Apline was cloudy, raining, and approximately 60 degrees.

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side are you on?" She told him "yours." he moved the gun away from her head and fired a round. At some point Michael laid down on their bed, put the barrel of the gun to his chin, placed a towel over his head, and told (b)(5)(B) "get out of the house." (b)(5)(B) ran out of the house and tried to call 911 on her cellular phone but could not get reception. She ran to a neighbors house and called 911. On Tuesday, October 19th, 2010, at about 0915 hours, Deputy Barnes and Sgt. Browning went within shouting distance of [b)(5)(B) Japatul Road and made announcements asking Michael to come out of the residence unarmed, with negative results. The Deputies on the perimeter (McFarland and Fuhr) informed Sgt. Browning that they could hear his commands. Sgt. Browning went back to his patrol vehicle and used his PA system to make the same announcements, with negative results.

On Tuesday, October 19th, 2010. at about 1000 hours, Deputy Chantler #2305, arrived on scene to scout the area for S.E.D.

On Tuesday, October 19th, 2010, at about 1008 hours, Sgt. Browning called for a S.E.D call out for an armed barricaded suspect.

At the conclusion of Sgt. Browning's briefing Sgt. R. Moore briefed us. He essentially stated that at about 0900 hours, he received a phone call from S.E.D. Sgt. B. Butterfield #1454, who informed him of this radio call. Sgt. Moore went in route the scene to head up C.N.T. (Crisis Negotiation Team), and arrived on scene at about 0920 hours. He interviewed (b)(5)(B) and during the interview she told him that before she left the residence Michael stated "he wanted to get in a shootout with police." Sgt. Moore found out that Michael frequently attends the VFW (Veterans of Foreign Wars), and contacted VFW Commander (b)(5)(B) Sgt. Moore said they recorded Commander (b)(5)(B) and separately, asking Michael to exit the residence peaceably. Sgt. Moore stated he played these messages over a loud speaker, with negative results. Deputies Amber Leavitt #2720 and Warren Voth #2633, both of C.N.T. went with S.E.D. deputies in the armored vehicle and approached the residence. At about 1255 hours, Deputy Leavitt began making PA Announcements in an effort to contact Michael Foster. As they started this, they saw Michael looking out the window and yelling something. Deputies on scene said they heard a "pop" from inside the residence, but were not sure if it was a

Michael was then seen exiting out of a sliding glass door located in the front of the guest house, and was seen throwing something on the ground. Michael went back inside the guest house and approximately 30 seconds later he exited out the rear of the guest house, where he was shot by S.E.D. deputies.

It was at his time that Deputy Debus #1843 of S.E.D. briefed us. Deputy Debus essentially stated That S.E.D. Deputies Chantler #2305 and J. Lozoya #2190 arrived on scene to set-up a tactical staging area. About 30-35 minutes later Deputy Debus and Deputy Beaumont #2635 arrived on scene and began scouting the target ((b)(5)(B) Japatul Road), which included drawing a sketch of the surrounding area. S.E.D. was able to get containment on the residence at about 1231 hours. It was at this time all patrol deputies on the perimeter were relieved of their posts. At about 1240 hours, the S.E.D. entry team and Crisis Negotiation Team drove down towards the residence in an armored vehicle. At about 1255 hours announcements began in an attempt to communicate with Michael. At about 1300 hours, deputies at the front of the residence reported movement. At about 1305 hours, deputies reported hearing a "pop" noise coming from inside the residence, it was unknown if it was a gunshot. At 1310 hours, movement was still being reported.. At about 1323 hours, deputies saw Michael exit out of a slinding glass door at the front of the residence, and throw something on the ground, it was believed to be shell casings, but no one was sure at the time, what it actually was. At about 1324 hours, Michael exited out the rear of the residence, armed with a handgun, and was shot multiple times by S.E.D. Deputies.

Deputy Debus said it is possible the suspect may have said something when he exited the residence and may have fired a round from his handgun, but he was not positive on those facts. Deputy Debus told us that the weapons used by the (3) S.E.D. deputies were collected at the scene, and were ready to be turned over to Homicide.

Deputy DeBus said Deputies B. Kerr #2623 and B. Gavin #2649 were on the (3/4) side of the residence (North/East side). Both engaged Michael and fired 8-10 shots from their M-4, issued weapons. Deputy B. Farr #2618, who was in a sniper position on the same side, about 160 yards away fired (1) shot. Deputy Farr observed Michael land on the ground, on his back, with his hands above his head, moaning "I'm dying." Deputy Farr also noticed the handgun had fallen out of Michael's hand. At about 1332 hours, the S.E.D. entry team from the armored vehicle took Michael Foster into custody. At about 1333 hours, Tactical Medics from San Miguel Fire rendered first aid to Michael. At about 1340 hours, Michael was loaded into an ambulance and transported to Sharp Memorial Hospital, with Deputy Fuhr in the ambulance with Foster. The residence was cleared by S.E.D. for other suspects and or victims. No safety statement was needed nor provided.

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Prior to the end of the patrol briefing we were informed that (b)(5)(B) and Michael Foster rent a guest house at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road and that the home owners who reside in the main house were on vacation. We were also told that in addition to the handgun Michael was in possession of there was an outstanding long rifle that belonged to him at a neighbors house. Detectives R. Bolter #1371, M. Thygesen #1861, D. Murtaugh #2445, F. Brambila #4387, and B. Patterson #2658, were standing by outside the residence, providing security and waiting to be relieved. The briefing concluded at about 1620 hours.

Investigation:

I assigned Detectives A. Tsuida and H. Lebitski with interviewing (b)(5)(B) who was standing by at the Alpine Station.

I assigned DOJ Agents T. Burtis#8227, K. Viorel #4290, and S. Duncan #3859, as well as Border Patrol Agent M. Esparza to conduct a neighborhood canvass and interview any witnesses they encounter.

On Tuesday, October 19th, 2010, at about 1651 hours, Set. Martinez, Field Evidence Tech (FET)(b)(5)(B) Criminalists (b)(5)(B) Intern (b)(5)(B) and I went to (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road to get a description of the residence for a telephonic search warrant. Synopsis:

On October 19, 2010, at about 0823 hours, the San Diego Sheriff's Communication Center received a 9-1-1 call from a woman identified as (5)(5)(B) husband holding a gun to her head. Deputy McFarland, ID number 2066, responded and arrived on scene at about 0836 hours. Upon his arrival he contacted (b)(5)(B) the top of her driveway. (b)(5)(B) told Deputy McFarland that her husband, Michael Foster, had pointed a revolver against her head, and than fired several shots randomly throughout the guest house that they reside in at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road. One of the rounds he fired went right by (b)(5)(B) head, and another went through the main residence's sliding glass door and into the main residence. This was confirmed by the shattered sliding glass door upon our arrival. Detective Passalacqua, ID number 2204, arrived on scene and continued to interview (b)(5)(B) told Detective Passalacqua that Michael woke her up at about 0300 hours, by grabbing her by the hair, asked her for her ID, and asked her what her mission was. After Michael fired all of the rounds in the revolver he asked (b)(5)(B) to help him find more ammunition, which she refused to do. At about 0810 hours, Michael lay down on the bed, placed the barrel of the gun to his chin, placed a towel over his head, and told her to get out of the house. Before she left the house Michael made a comment to her about getting into a shoot out with the police. (b)(5)(B) told Detective Passalacqua that Michael had been drinking beer this morning, and is suffering from post traumatic stress disorder, and is currently taking three different types of psychiatric medications.

Sheriff personnel on scene attempted to communicate with Michael utilizing a PA system, but were unsuccessful. At about 1008 hours this call was deemed a Special Enforcement Detail call out. At about 1231 hours, Sheriff Deputies from the S.E.D. unit surrounded the house. At about 1240 hours, an armored vehicle containing Sheriff Department personnel from the Hostage Negotiation Team approached the residence in an attempt to communicate with Michael with negative results.

At about 1323 hours, Michael exited the front of the guest house, threw shell casings onto the ground, and went back into the house. About a minute later Michael exited the rear of the guest house with revolver in hand, pointed the revolver at deputies, and was shot by three S.E.D. deputies. Michael was and taken into custody, and transported by paramedics to Sharp Memorial hospital at 1344 hours.

Synopsis:

On October 19, 2010, between the hours of 0300 and 0823 hours, (b)(5)(B) detained against her will by her husband, Michael Foster, inside their residence located at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine, CA (an unincorporated area in San Diego County). During this time, Michael fired several rounds within and outside of the residence. At one point, Michael fired towards (b)(5)(B) and barely missed shooting her in the head. (b)(5)(B) was eventually able to flee the residence and call the Sheriff's Department.

Deputies arrived on scene and established a perimeter around the residence. Numerous attempts were made to initiate negotiations with Michael with negative results. At approximately 1324 hours, Michael exited the rear of the residence and confronted Deputies from the Sheriff's Department Special Enforcement Detail (SED). Michael was armed with a revolver, which he pointed in the direction of Deputies, and was subsequently shot.

Investigation:

On October 19, 2010, at about 1335 hours, Sergeant D. Martinez #1136 requested assistance with an Officer Involved Shooting that occurred at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Road in Alpine, CA. At approximately 1402 hours, Sergeant Martinez briefed us on the facts of the case known to that point.

Michael is a former Army combat soldier who suffers from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and flashbacks. He has been prescribed several types of medication for his psychological issues and was under the influence of alcohol at the time of this incident. (b)(5)(B)believed Michael was suicidal.

At the conclusion of the briefing, I responded to the scene pending further assignment. I arrived on scene at about 1507 hours.

At approximately 1550 hours, I attended a briefing where Sergeant C. Browning #2565, Sergeant R. Moore #0754 and Deputy J. Debus # 1843 presented us with the facts of the case known to that point.

Sergeant Browning advised that at about 0823 hours, the Sheriff's Communications Center received a radio call that a husband had been holding his wife hostage for several hours. Deputies were dispatched and contacted the reporting party, (b)(5)(B) near the residence. (b)(5)(B) told Deputies that her husband, Michael Foster, had fired

several rounds inside the residence and into the nearby canyon. She said that Michael fired one round near her head, but she was not injured. She said Michael is former military and suffering from PTSD and flashbacks.

She said at about 0300 hours, Michael woke her up and he was armed with a revolver. He fired rounds through the bedroom door, the glass slider and the glass table on the rear patio. She said Michael also held her at gunpoint as he looked through the closet. Michael found an "ammo belt (belt containing several rounds of ammunition)" then pointed the gun at her head and asked, "Whose side are you on?" He then pointed the gun away from but still in close proximity of her head and fired one shot.

Michael then lied down on top of the bed, held the gun under his chin, placed a towel over his head and told her to get out of the house. She immediately fled to the neighbor's house and called 911.

At about 0915 hours, Sergeant Browning and Deputy D. Barnes #2170 approached the residence and attempted to call out the suspect with negative results. At about 1008 hours, Sergeant Browning requested SED respond to the scene.

Sergeant Moore is the Sheriff's Crisis Negotiations Team (CNT) Team Leader. He arrived on scene at about 0920 hours and debriefed (b)(5)(B) She advised Michael was under the care of a Psychiatrist, but doesn't know if Michael is taking his medication as prescribed. She said as she left the residence she heard Michael say he "wanted the police to respond so he could have a shoot out with them." Michael exited the residence and confronted Deputies before negotiators were able to establish communication with him.

Deputy Debus is a member of the Sheriff's SED team. At about 1255 hours, negotiators started making announcements, but got no response from Michael. At about 1305 hours, SED team members heard a possible gunshot come from inside the residence. At about 1310 hours, SED team members observed movement inside the residence. At about 1323 hours, Michael opened the door and threw something towards the SED armored vehicle. At about 1324 hours, Michael exited the rear of the residence and was yelling "I don't really want to hurt you." Michael was armed with a revolver and subsequently shot.

Boulevard in Alpine, CA. I cleared the scene and arrived at the Alpine Sheriff's Station at about 1700 hours.

Between 1803 and 1906 hours, I, along with SA Duncan interviewed (b)(5)(B) his wife, (b)(5)(B) at their residence, (b)(5)(B) was digitally recorded. For further information regarding the interview, refer to the Heilig's witness interview statement.

After concluding the interview of (b)(5)(B) I returned to the SDSD Command Post located just north of the Foster residence and debriefed Sergeant Dave Martinez with regard to the details of the interview. At 2000 hours, I left the SDSD Command post as I was not tasked with any further assignments.

On Thursday, October 21, 2010, at approximately 1000 hours, I attended the Deputy Attorney (DA) issuance conference at the El Cajon Courthouse, 250 E. Main Street in El Cajon, California. The conference concluded at 1100 hours.

I have not been tasked with any other assignments pertaining to this case.

Sheriff's Homicide Detectives investigated a Deputy involved shooting. I assisted with the investigation in the following manner.

ORIGIN:

On 10/19/10 at about 1010 hours, the Sheriff's Crisis Negotiations Team (CNT) had been called to Alpine to assist with a subject refusing to exit his home after discharging a firearm inside while holding his wife inside (CAD#S8708726).

INVESTIGATION:

I arrived at the above location at about 1050 hours and met with additional CNT members. CNT Team Leader, Sergeant Bavencoff, directed me to interview the reporting party and victim (b)(5)(B) and attempt to obtain information to be later used for a negotiation with her husband, Michael.

After speaking with CNT, in conjunction with the Special Enforcement Detail (SED), devised a plan to attempt communications with Michael via a public address (PA) system, incorporated into the SED armored vehicle. Deputy Leavitt (Santee COPPS Deputy) and I rode to the house with SED. Upon arrival at the home, Deputy Leavitt began calling out to Michael via the PA. Michael was instructed to exit the house and walk toward a white Volkswagen sedan, parked in the driveway. At that point, Michael was to be met by SED and taken into custody.

Michael refused to exit the house as instructed. Instead, he exited the house on the south side while holding a firearm in his hand. I could not see Michael, but I did hear several gun shots. Seconds later, I learned Michael had displayed a firearm and was shot by members of Sheriff's SED.

I remained on scene for about half an hour, never leaving the confines of the SED armored vehicle. At about 1350 hours, I exited the SED armored vehicle and walked up the driveway to Japatul Road.

I concluded my investigation.

ORIGIN:

On 10/19/2010, at about 1004 hours, I received a page for a SWAT callout at (b)(5)(B) Japatul Rd. in Alpine. I am currently assigned to SED/SRT as a sniper.

DEPUTIES OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

I was working on another detail in the Imperial Beach area so it took me about 40 minutes to get to the staging area on Japatul Rd. I checked in at the tactical staging area (TSA) and was told to suit up for a sniper mission. I donned my sniper gear and was partnered up with Deputy Mike Forbes. Deputy Lozoya informed me that Michael Foster had taken his wife hostage the night before. He would not let her leave the house and he had fired several rounds from a .357 magnum handgun inside the house. Foster's wife had escaped earlier that morning and was no longer in the house. Foster was former military, he knew how to use weapons and he had a history of mental illness. I was shown a recent photo of Foster from his last booking in county jail. Patrol deputies had a perimeter set on the house and Foster was not responding to their commands to exit the residence.

Deputy Forbes and I were assigned to take a sniper position on Side 1 of the property. The last known location for Foster was inside the granny flat. Deputy Forbes and I took a position about 37 yards off of Side 1 of the granny flat. We were on top of a trailer about 10 feet high. I had a clear view of the sliding glass door on Side 1 of the granny flat, and a partial view of the top portion of a door on Side 1 of the main house. A short time after we were in position we received more information from the TSA that there were more firearms in the house, one of which was a high powered hunting rifle.

The armored vehicle pulled into position on Side 1 a little while later. Deputy Leavitt, from the Crisis negotiations team (CNT), started making announcements, via PA, for Foster to come to the sliding door on Side 1. Initially there was no response from Foster. Suddenly I saw the vertical blinds on the sliding glass door slam shut. Deputy Leavitt continued to try and communicate with Foster via PA. A little while later, Foster opened the sliding glass door and yelled, "What kind of truck is that?" Foster slammed the door and went back inside. Deputy Leavitt continued to try and communicate with Foster but he was unresponsive. A while later, Foster opened the sliding glass door again and yelled, "Give me back my phone", then slammed the door again.

I could see the vertical blinds being pressed up against the sliding glass door. It appeared that Foster was pushing things against the door, possibly to barricade it. A little while later, I heard a muffled "Pop" sound come from inside the house. It sounded like a gunshot from a handgun. There was no response from Foster for some time after the shot was heard, despite repeated attempts from Deputy Leavitt to communicate with Foster. After a period of no response, I could see the vertical blinds moving again. A short time after that, Foster opened the sliding glass door and threw something out. I heard something metallic hit the concrete outside the door. It sounded like brass bullet casings hitting the concrete. I relayed the information to the entry team at the armored vehicle and the TSA.

About one minute later, I heard Deputy Kerr broadcast over the radio that the suspect was on Side 3. About two seconds after the broadcast, I heard several gunshots come from Side 3. The first shot I heard was a "Pop" sound from what I thought to be a handgun, then I heard one or two "Crack" sounds from a rifle, then another "Pop", then several more "Crack" sounds. I heard a total of 10 to 12 shots. A few seconds later, someone broadcast that there were shots fired on Side 3. Deputy Kerr advised that the suspect came out and pointed a gun at deputies, deputies fired and he lost sight of the suspect. Deputy Kerr was not sure if the suspect was hit. Deputy Farr, who was in a sniper position on Side 3 advised that the suspect was laying on his back on Side 3.

The entry team quickly formulated a plan, and was moving toward the suspect from the armored vehicle within a couple of minutes. A few moments later the entry team advised they were with the suspect and they needed paramedics. The paramedics were on scene very quickly tending to the suspects injuries. I was unable to see anything that occurred on Side 3 from my position.

On 10-20-10, at approximately 2030 hours, I was working the Hospital Guard Deputy position at the San Diego Central Jail when the following incident occurred.

DEPUTY'S OBSERVATIONS AND ACTIONS:

I was assigned to stand guard over inmate Foster BN. 10781069 at Sharp's Memorial Hospital in Kearny Mesa. At approximately 2030 hours, while I was standing guard over Foster, two people walked into the hospital room, later identified as Foster's wife and brother in law. I asked them who they were, and they identified themselves to me by their relation to Foster. I immediately told them they could not be in the room for a visit unless it was an authorized visit with a form signed by the on-duty Watch Commander. Since they did not have that paperwork, and it was outside the normal visiting hours, I instructed them to leave the room immediately.

They asked me if they could still have a visit. I denied their visit a second time, and instructed them to leave the room. The wife asked me if she could just stand off to the side for a while. I informed her that would not be allowed because they did not have a signed visit slip. After some more discussion, they finally stepped out of the room.

I followed them out of the room and informed them of the correct procedure on how to obtain a visit. The wife asked me if she could just stay outside the room. I informed her she would have to leave the premises, along with the brother in law.

At this point, the brother in law asked the wife to walk away so he could speak to me. The wife walked to the nurse's station, and I spoke with the brother in law. I asked him his name, and he told me his name was (b)(5)(B) told me, "Look dude, if she wasn't married to this fucking guy, he'd be dead right now." rolled back both of his sleeves of his shirt and showed me the tattoos on his forearms. On the left was a red star, and on the right was a circle with a Celtic pattern on it. said, "Hey, come on, you know where I come from." also asked me where Foster would be housed, and what his housing status would be. I said I didn't know.

I spoke with or only a few minutes more until he and Foster's wife finally left the hospital. I informed Sergeant Andrzejewski of the incident immediately.
